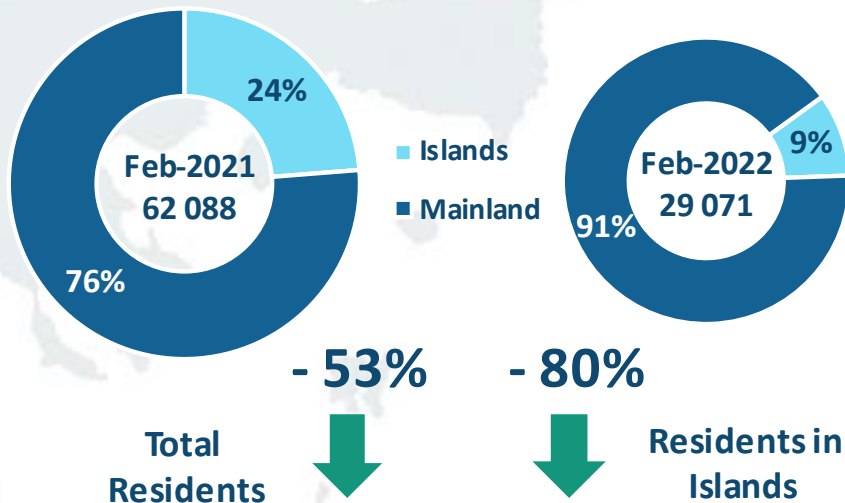

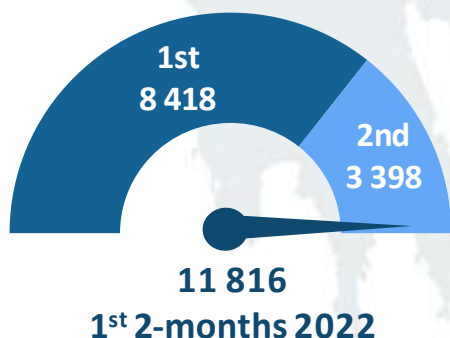

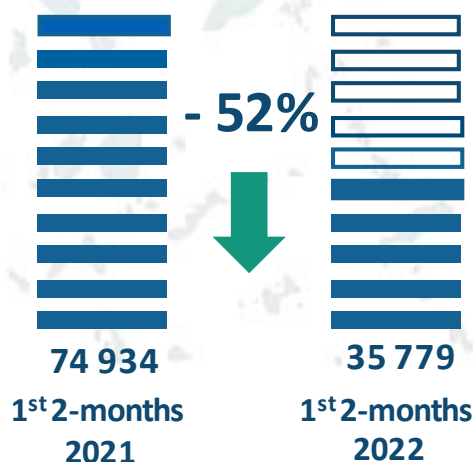

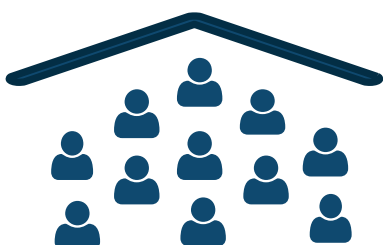

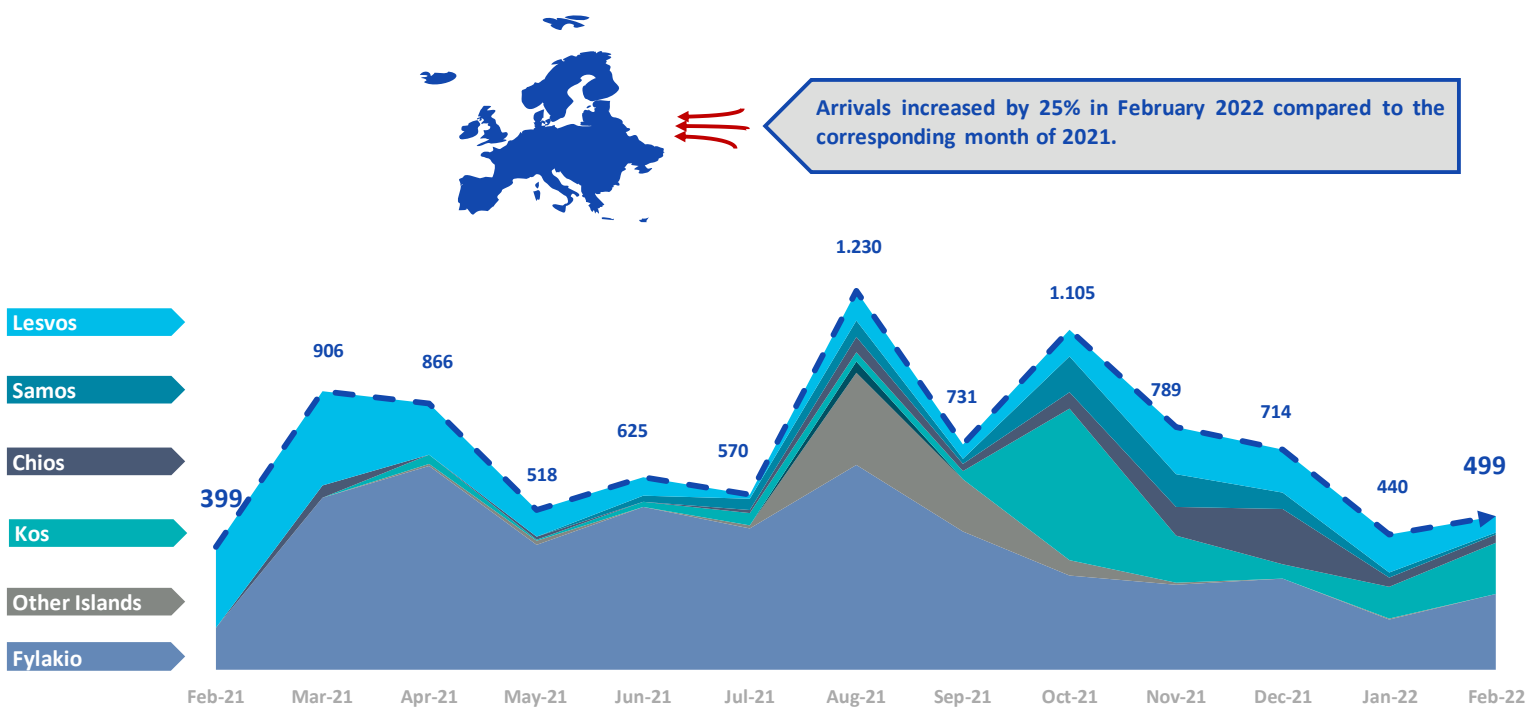


Chart 1. Arrivals February 2021 - February 2022 (12 months) – See Appendix Table 1

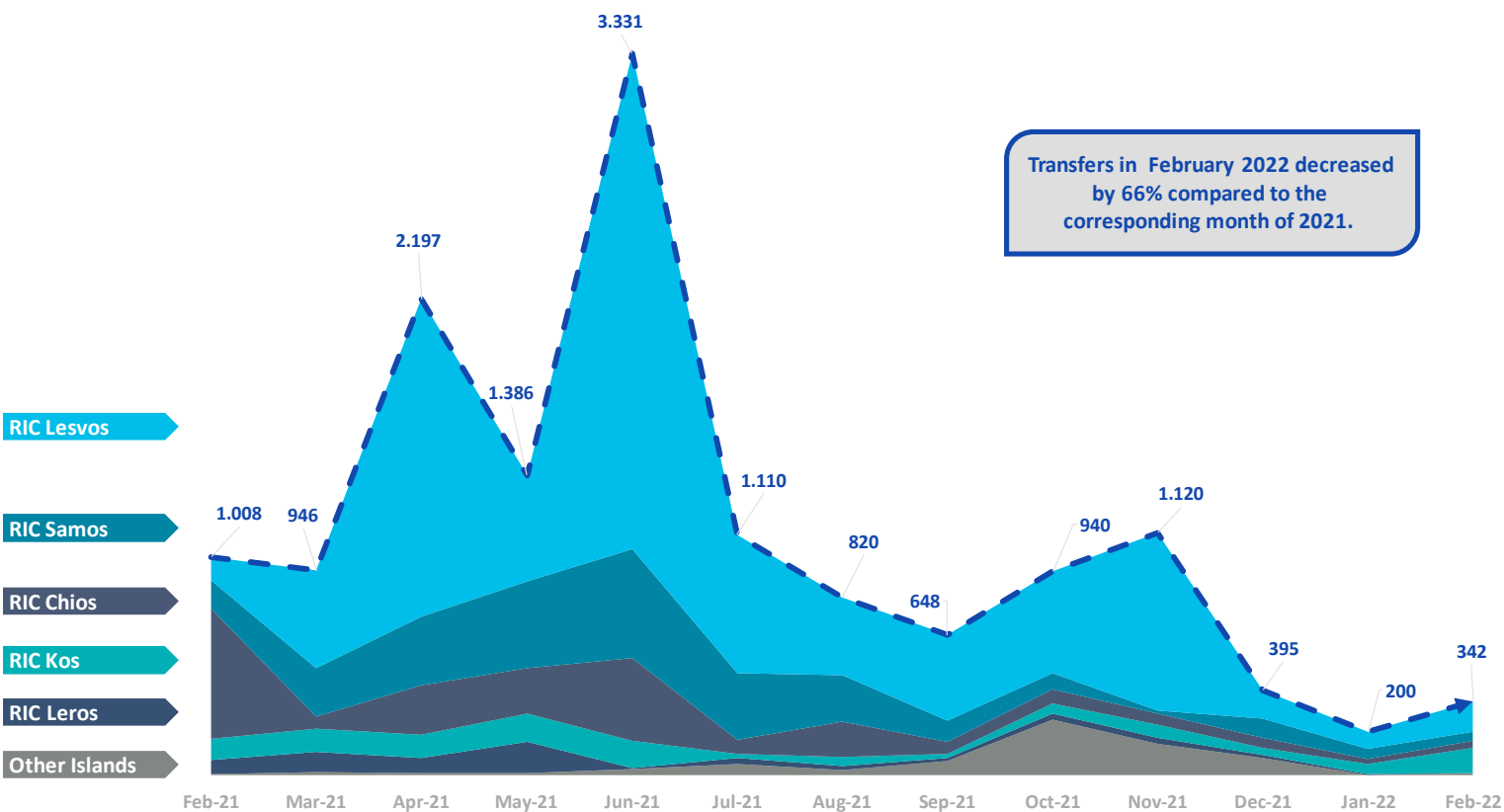


Chart 2. Transfers to the Mainland February 2021 - February 2022 (12 months) - See Appendix Table 2

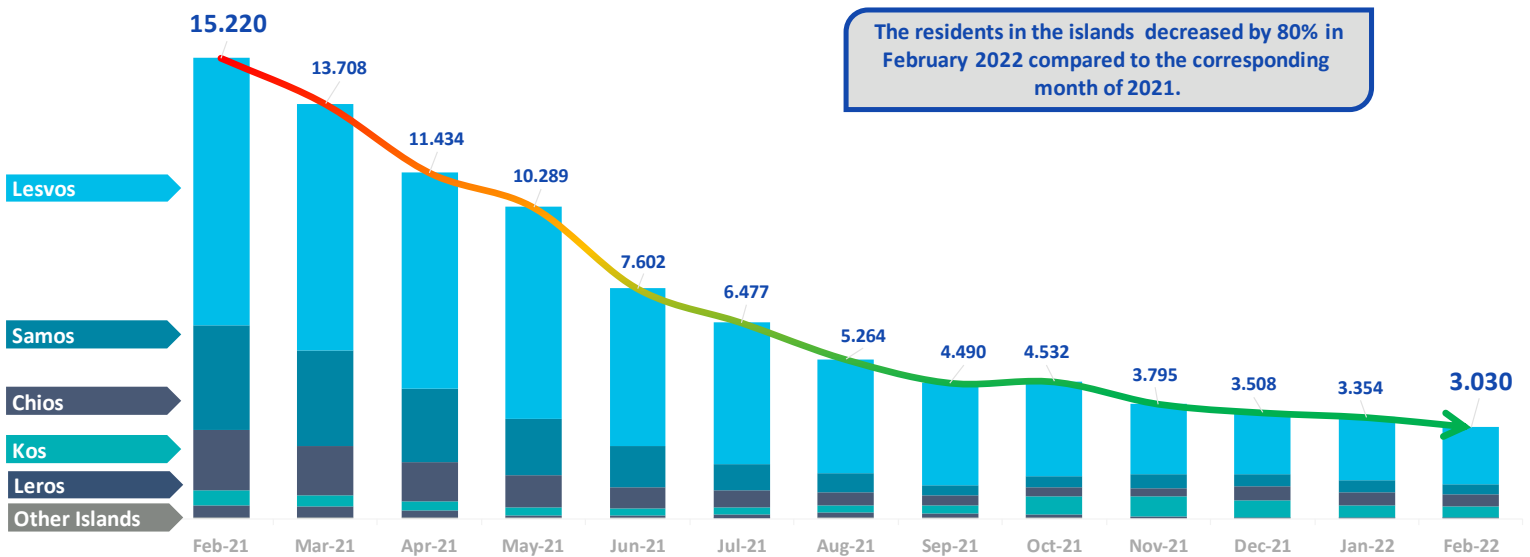


Chart 3. Island Residents in total February 2021 - February 2022 (12 months) - See Appendix Table 3

4. Distribution of Asylum Seekers per Region and Accommodation scheme

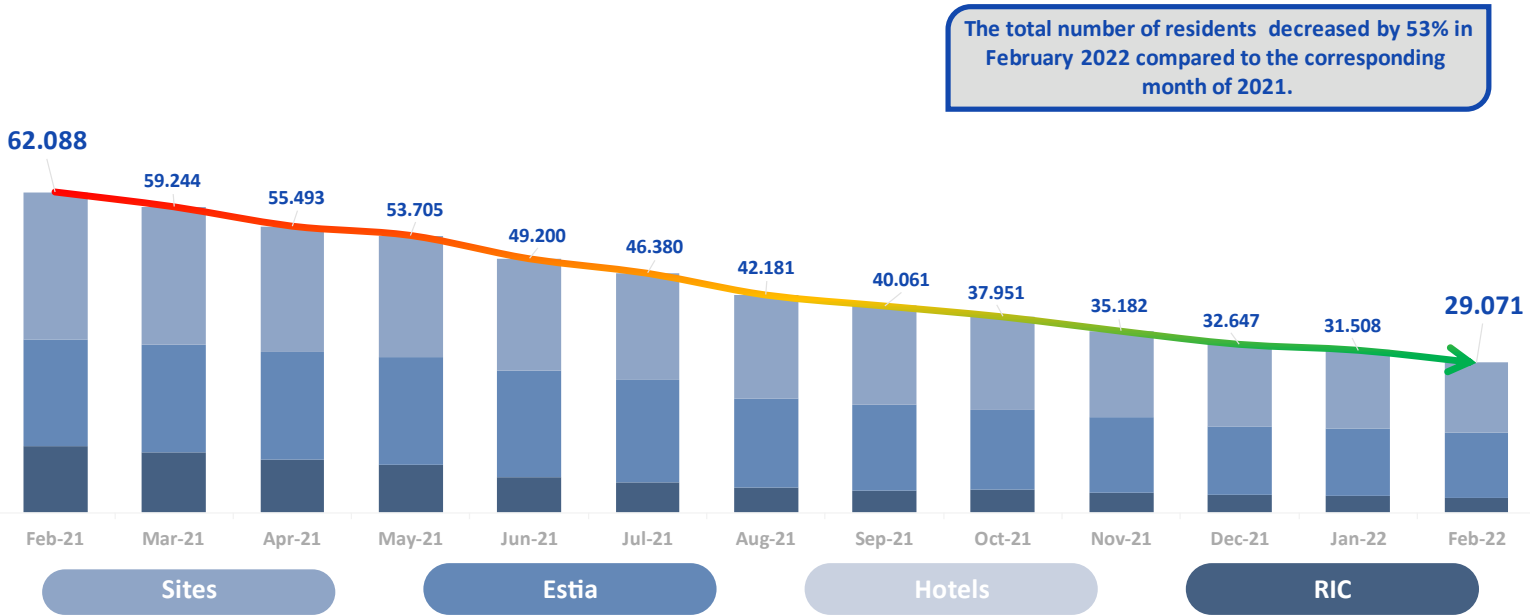
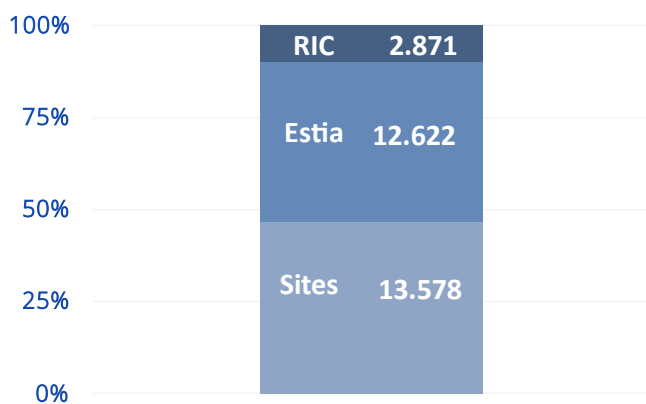
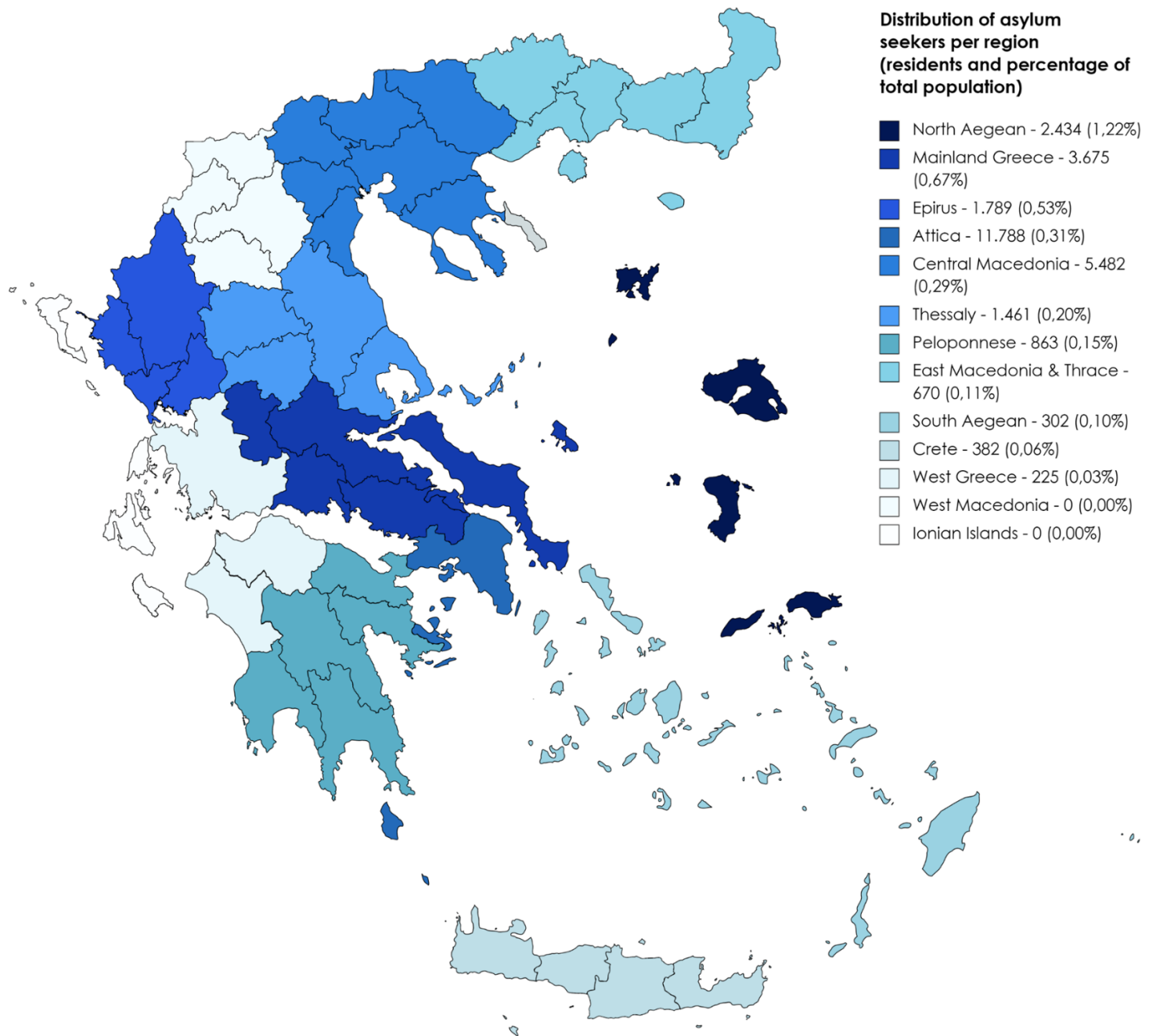


Chart 4. Progress of Residents through time – See Appendix Table 6



The goal of the Government is the equal and fair distribution (1%) of asylum seekers in all the regions of the country, with the exception of the first reception points. There was a general decrease in the number of residents in most regions by 53% (from 62.088 to 29.071) during the last 12 months.

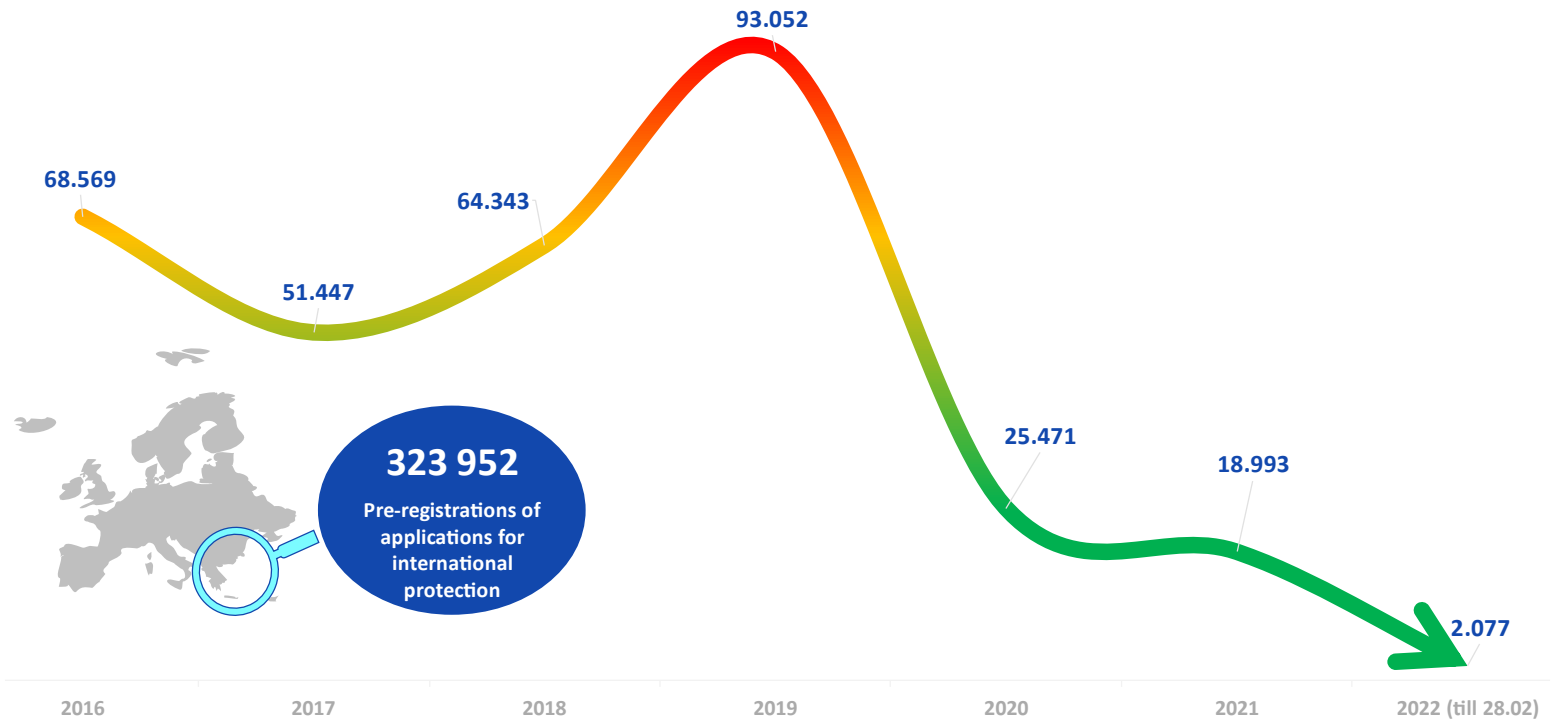

5b. Pre-Registrations of applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region

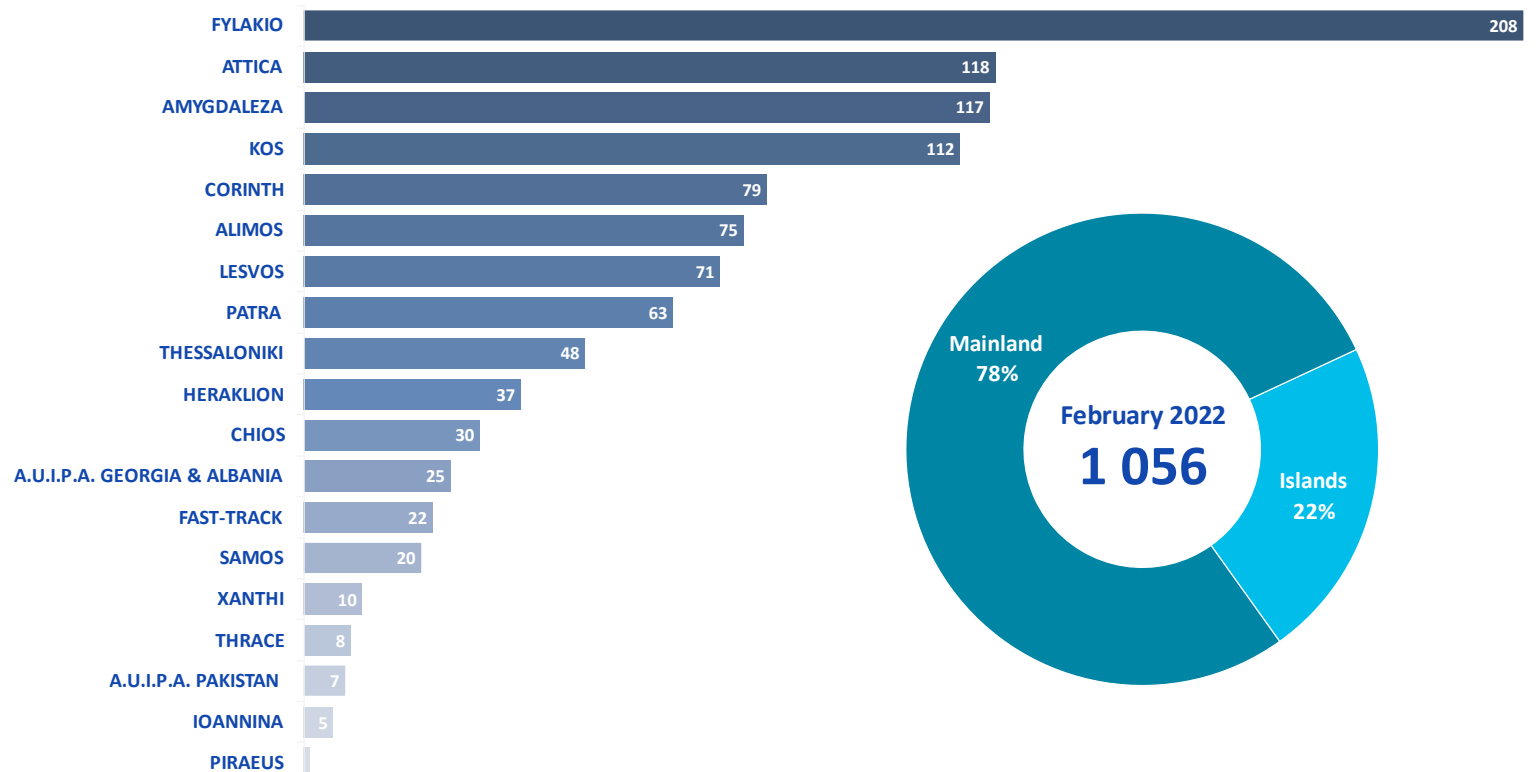


Chart 7. Pre-Registrations of applications per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the reference month (February 2022) – See Appendix Table 7b

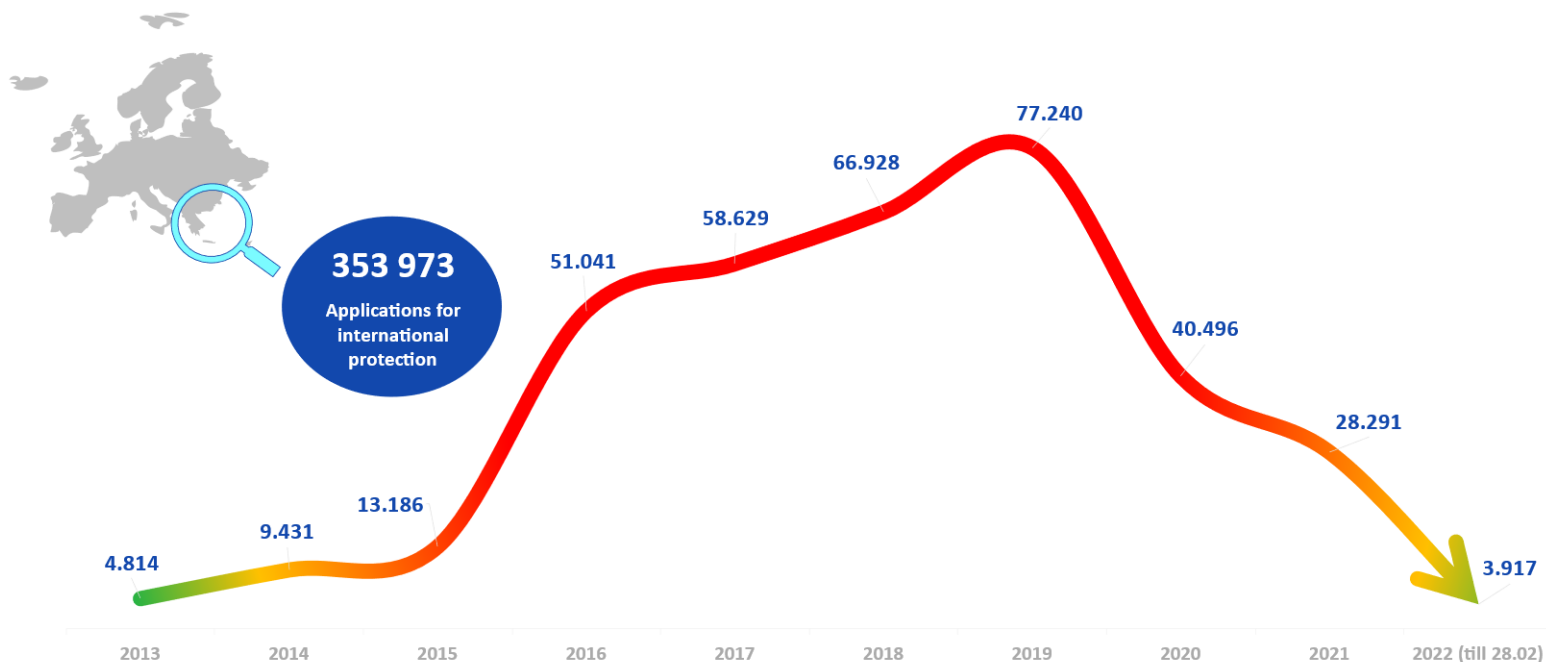


Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2022 applications are calculated till the month of reference (February) - See Appendix Table 8a

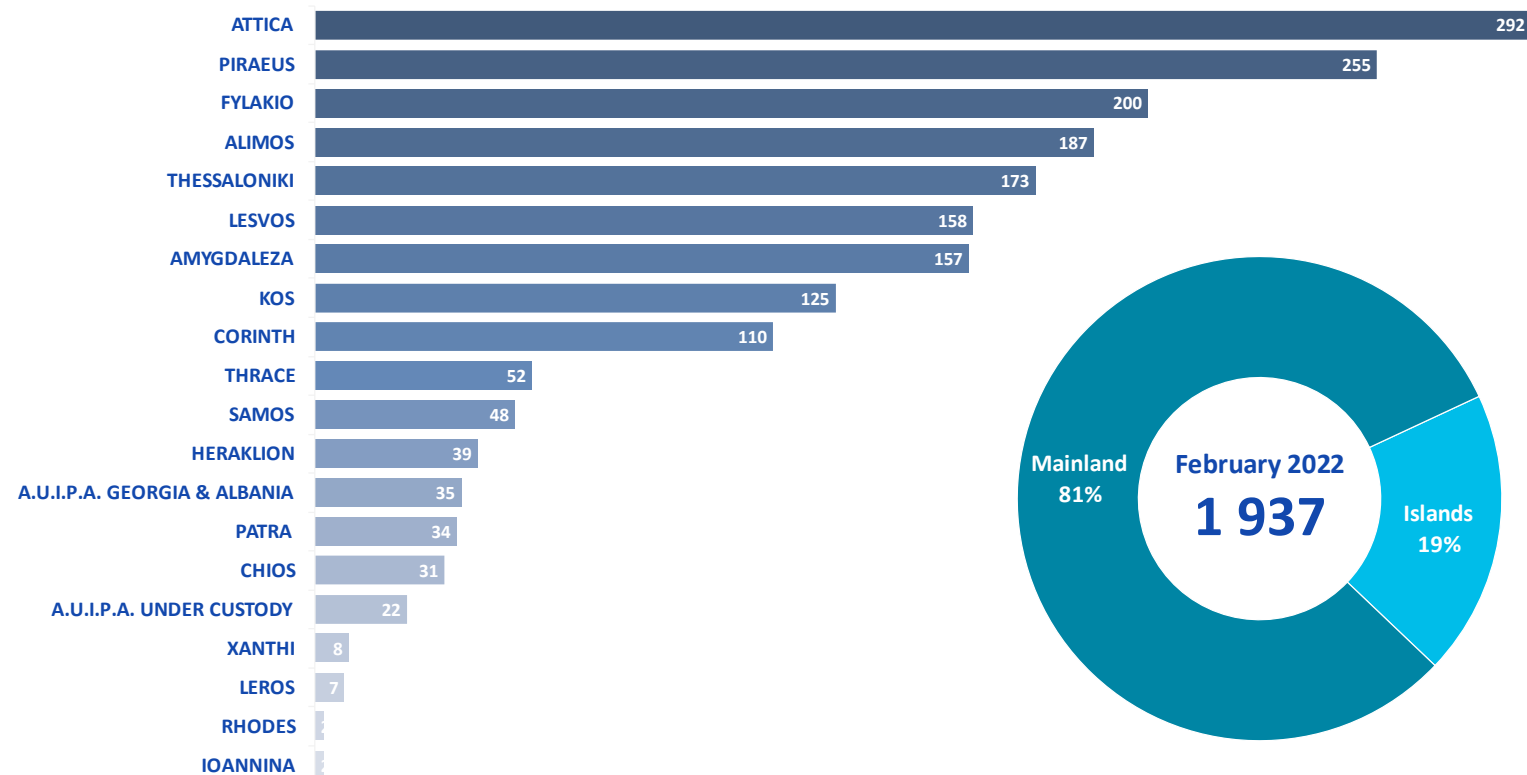
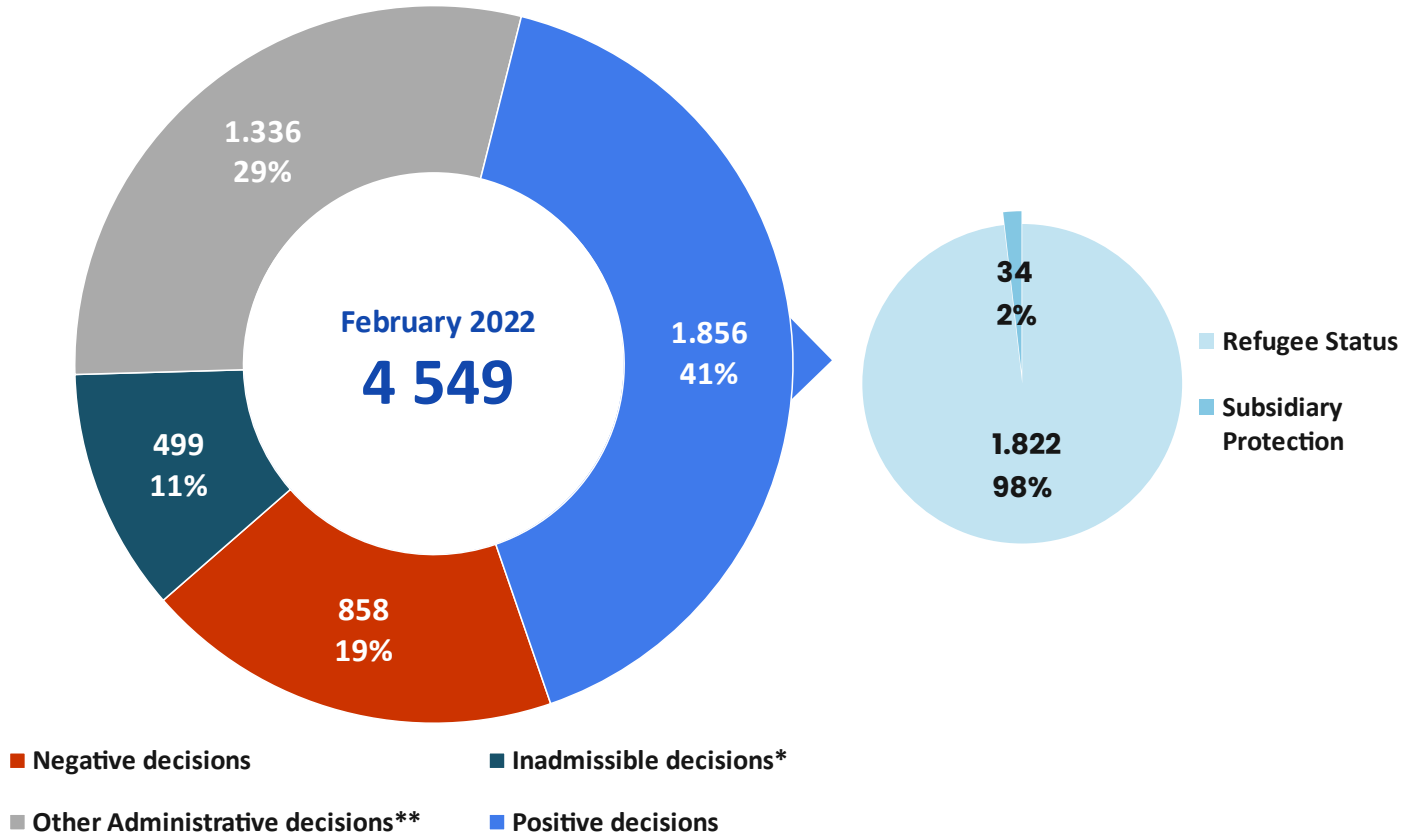


Chart 9. Applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the month of reference (February 2022) - See Appendix Table 8b

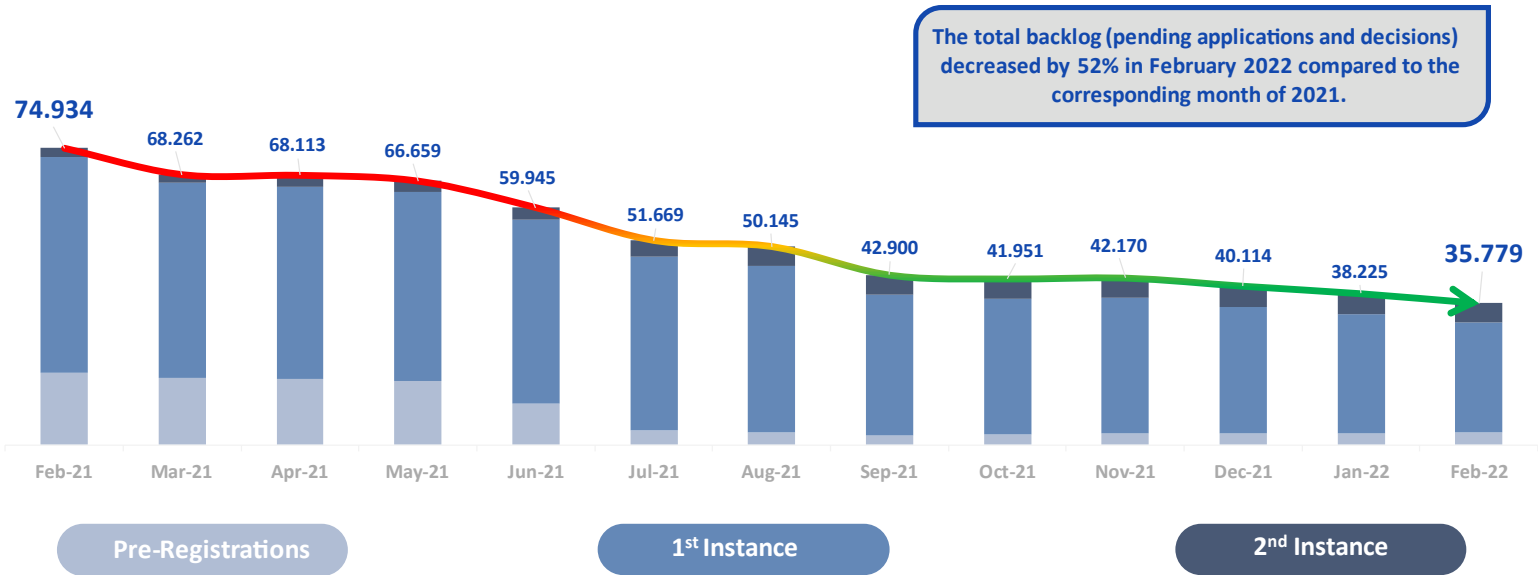

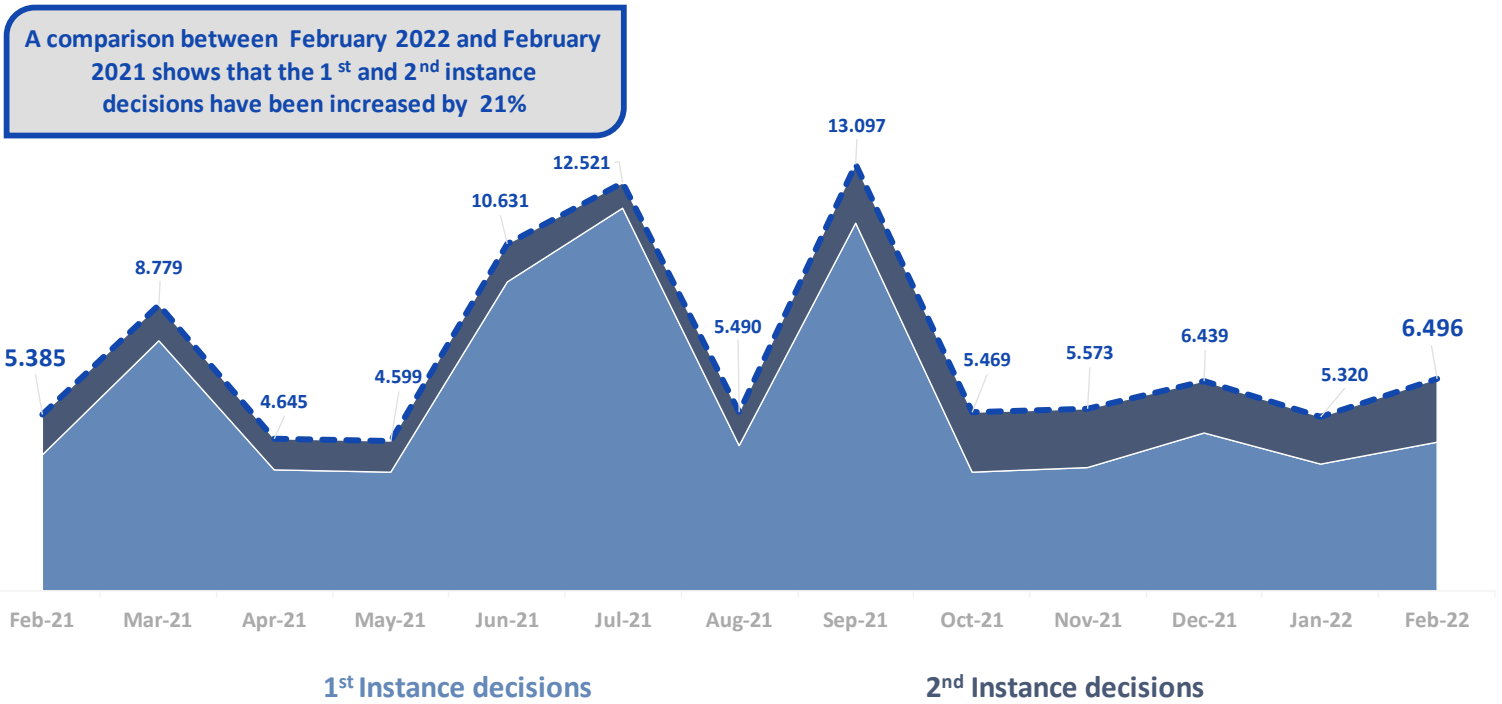


Chart 12. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance per month - See Appendix Table 10

9a. Asylum Seekers covered by a decision granting Refugee Status in 1st and 2nd Instance

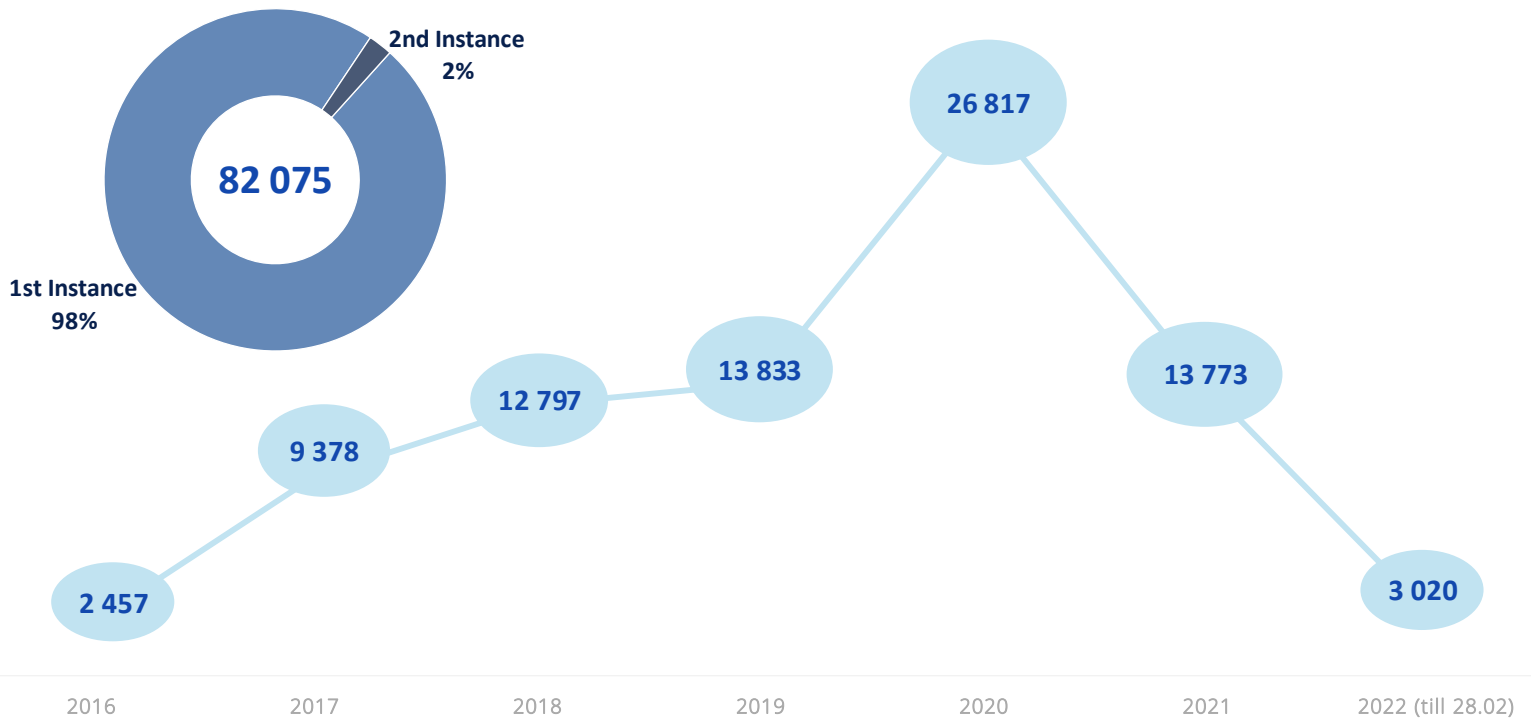

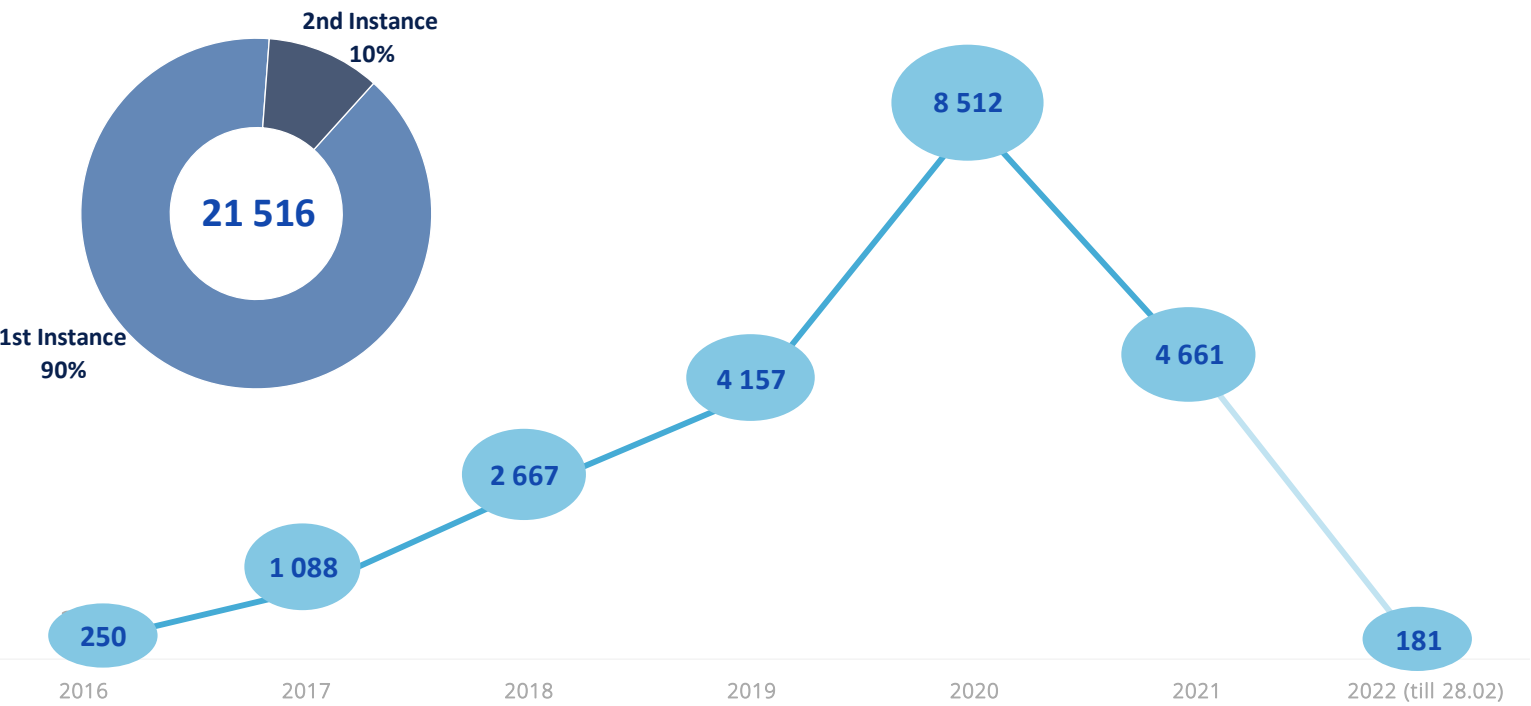

10. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration.

From 16/7/2019 until 1/3/2022 34.620 people have registered in the program, while 16.530 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house. It is worth noting that in February, 197 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 2/2/2022 till 1/3/2022). At the same time 6.791 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 7.433 people are attending job counseling sessions.

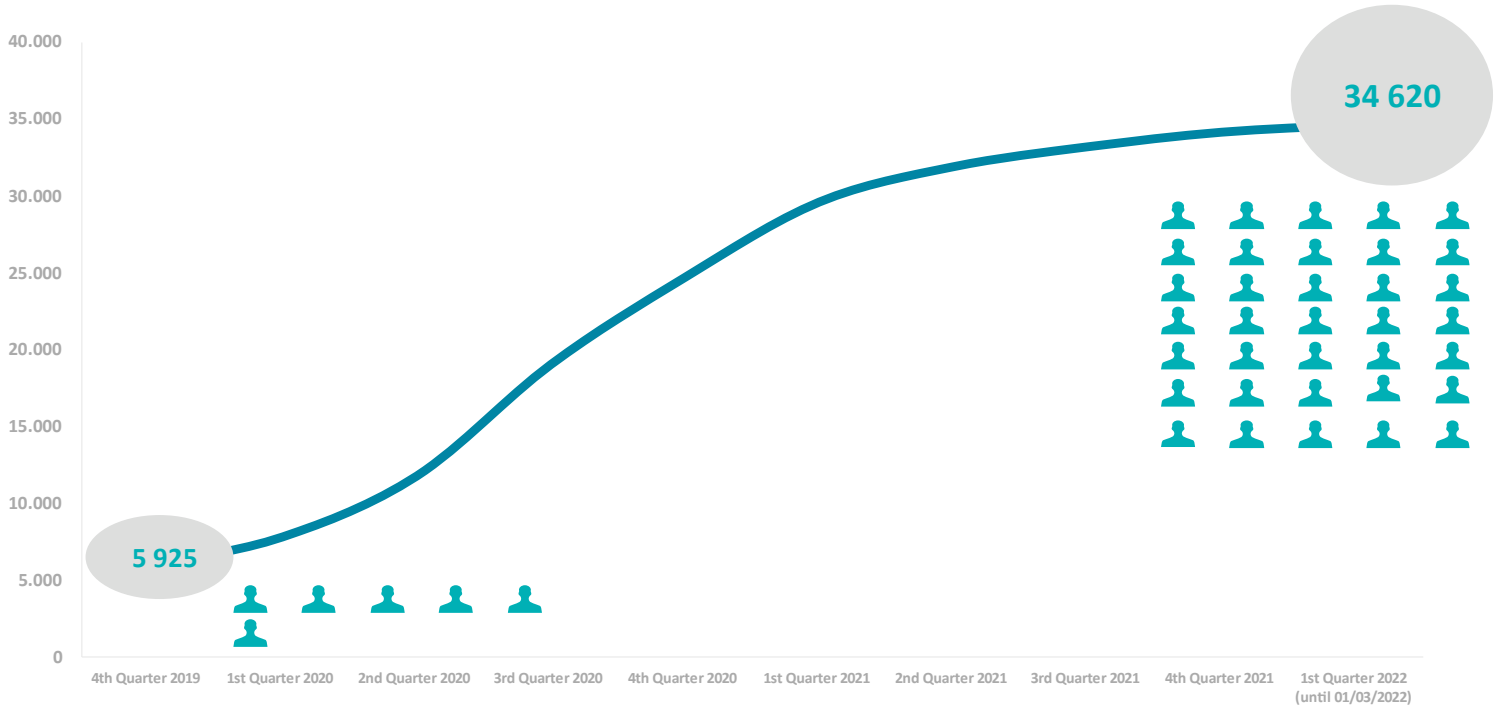


Chart 15. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 12

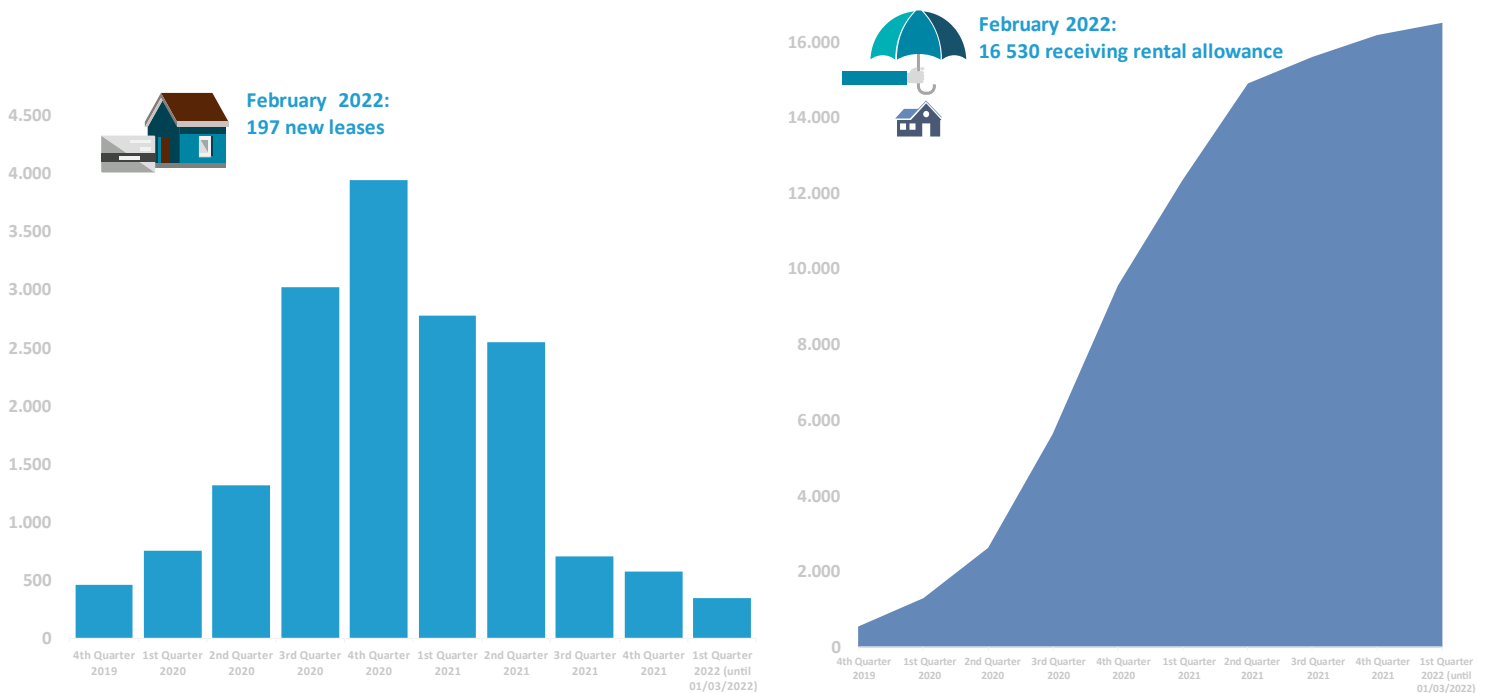


Chart 16. New leases (left), Receiving rental allowance (Right) - See Appendix Table 13 and 14

11. Returns - Departures

In February 2022 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 199 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 194 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 70 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 59 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 14 minor left with the relocation program of unaccompanied minors.
- 6 people seeking International Protection were transferred to Belgium in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- 14 Beneficiaries of International Protection moved to France as part of a relocation program implemented in cooperation with IOM funded by the European Commission.
- Returns under the EU - Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures, from 01/06 the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 556 people left the country in February, while 499 arrived.

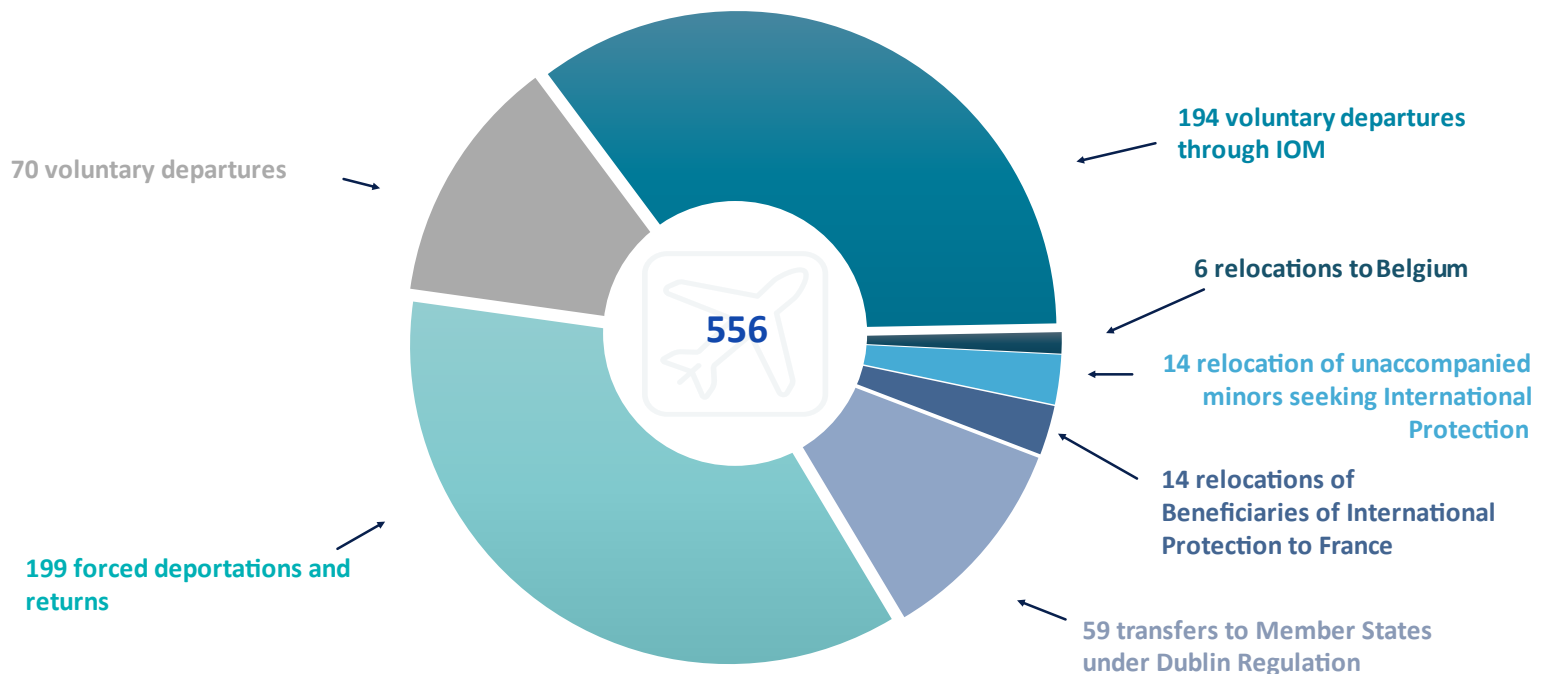


Chart 17. Returns-Departures – See Appendix Table 15

12. Special Edition – Arrivals of Ukraine citizens due to war

From 23/2/2022 till 28/2/2022 a total of 1.501 arrivals of Ukrainians took place (from air and land borders), where 24% refers to minors, 26% refers to the age group between 18-34 and 50% refers to the age group 35+.

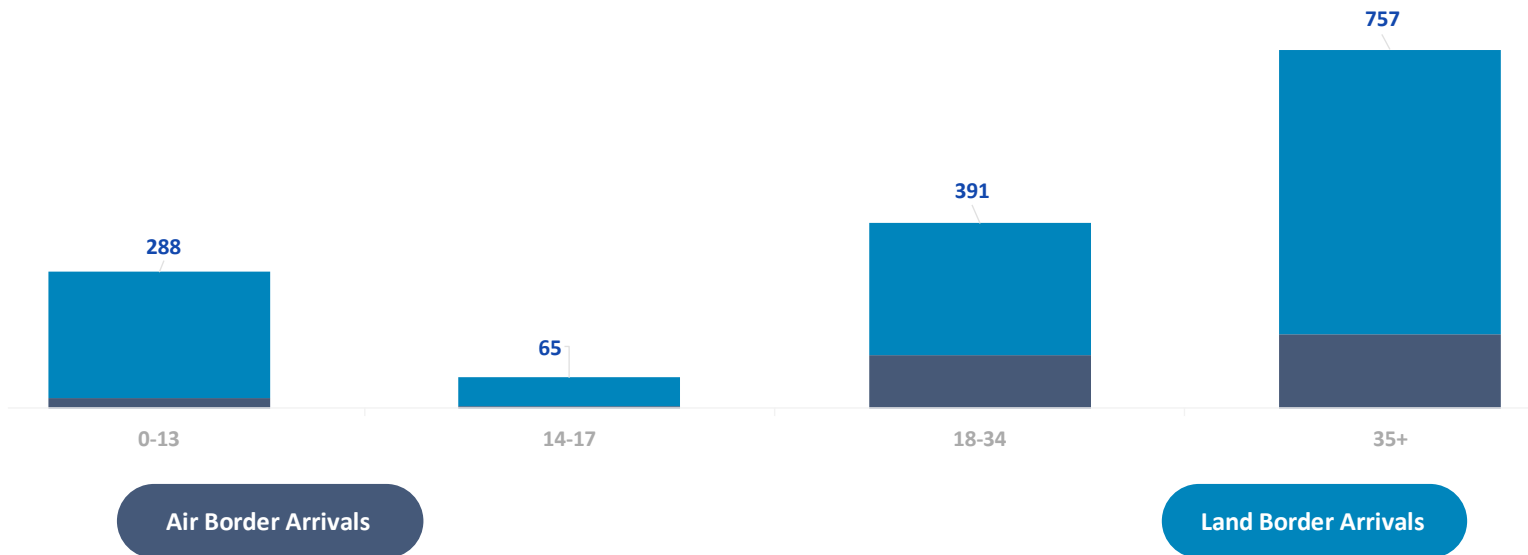
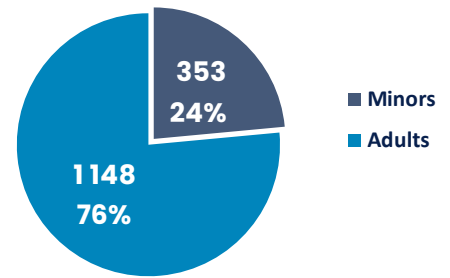
