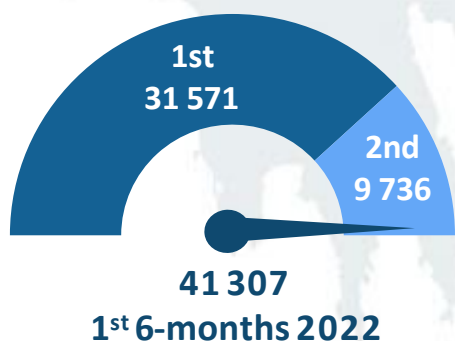

Arrivals increased by 132% in June 2022 compared to the corresponding month of 2021.

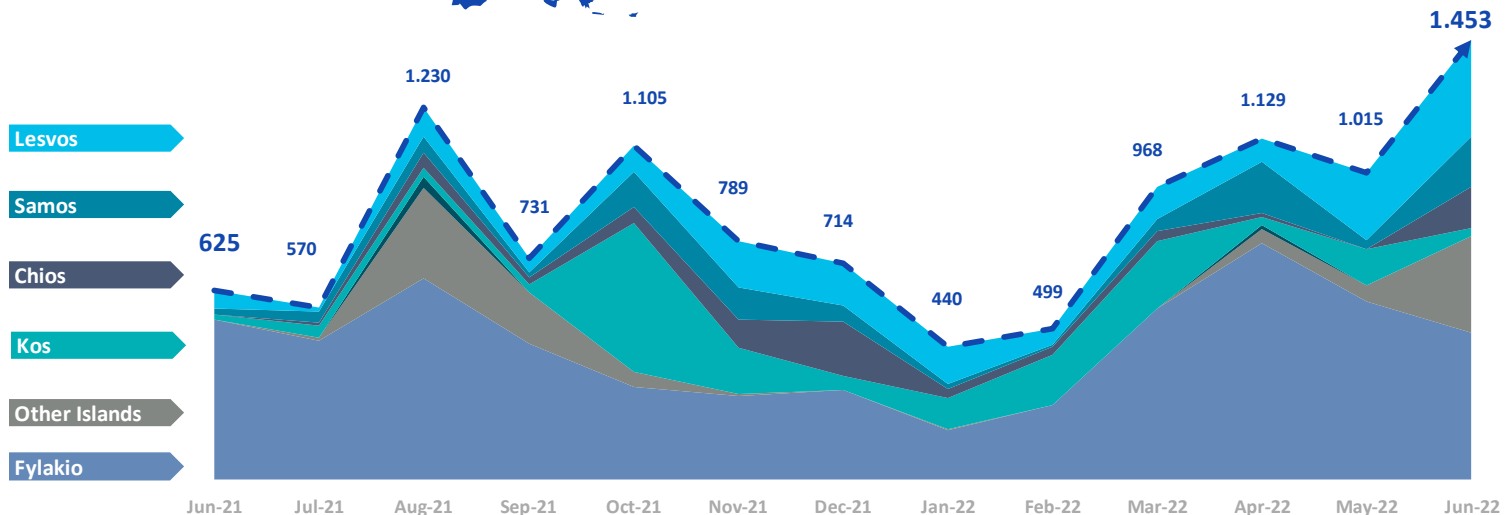
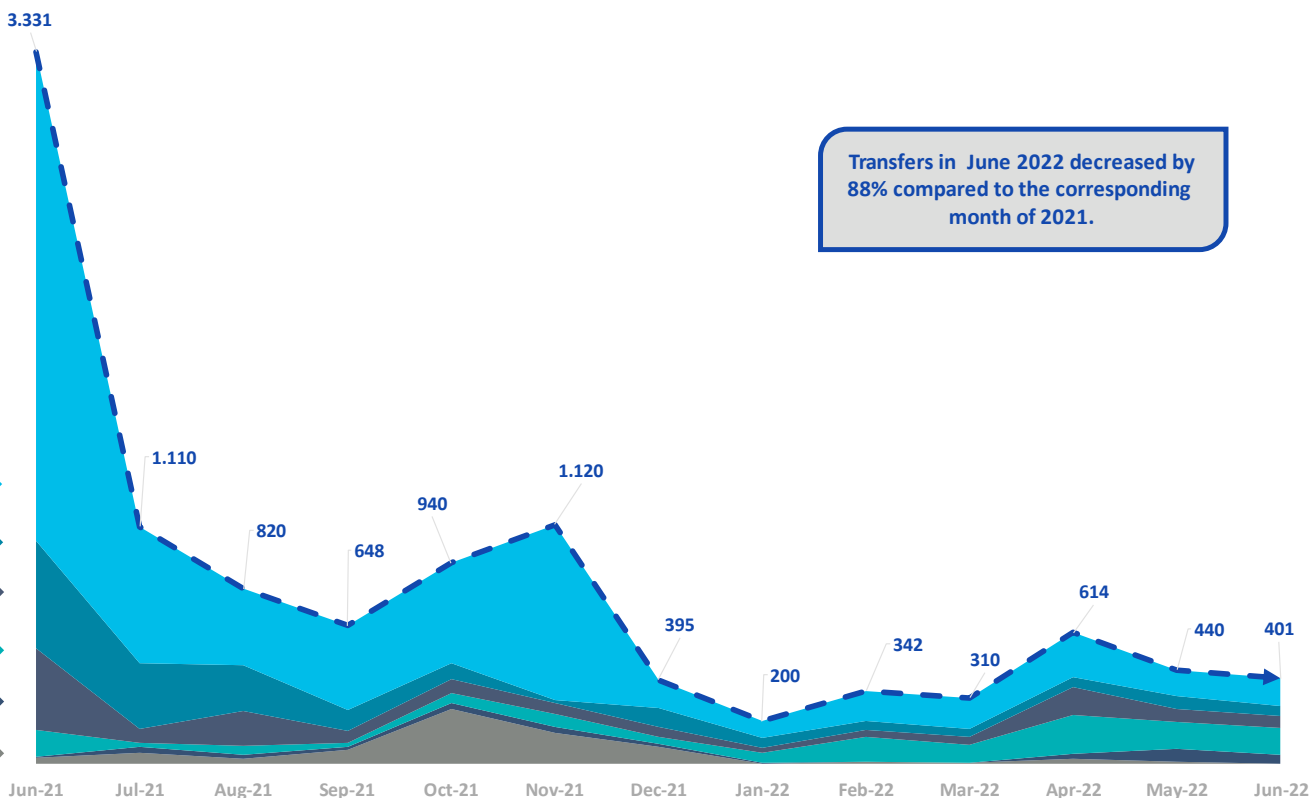


Chart 1. Arrivals June 2021 - June 2022 (12 months) – See Appendix Table 1

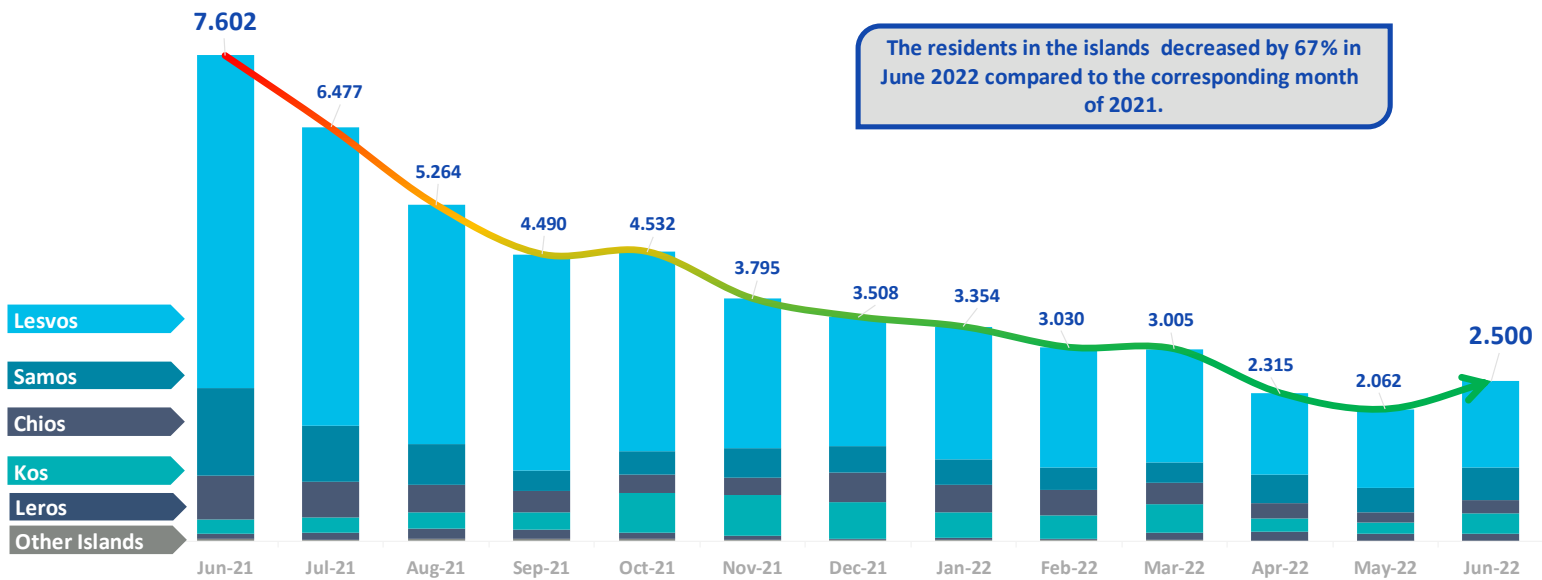


Chart 3. Island Residents in total June 2021 - June 2022 (12 months) - See Appendix Table 3

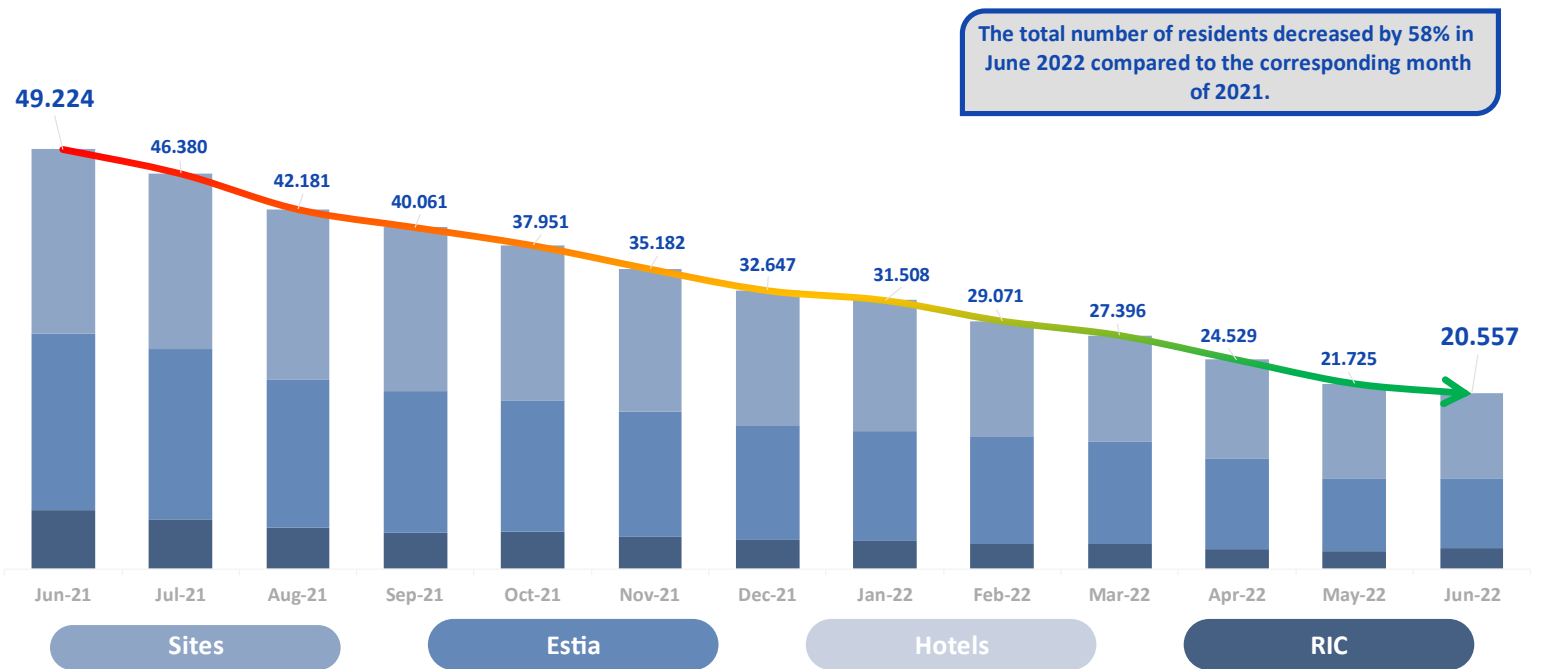
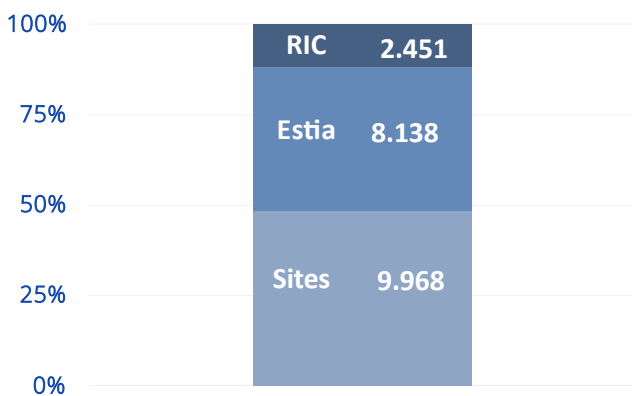
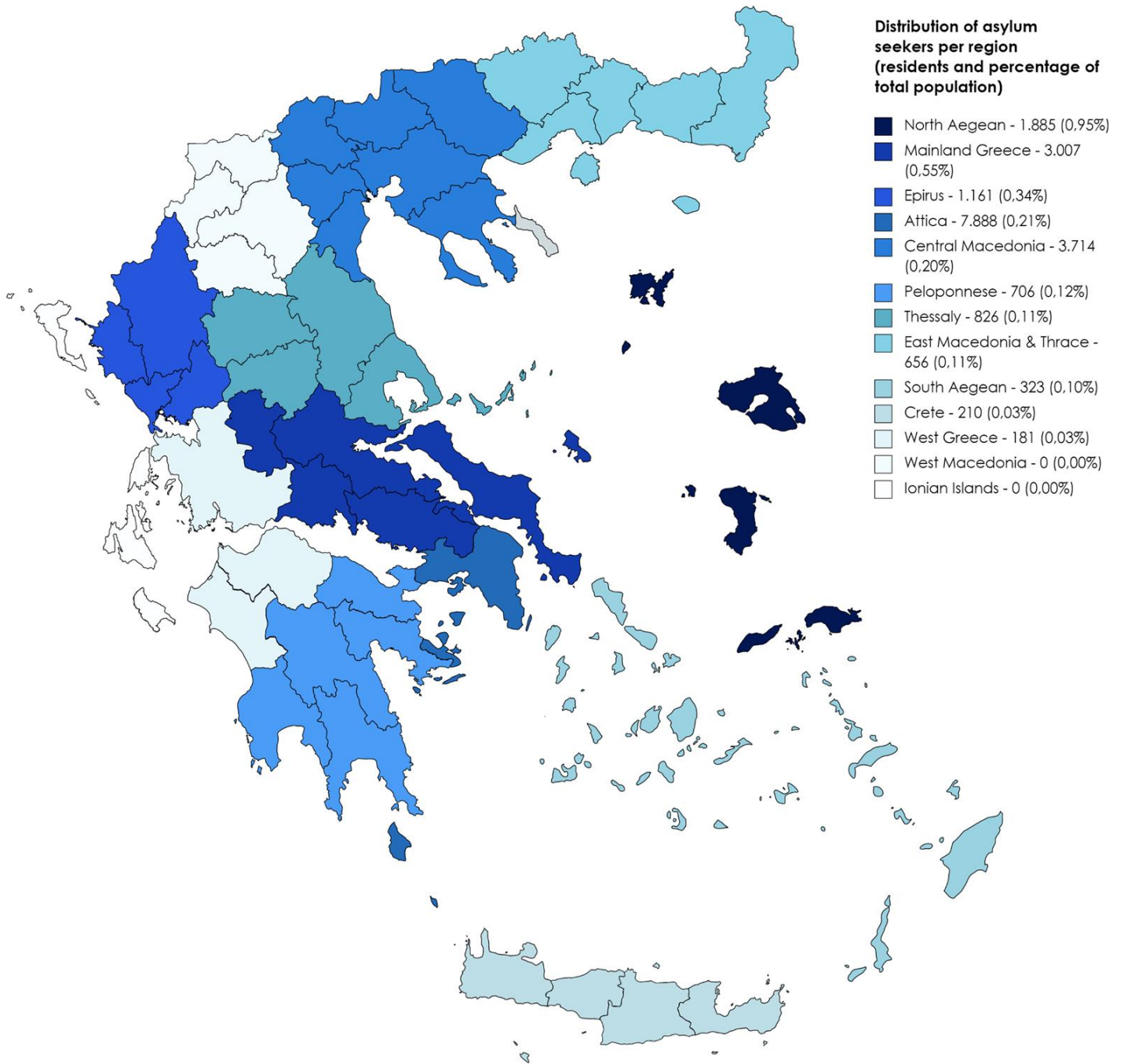


Chart 4. Progress of Residents through time – See Appendix Table 6



The goal of the Government is the equal and fair distribution (1%) of asylum seekers in all the regions of the country, with the exception of the first reception points. There was a general decrease in the number of residents in most regions by 58% (from 49.224 to 20.557) during the last 12 months.

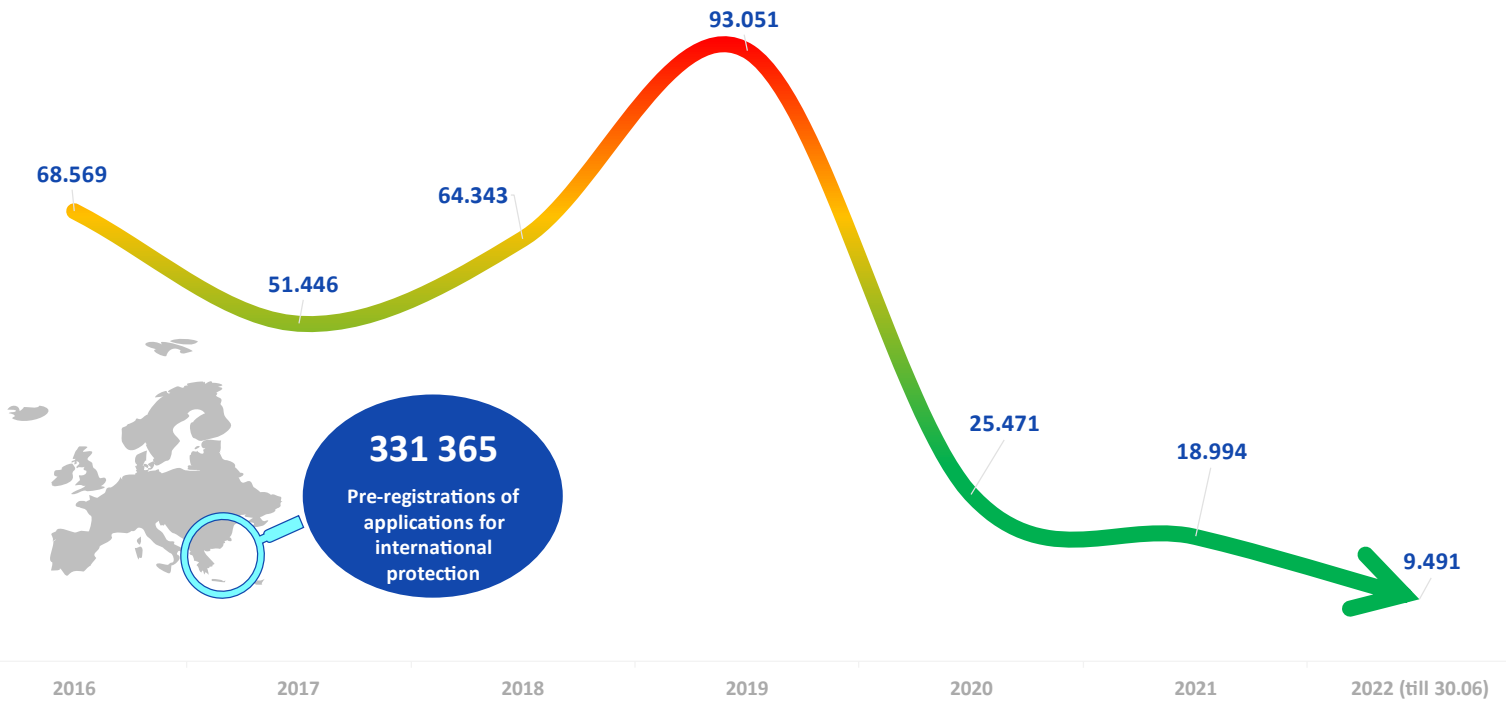

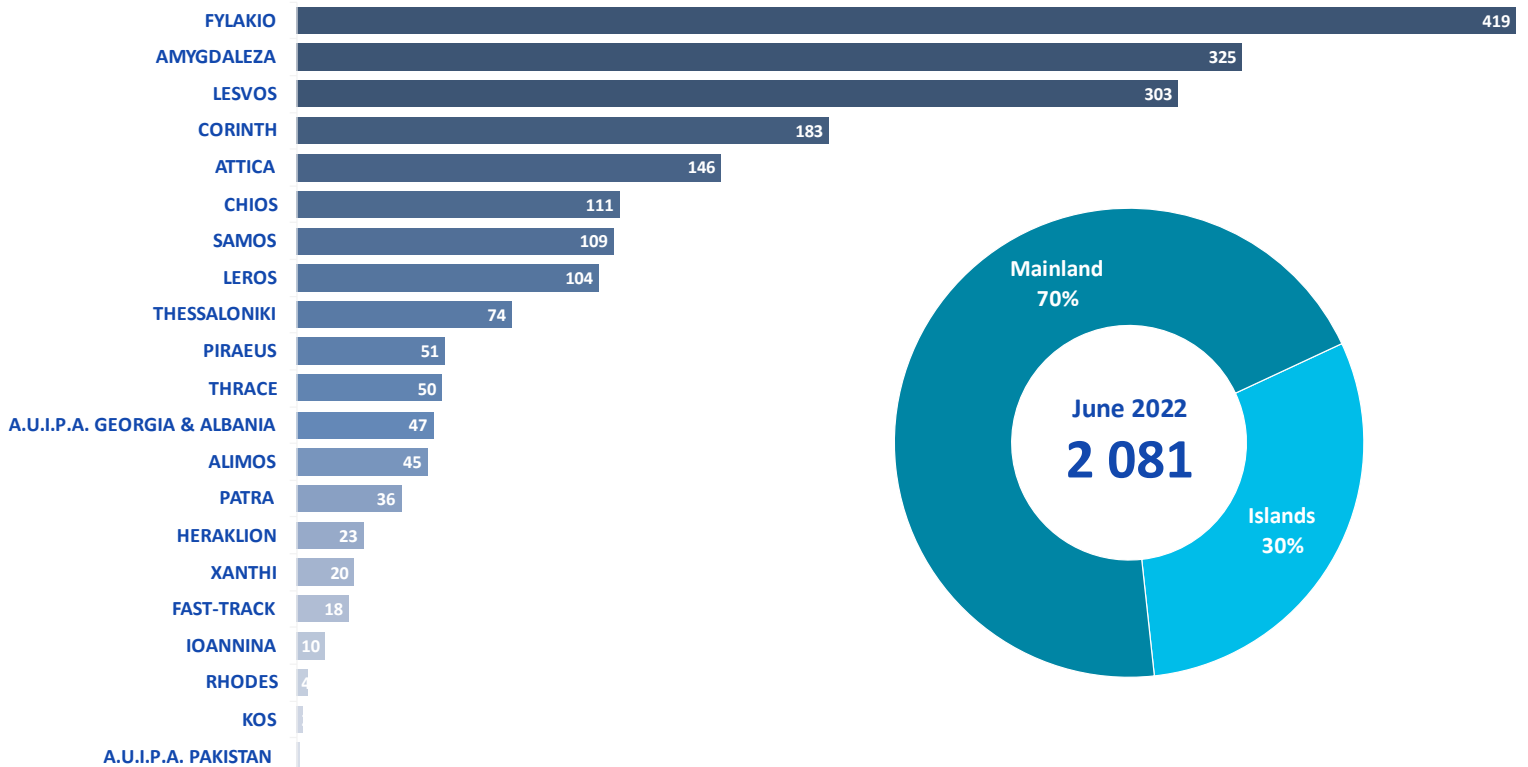


Chart 7. Pre-Registrations of applications per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the reference month (June 2022) – See Appendix Table 7b

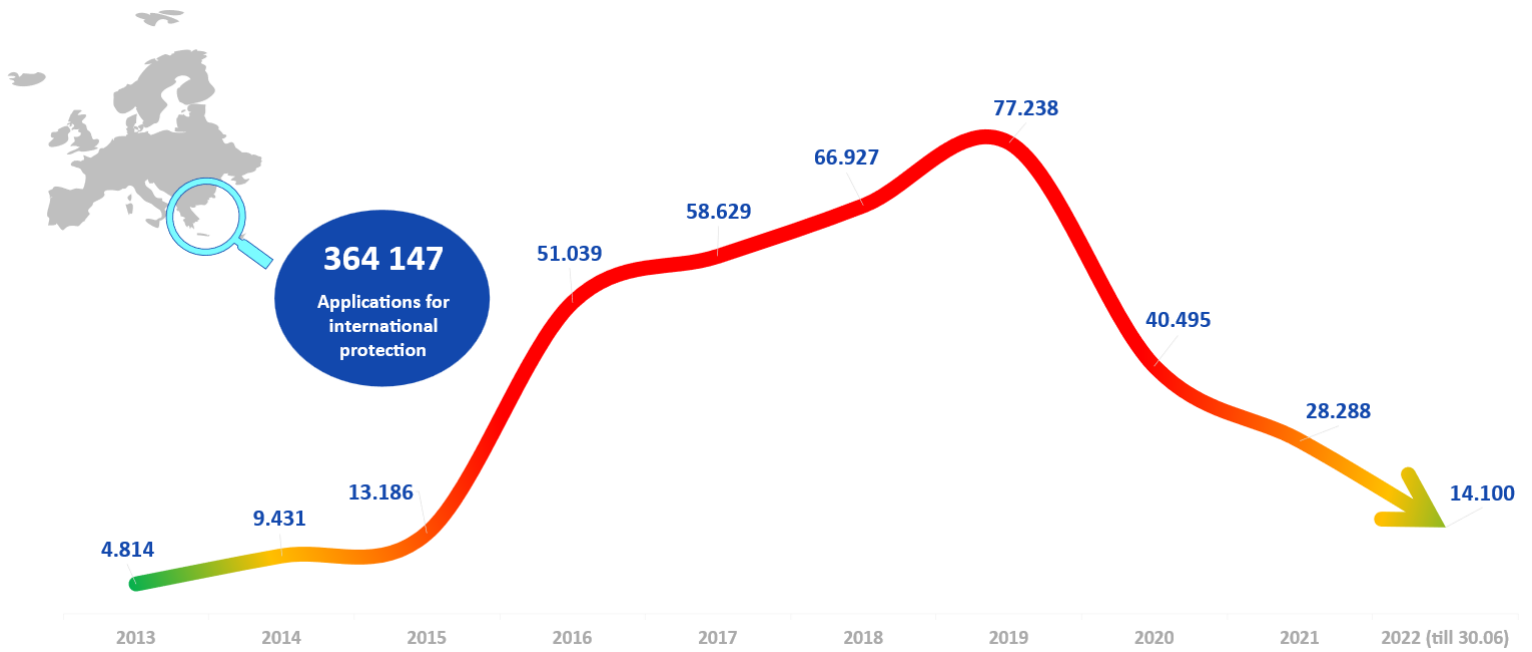


Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2022 applications are calculated till the month of reference (June) - See Appendix Table 8a

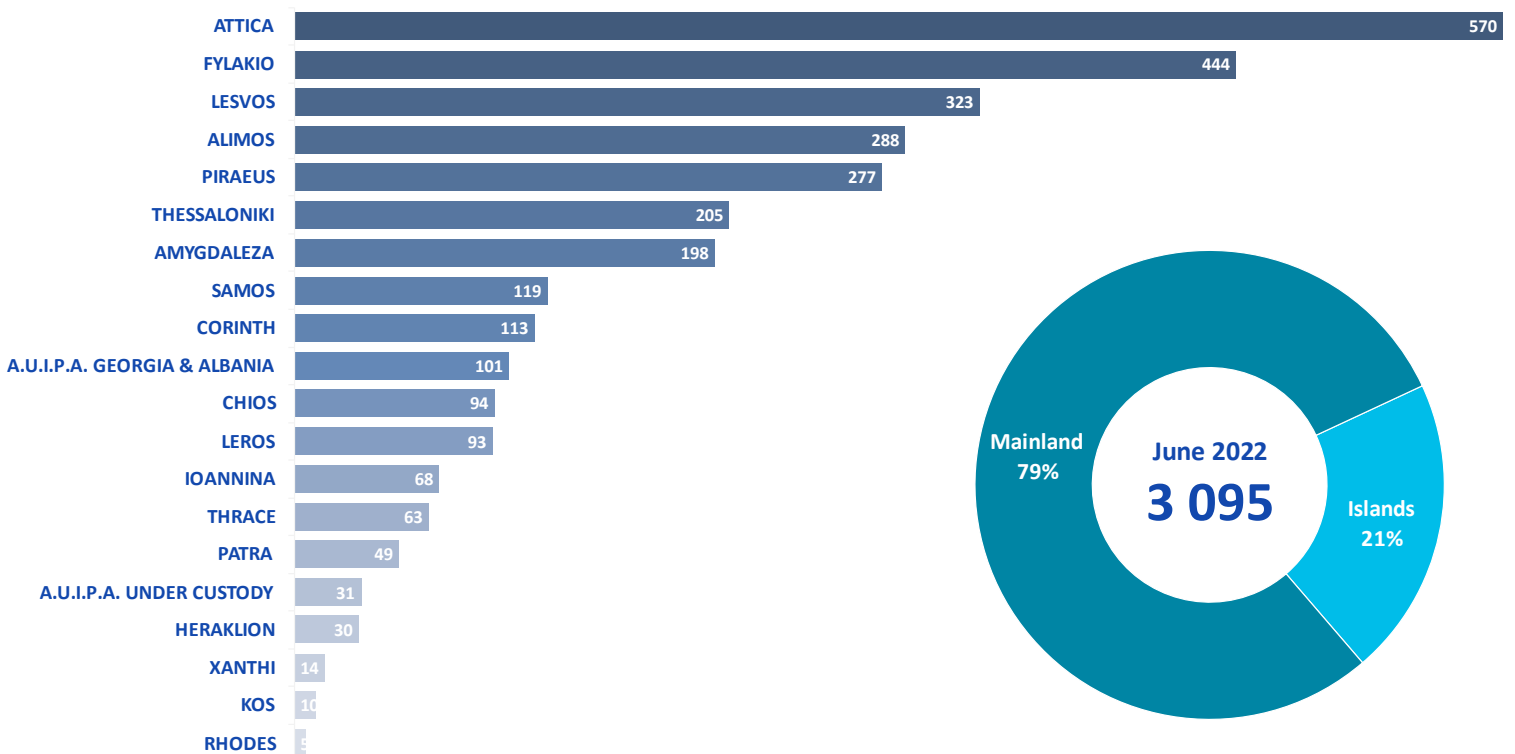
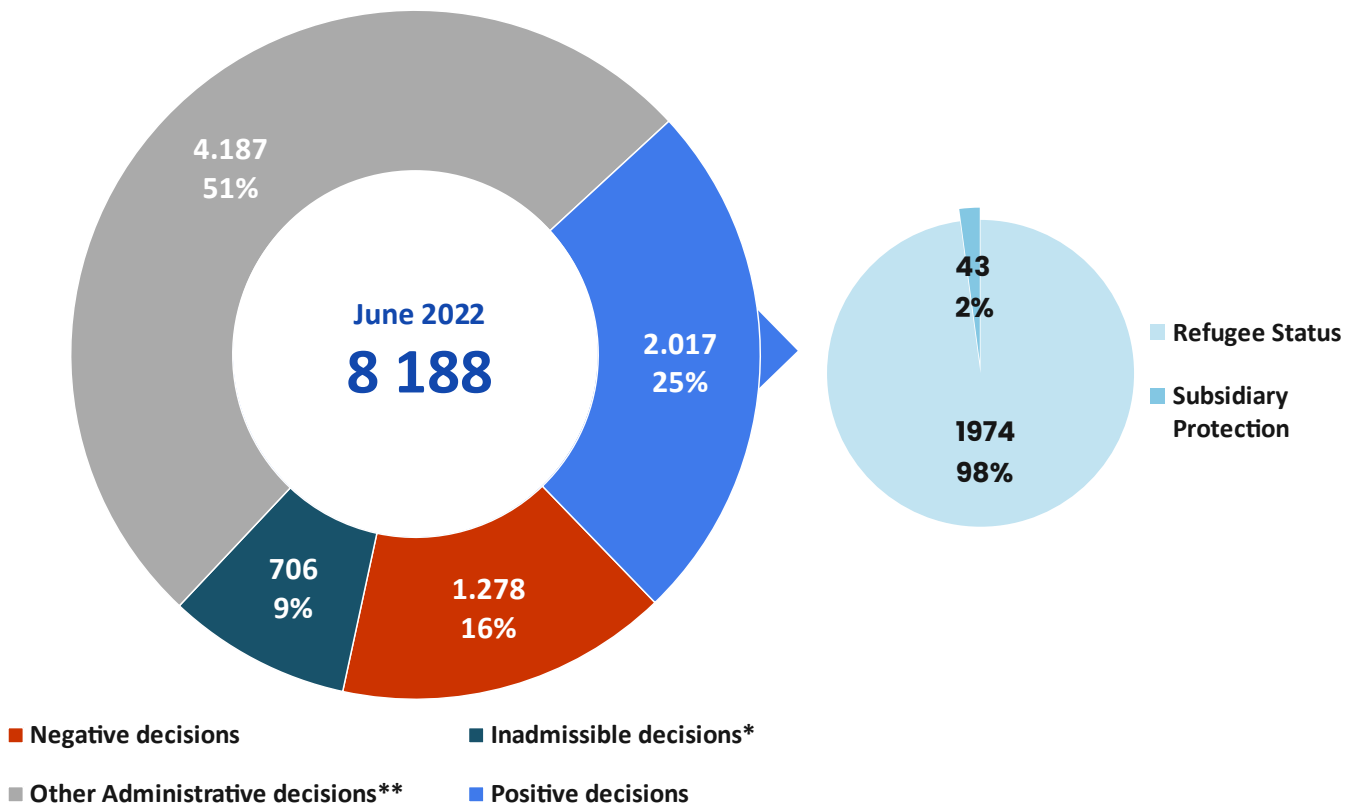


Chart 9. Applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the month of reference (June 2022) - See Appendix Table 8b

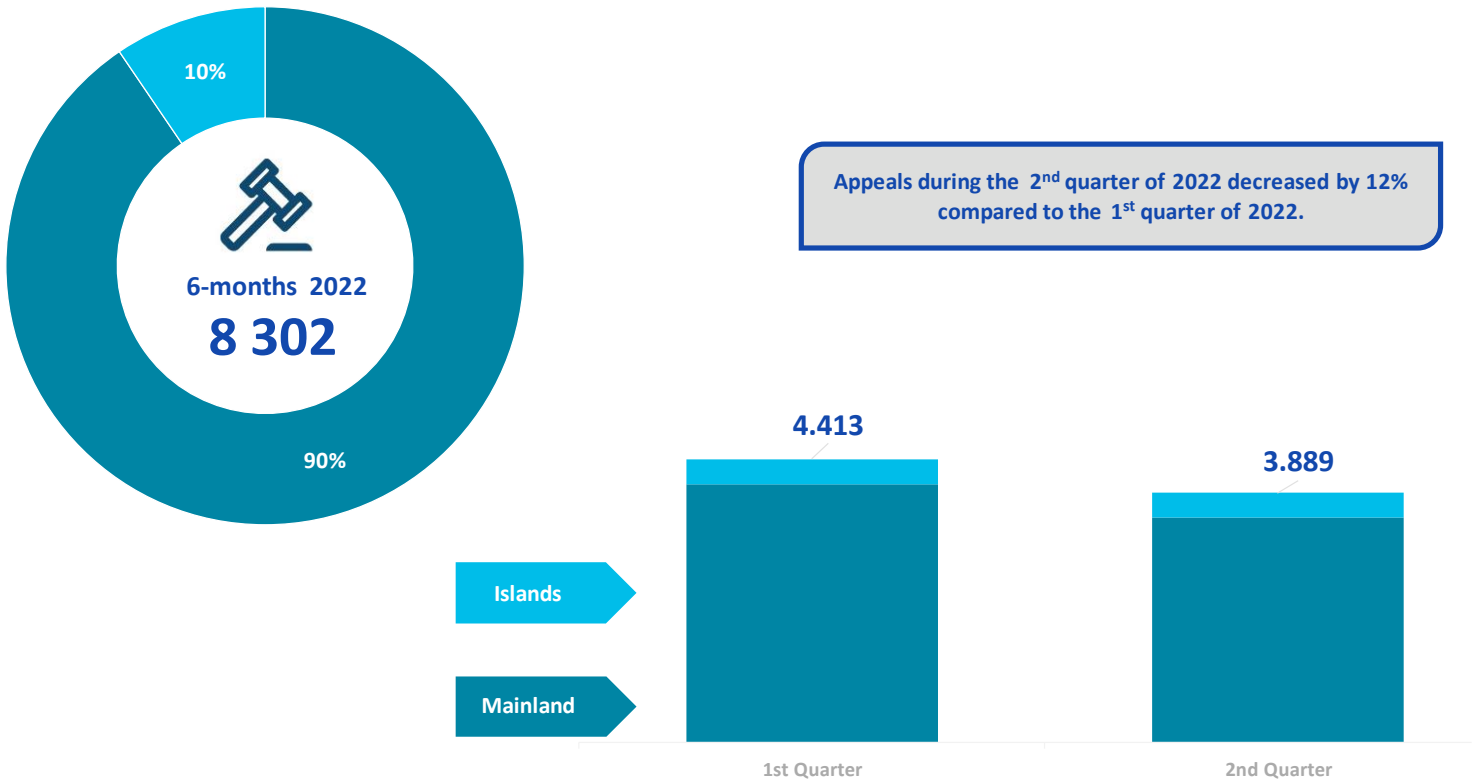

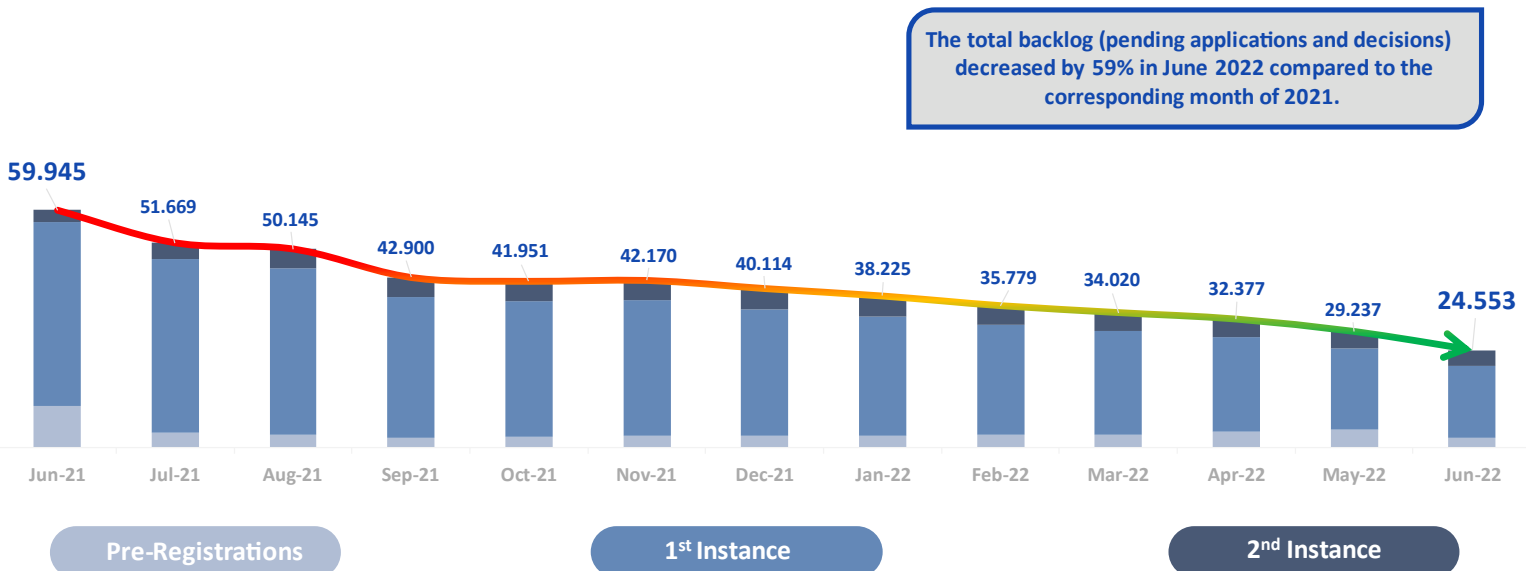

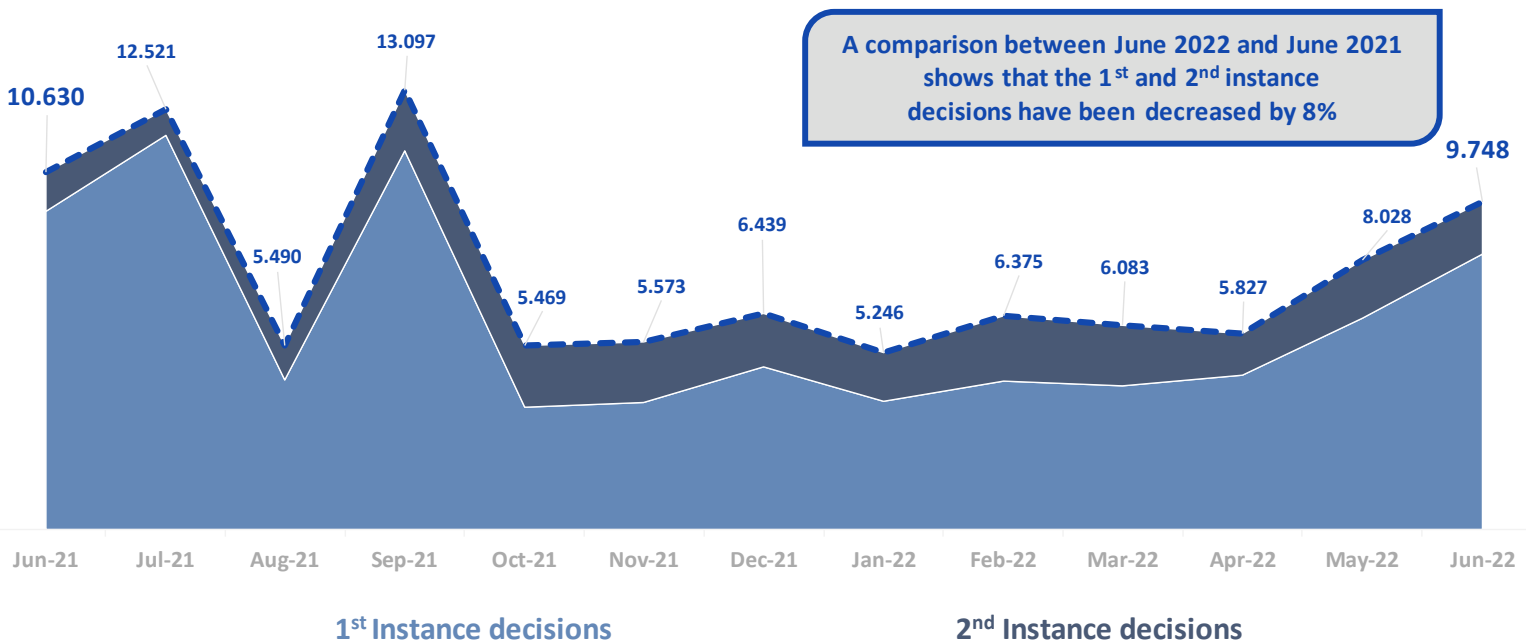


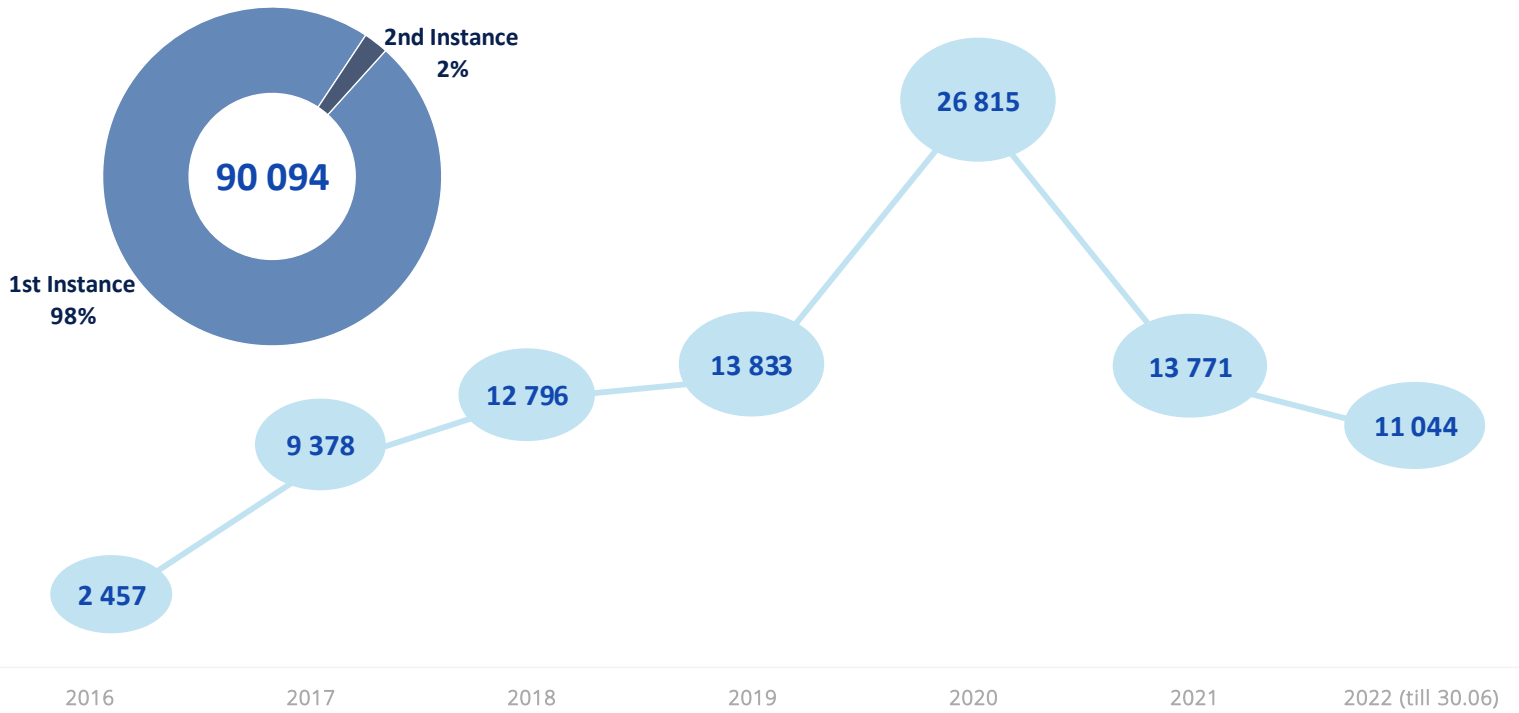
Chart 13. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance per month - See Appendix Table 11a

- The average time for a 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance decision to be issued is 90 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 53 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The number of appellants who applied and benefited from free legal aid is 4,417 (2,395 in the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter and 2,022 in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter).
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (3,972 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed in 2021 and 2022. Out of the total of 15,996 appeals that have been discussed in 2021, only 4 are pending while the remaining 3,968 pending appeals consists of cases that were discussed in the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of 2022 (2,325 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed till November 2022 (1,643 pending).

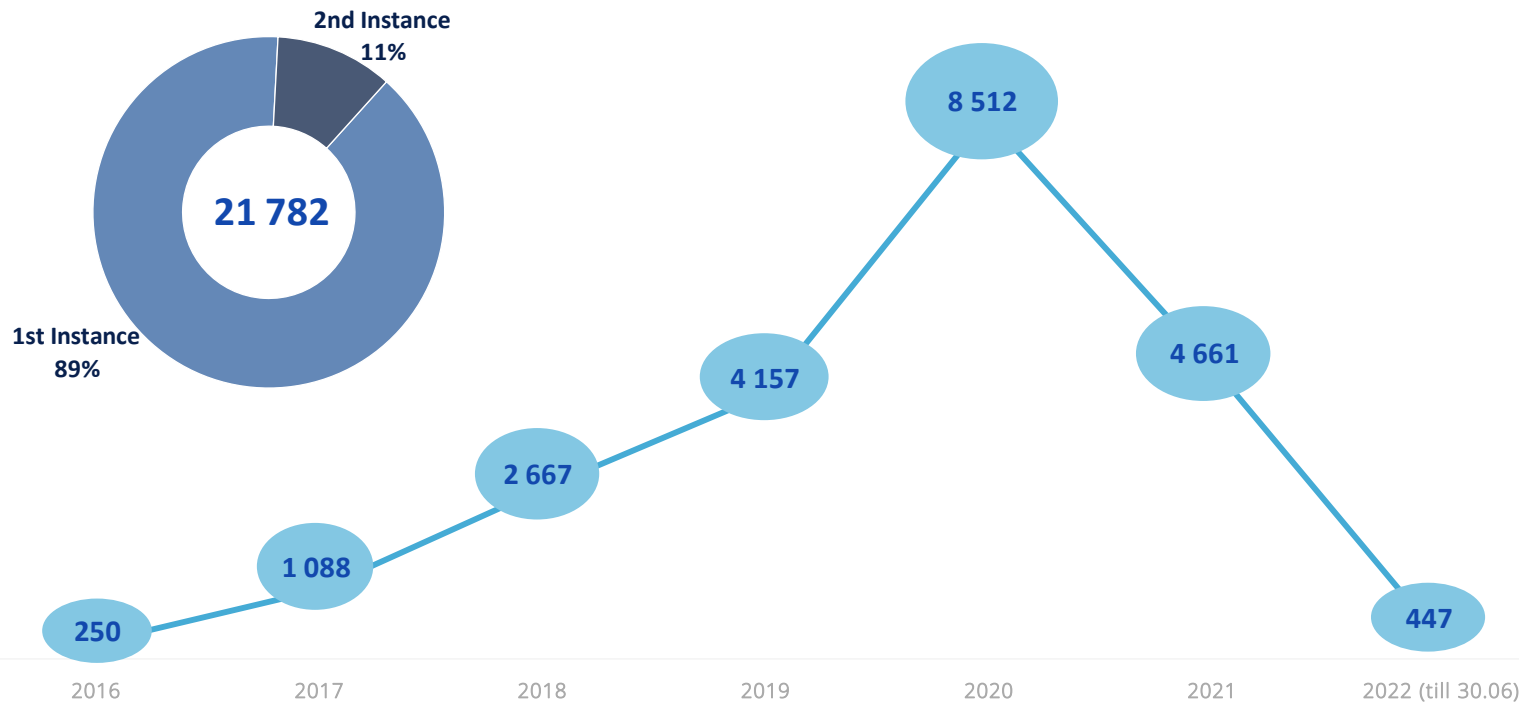


**10a. Asylum Seekers covered by a decision granting Refugee Status in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance**

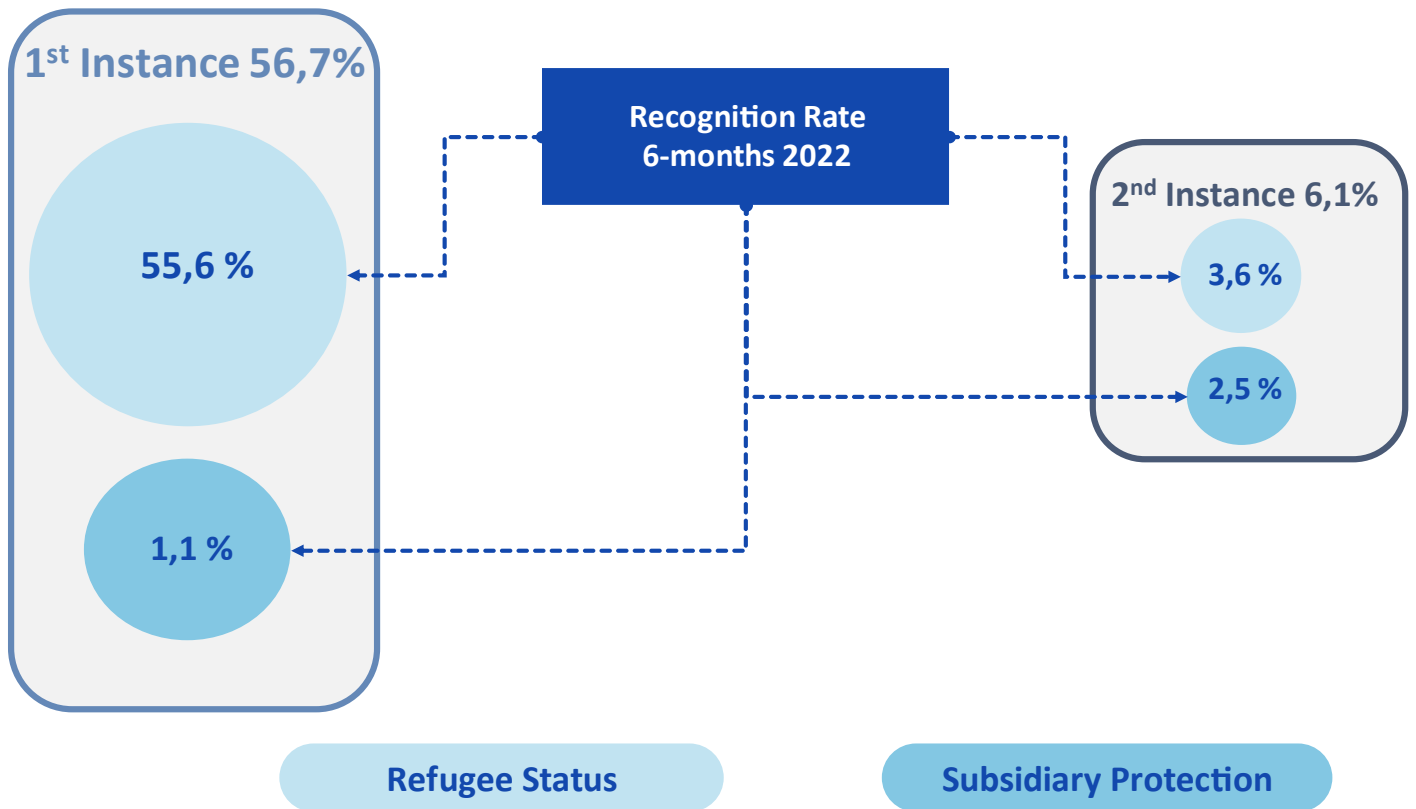


Chart 16. Recognition Rate in 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance. See Appendix Table 12c

### 11. Applications for annulment of 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance Decisions before the Administrative Court

The 44,9% of the total applications for annulment per year of lodging (4.740) are pending while for the rest of them (55,1%), a decision has been issued. 2,72% of the decisions had a positive outcome and 97,28% were rejected.

From the total of 2.613 Decisions regarding applications for annulment (per year of decision) 2,7% has a positive decision outcome.

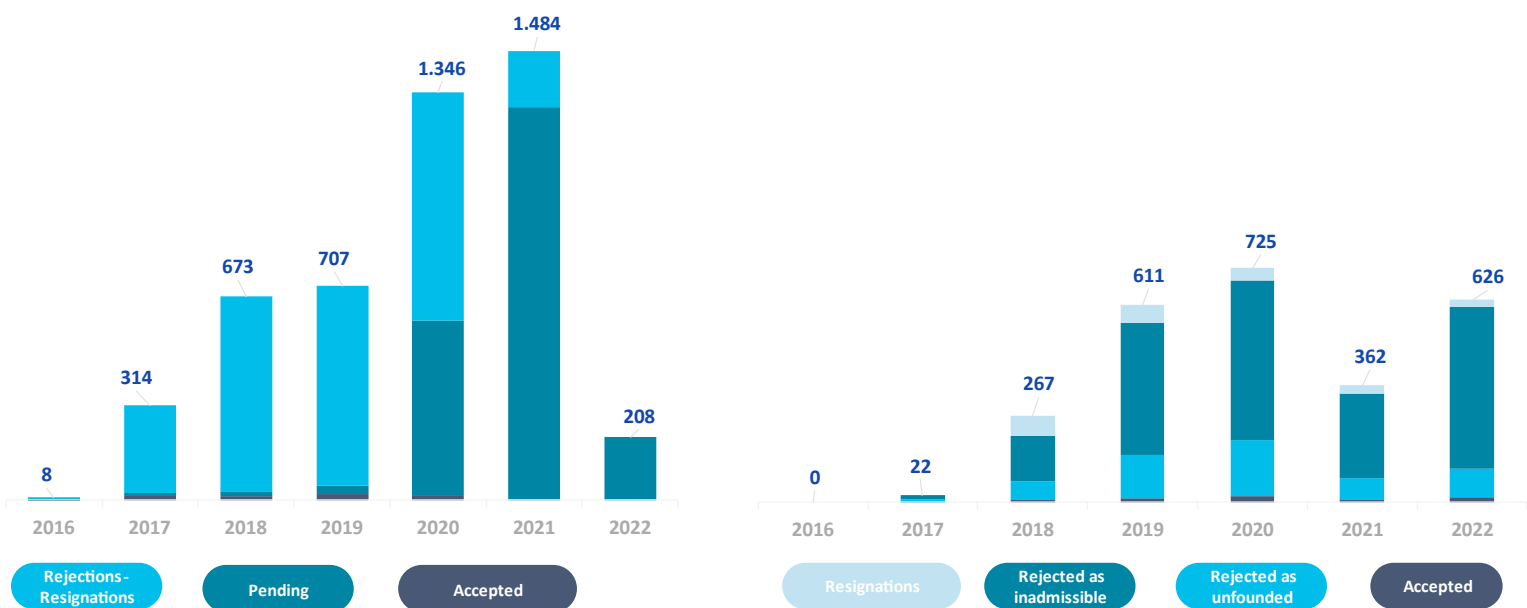

## 12. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/07/2019 until 30/6/2022, 35.893 people have registered in the program, while 17.224 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house. It is worth noting that in June 103 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 3/6/2022 till 30/6/2022). At the same time 7.298 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 8.439 people are attending job counseling sessions.

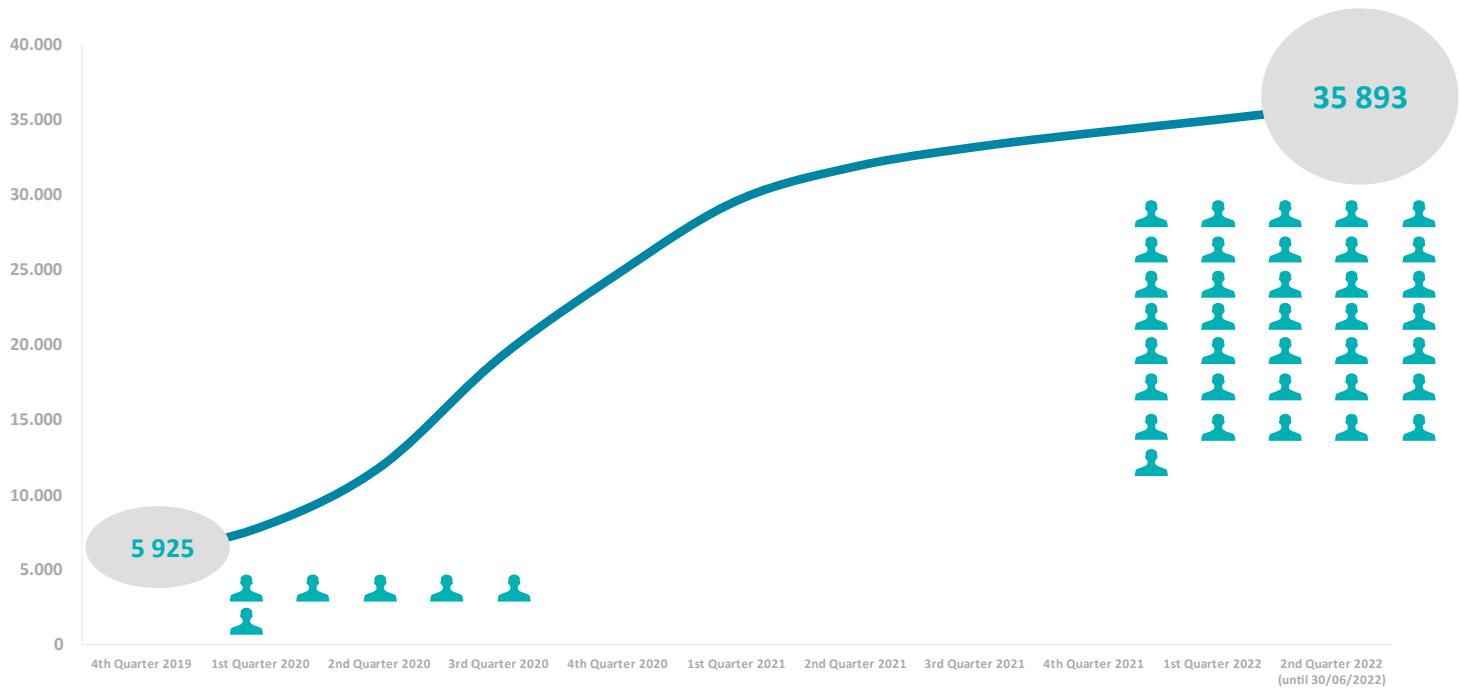


Chart 18. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 14

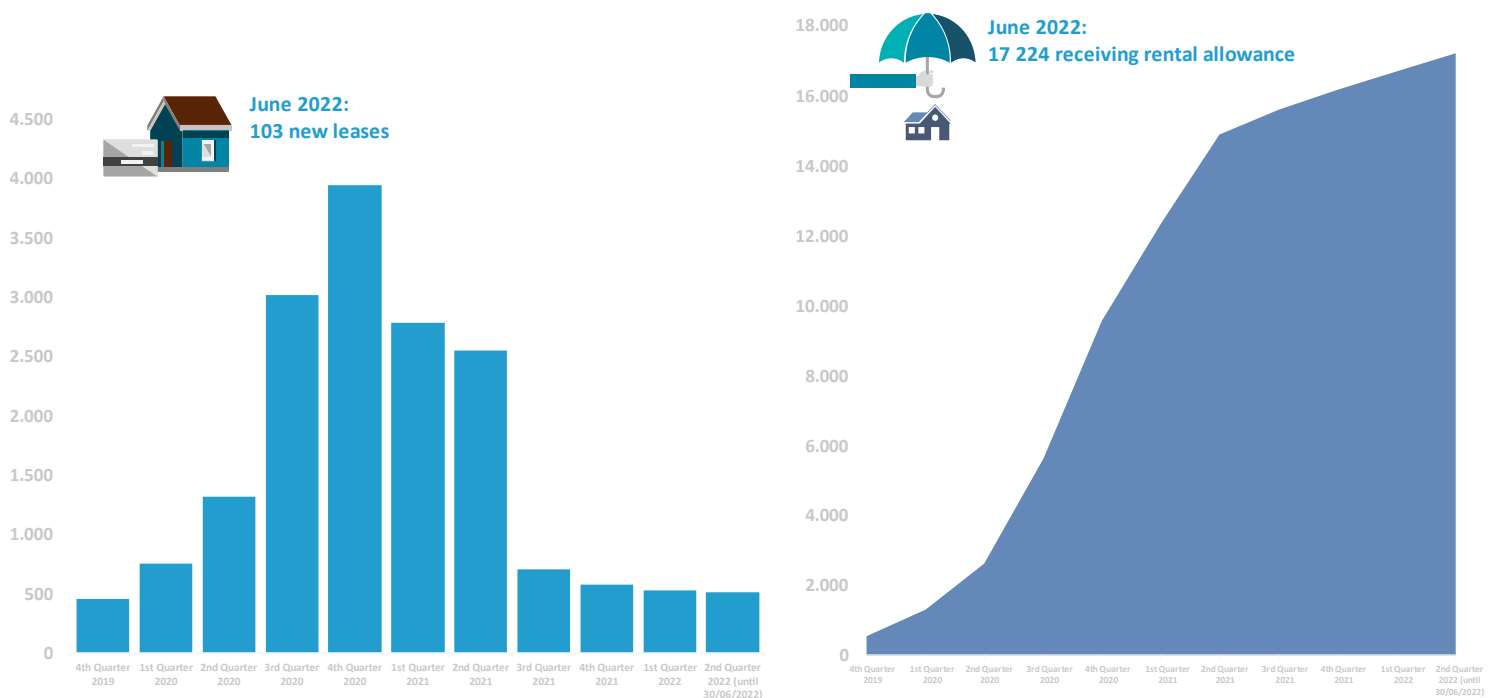


Chart 19. New leases (left), Receiving rental allowance (Right) - See Appendix Table 15 and 16

### 13. Returns - Departures

In June 2022 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 262 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 284 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 94 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 122 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 31 minors left with the relocation program of unaccompanied minors.
- 7 people seeking International Protection were transferred to Italy in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- 18 Beneficiaries of International Protection moved to France as part of a relocation program implemented in cooperation with IOM funded by the European Commission.
- Returns under the EU - Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures, from 01/06 the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 818 people left the country in June, while 1.453 arrived.

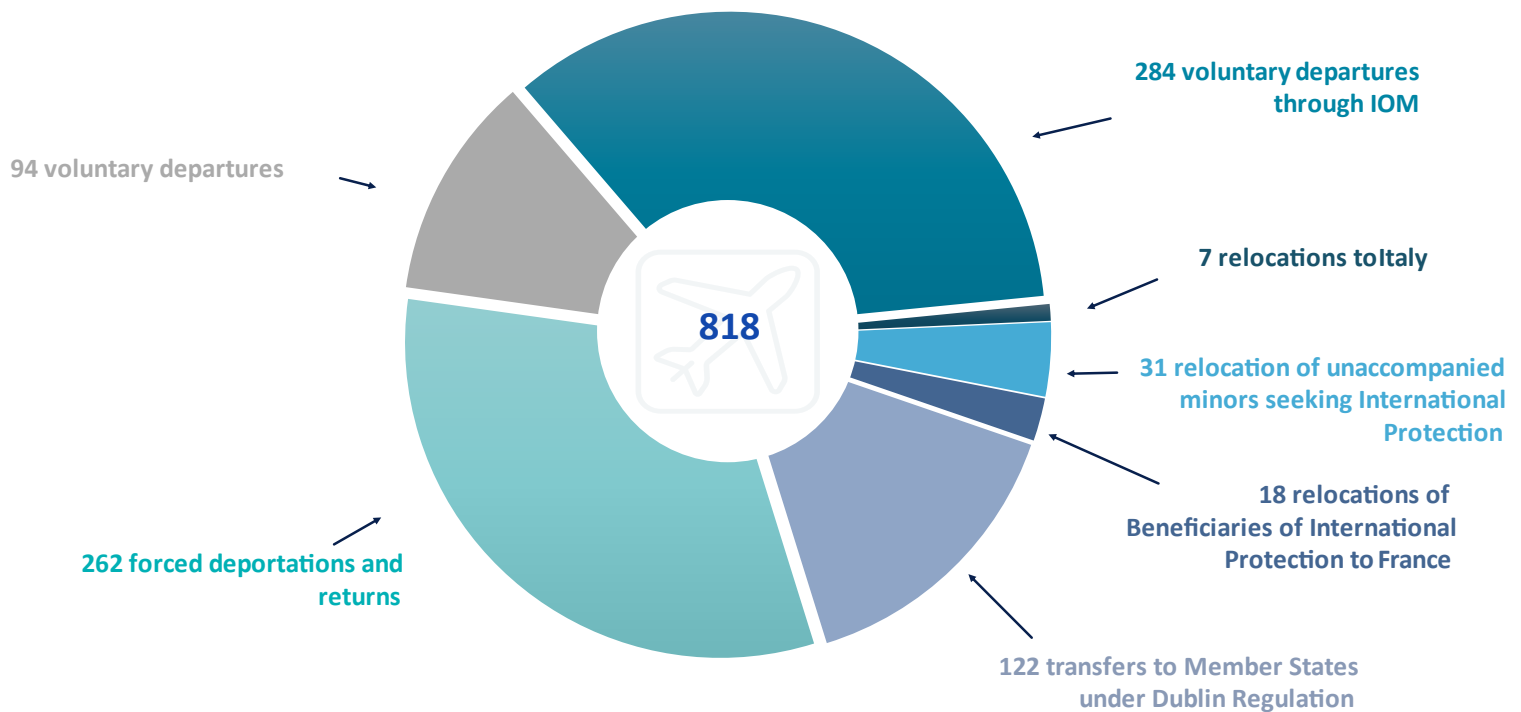


Chart 20. Returns-Departures – See Appendix Table 17

## 14. Special Edition – Arrivals of Ukraine citizens due to war

In June 2022 a total of 15.137 arrivals of Ukrainians took place (from air and land borders), where 25% refers to minors, 23% refers to the age group between 18-34 and 52% refers to the age group 35+.

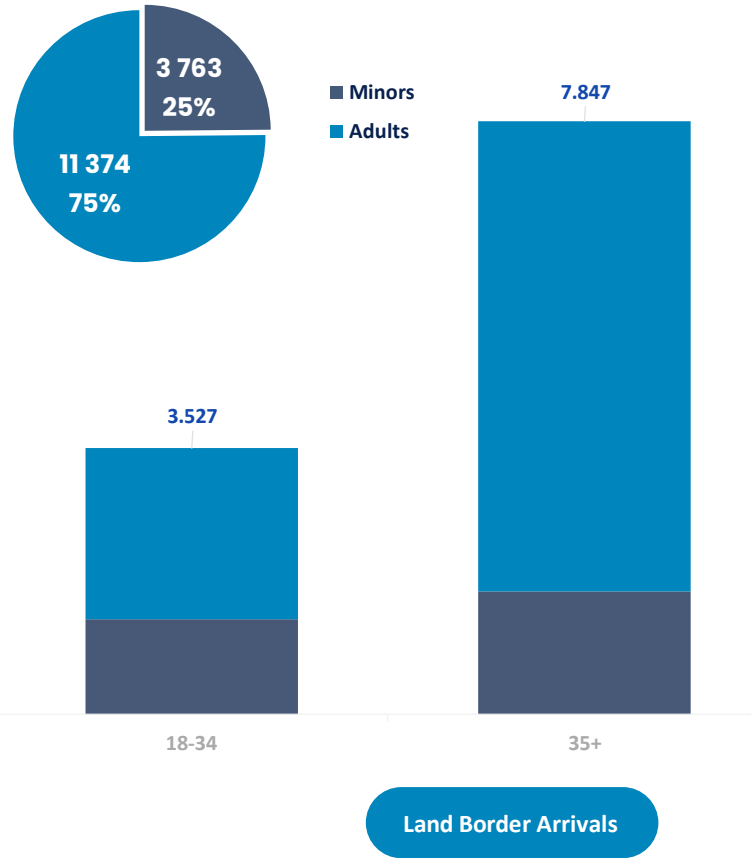


Chart 21. Arrivals of Ukrainians (June 2022) - See Appendix Table 18

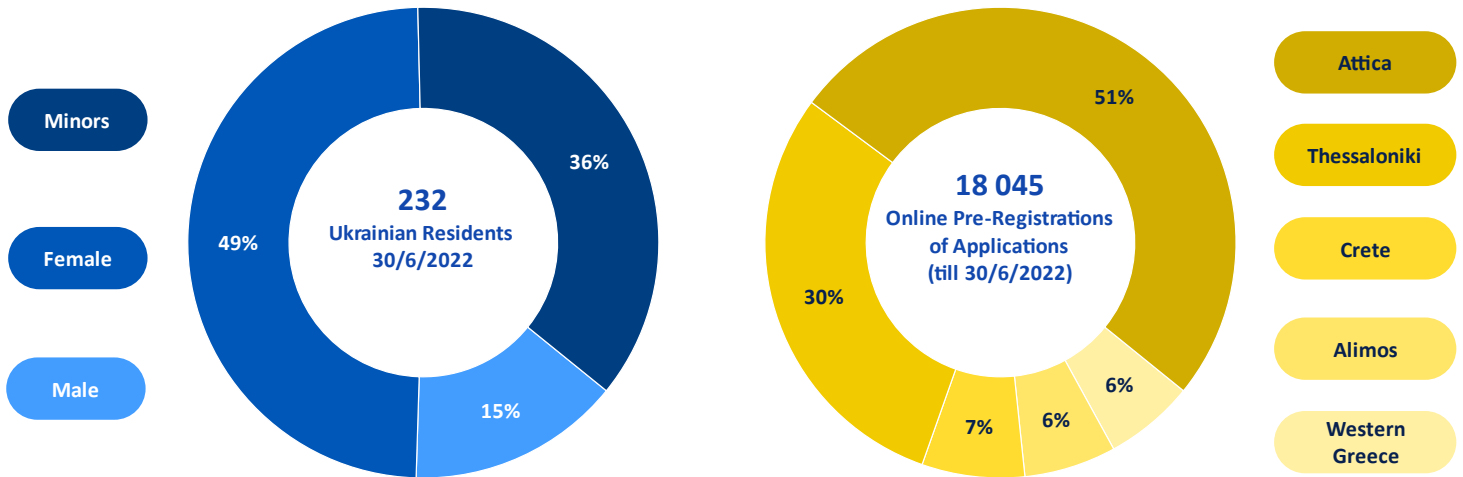


Chart 22. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (June 2022) - See Appendix Table 19 & 20

Until 30/6/2022 there were issued 16.752 cards for Temporary Protection to displaced people from Ukraine where 70% refers to women and 30% to men. 6% of the card issues was proceeded without appointment.

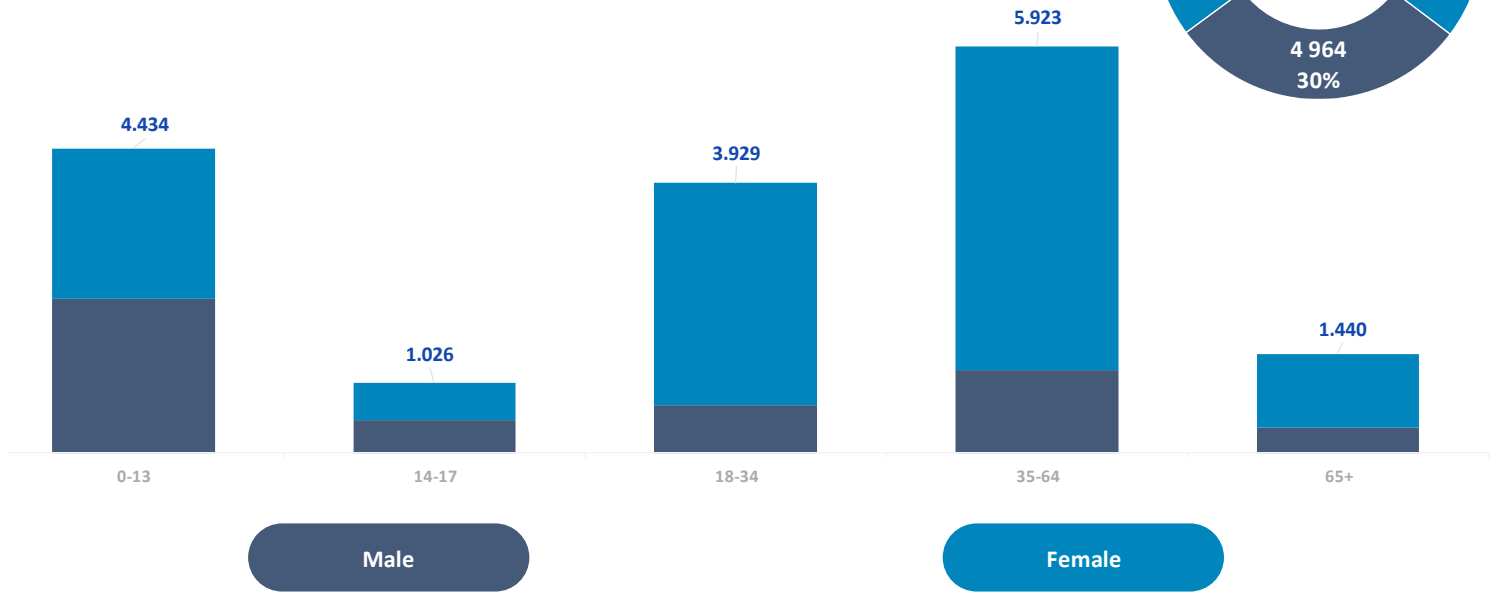
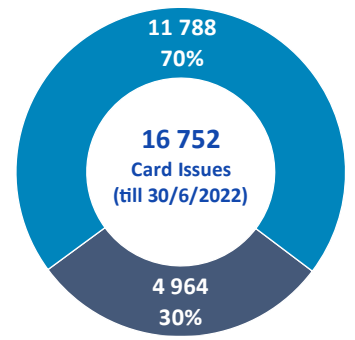
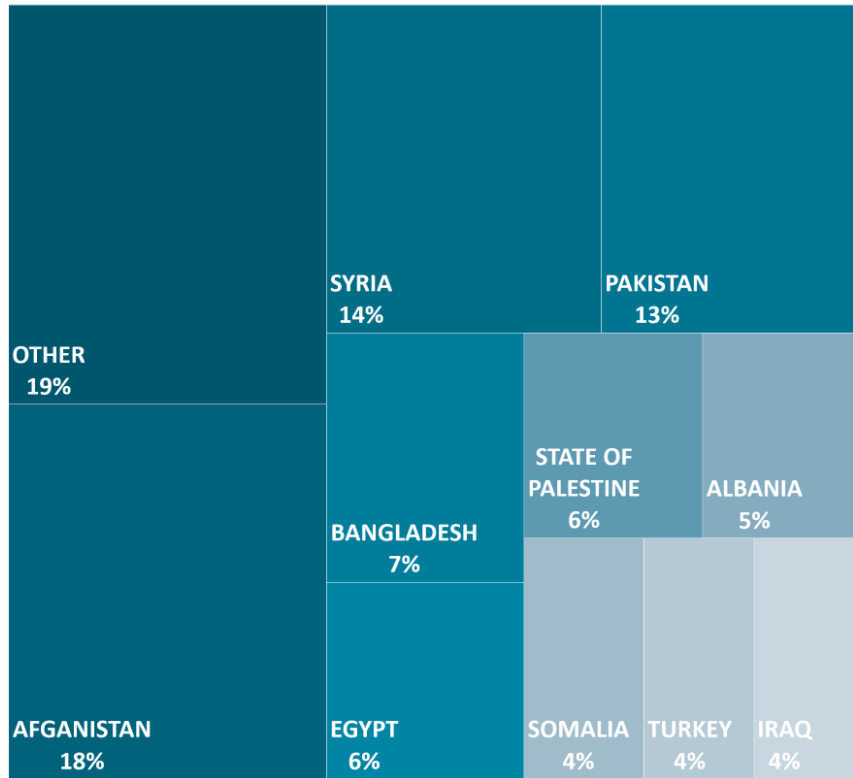


Chart 23. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (June 2022) - See Appendix Table 21

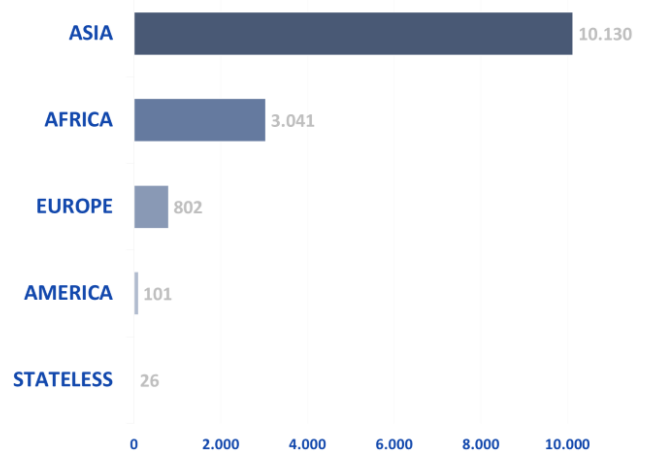

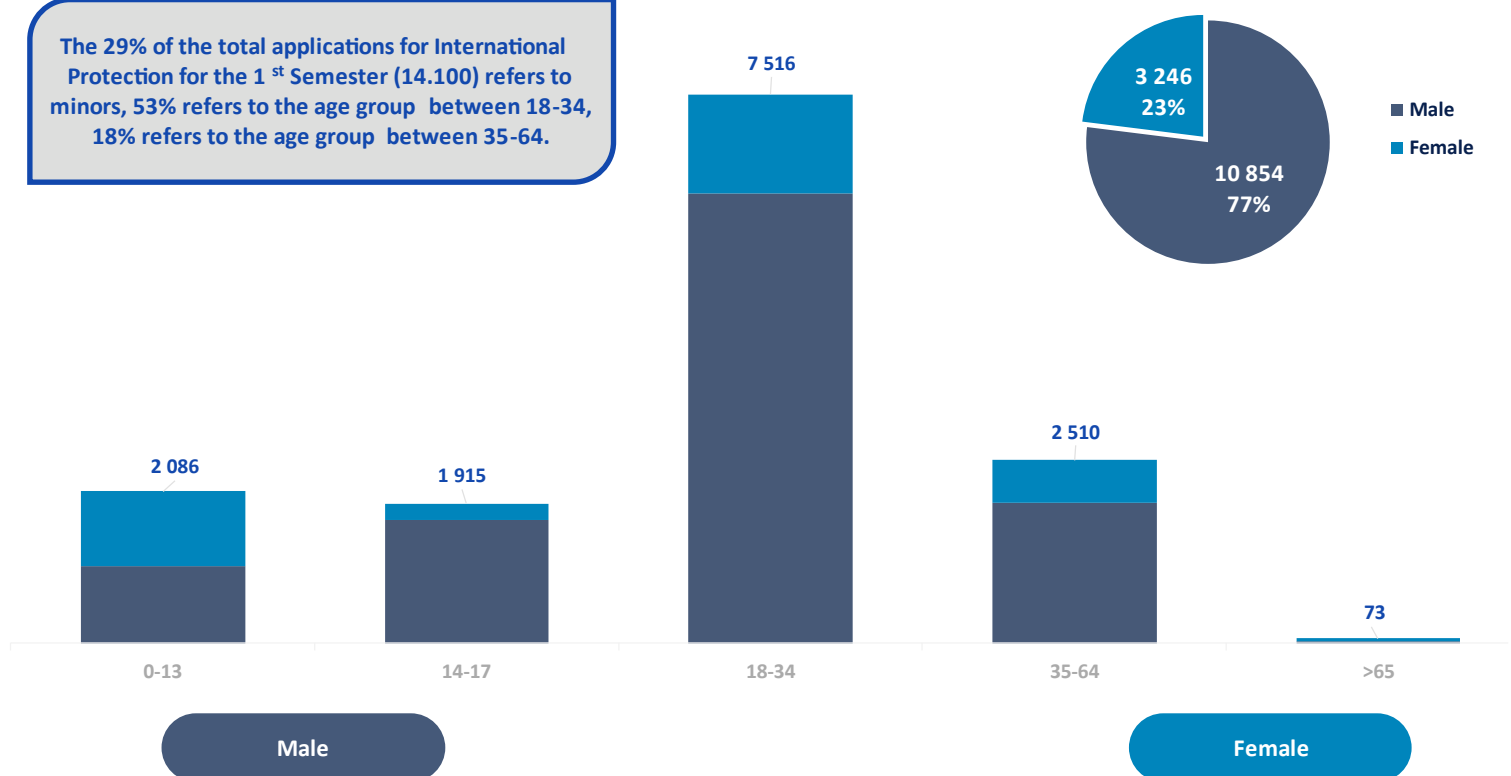
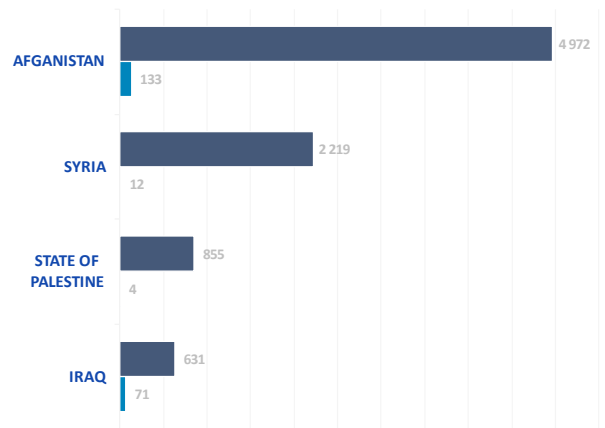
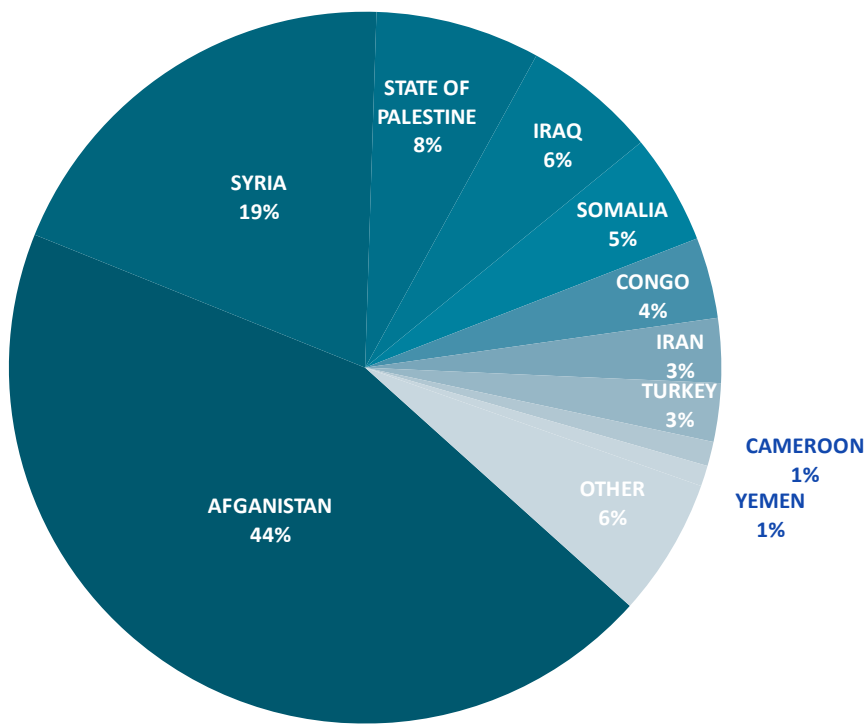


Chart 25. Applications for International Protection in 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of 2022 per age group and gender – See Appendix Table 23

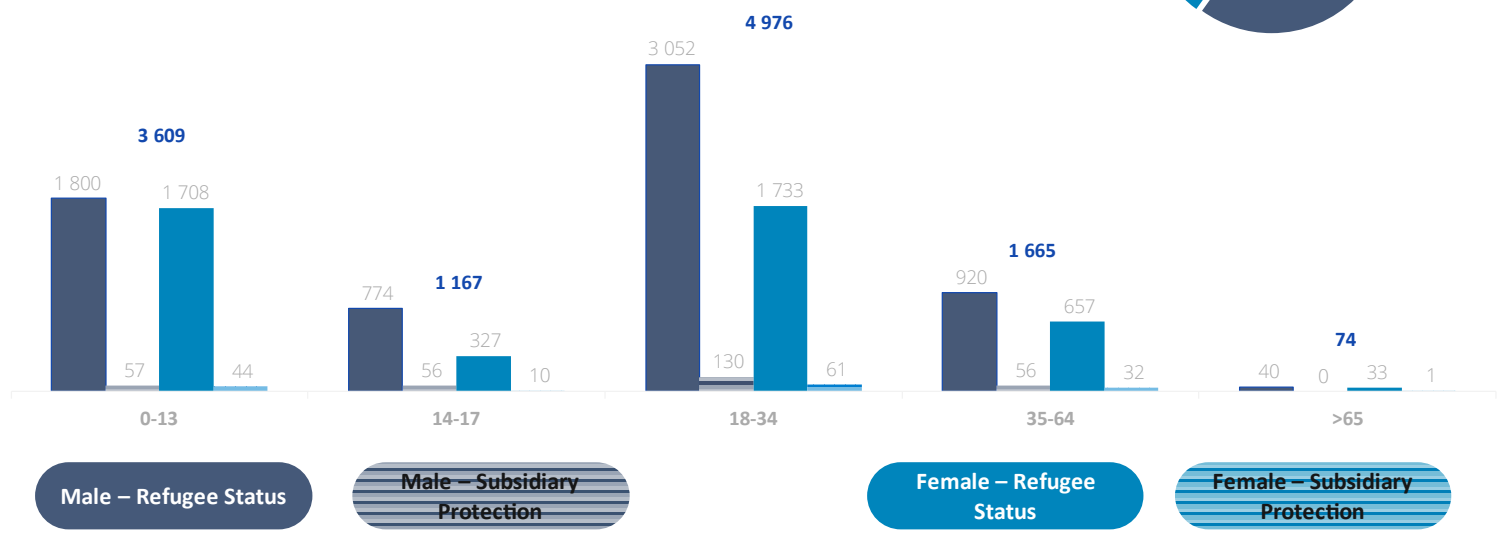
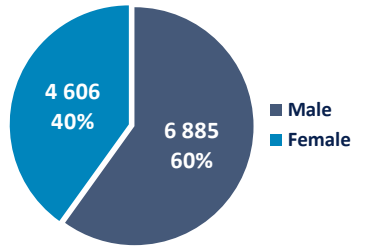
