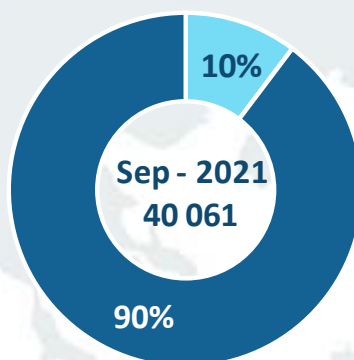

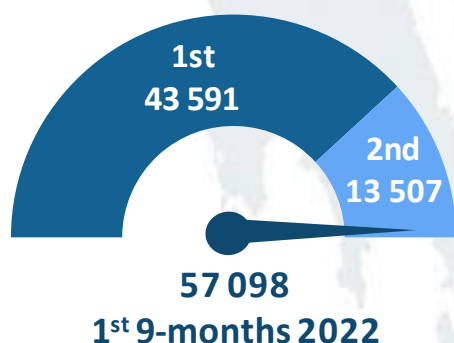

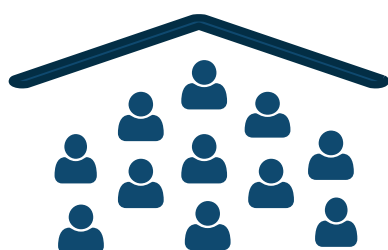

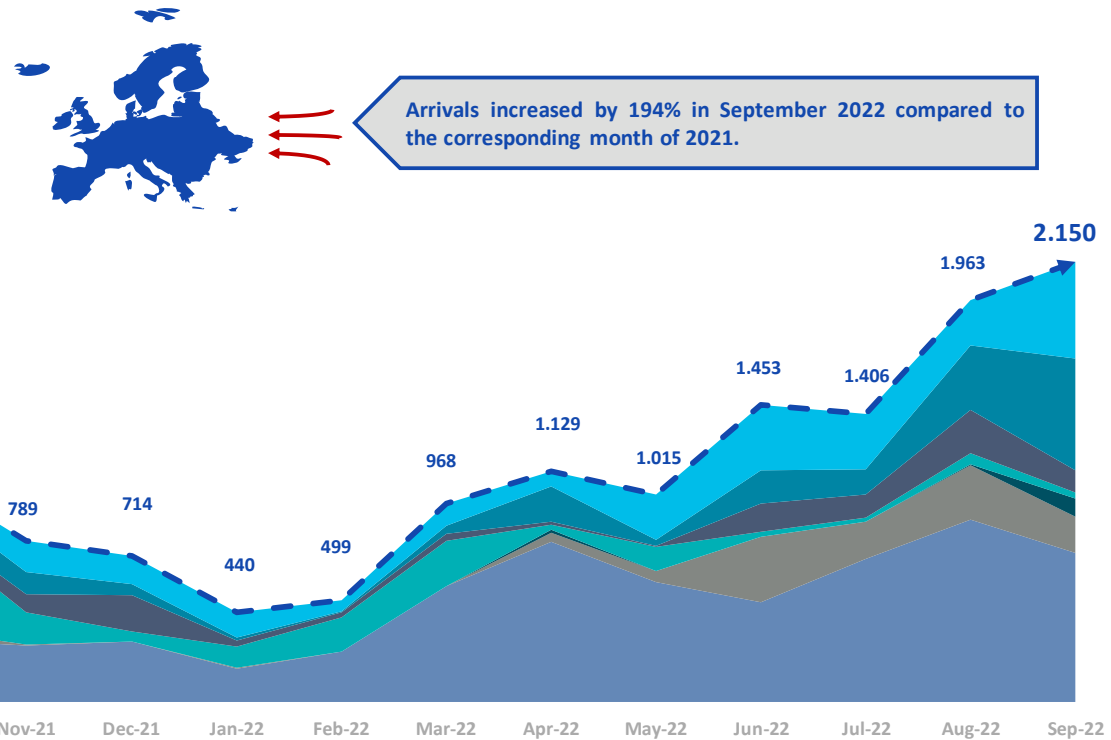


Chart 1. Arrivals September 2021 – September 2022 (12 months) – See Appendix Table 1

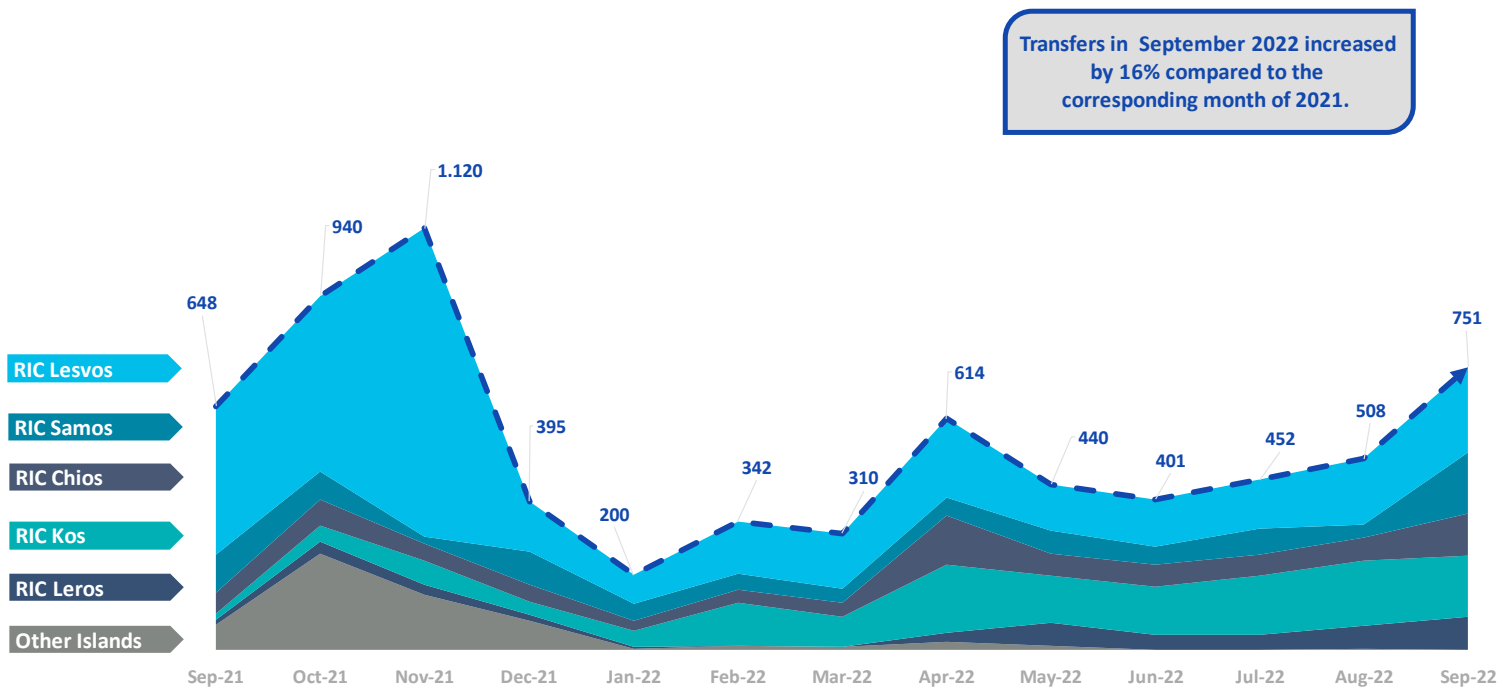


Chart 2. Transfers to the Mainland September 2021 – September 2022 (12 months) - See Appendix Table 2

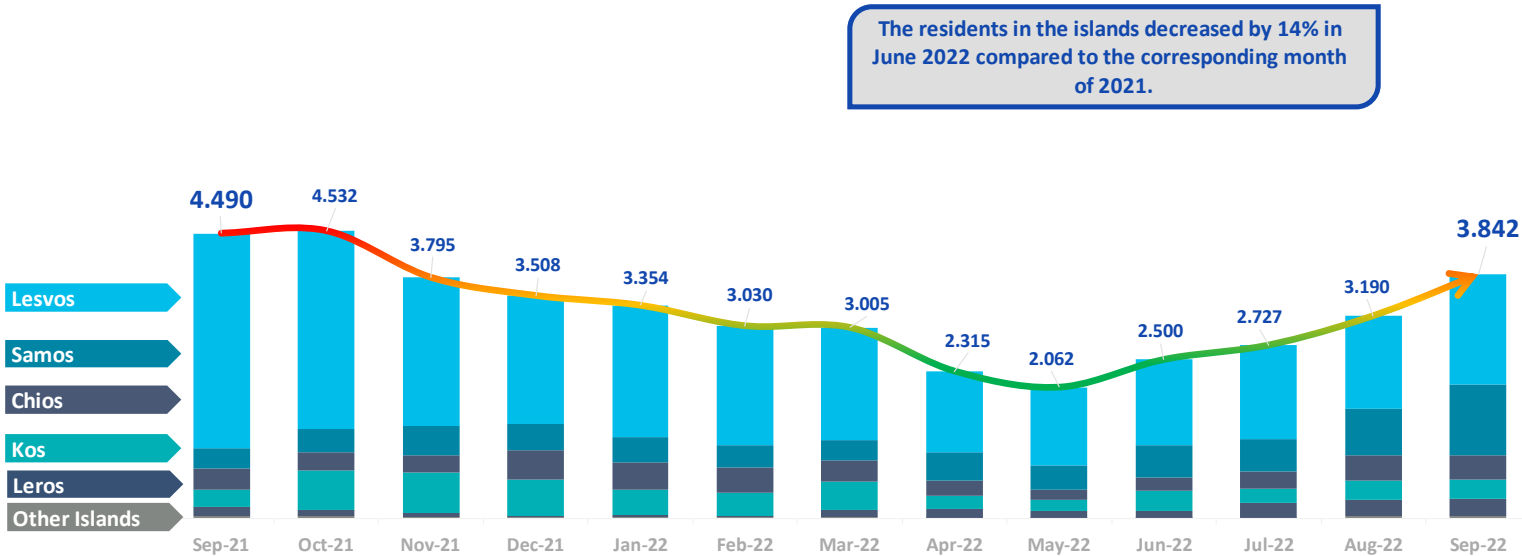


Chart 3. Island Residents in total September 2021 - September 2022 (12 months) - See Appendix Table 3

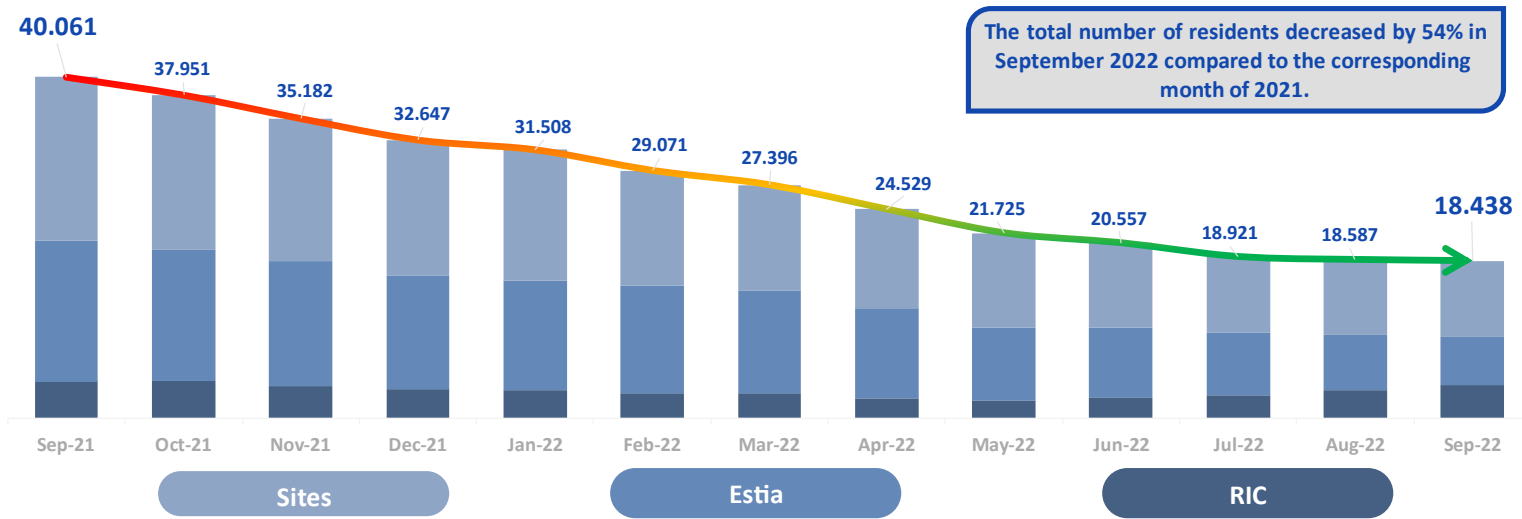
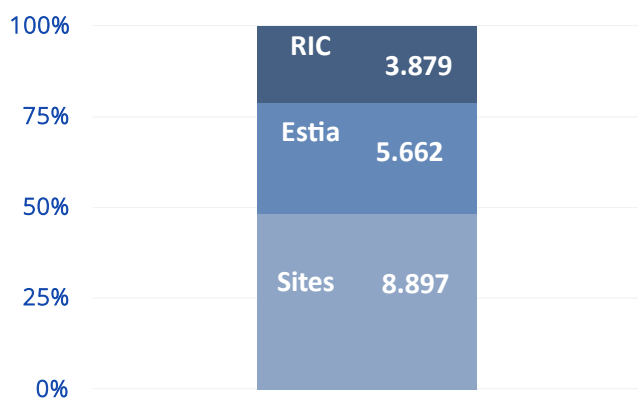
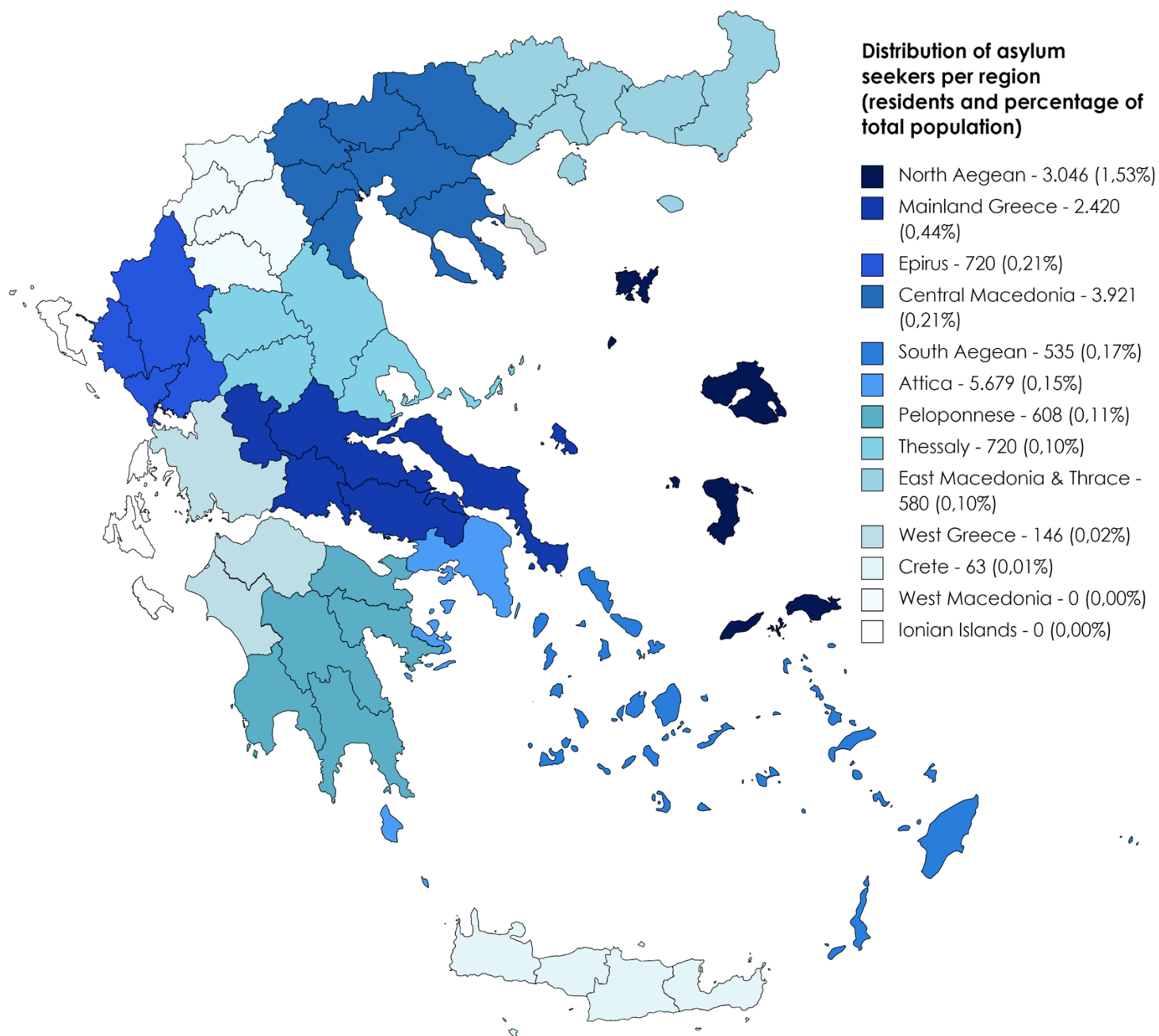


Chart 4. Progress of Residents through time – See Appendix Table 6



The goal of the Government is the equal and fair distribution (1%) of asylum seekers in all the regions of the country, with the exception of the first reception points. There was a general decrease in the number of residents in most regions by 54% (from 40.061 to 18.438) during the last 12 months.

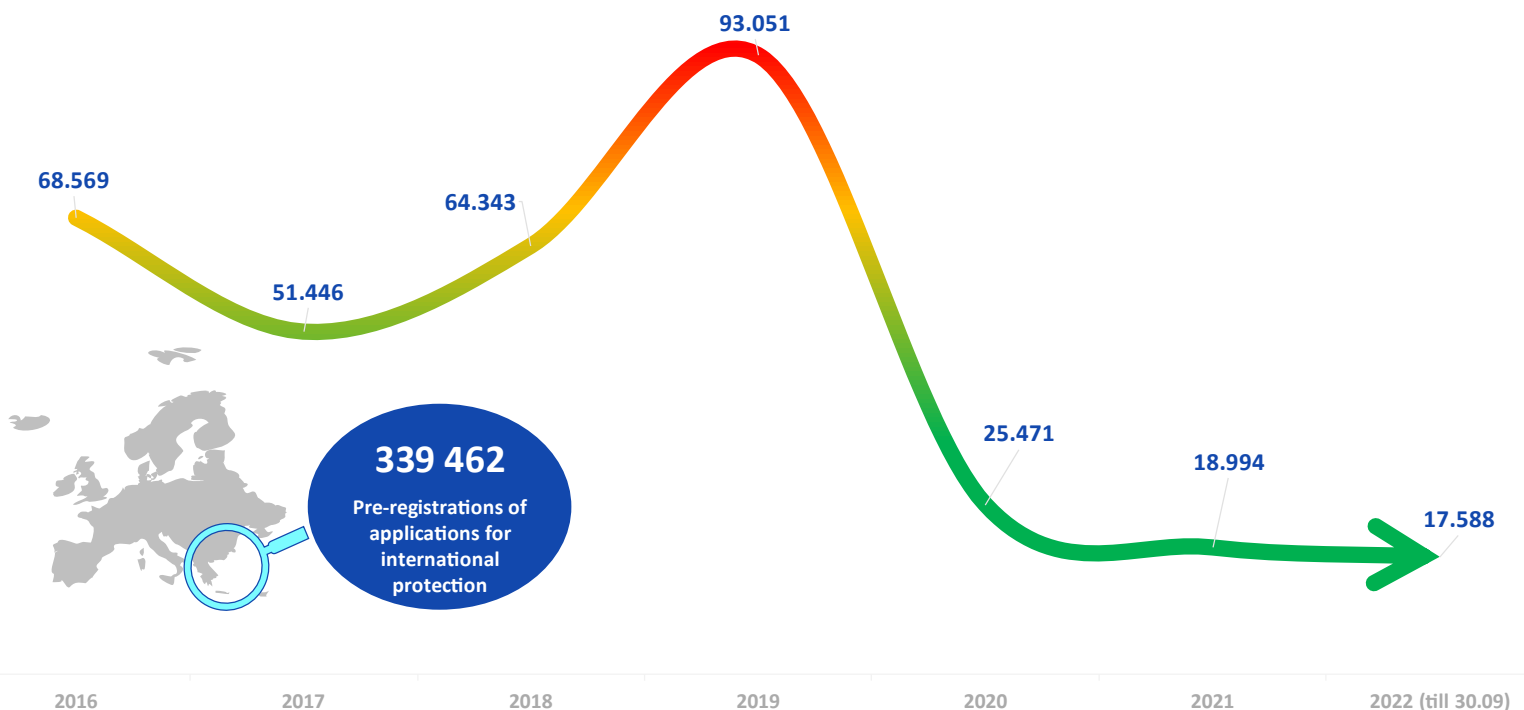

5b. Pre-Registrations of applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region

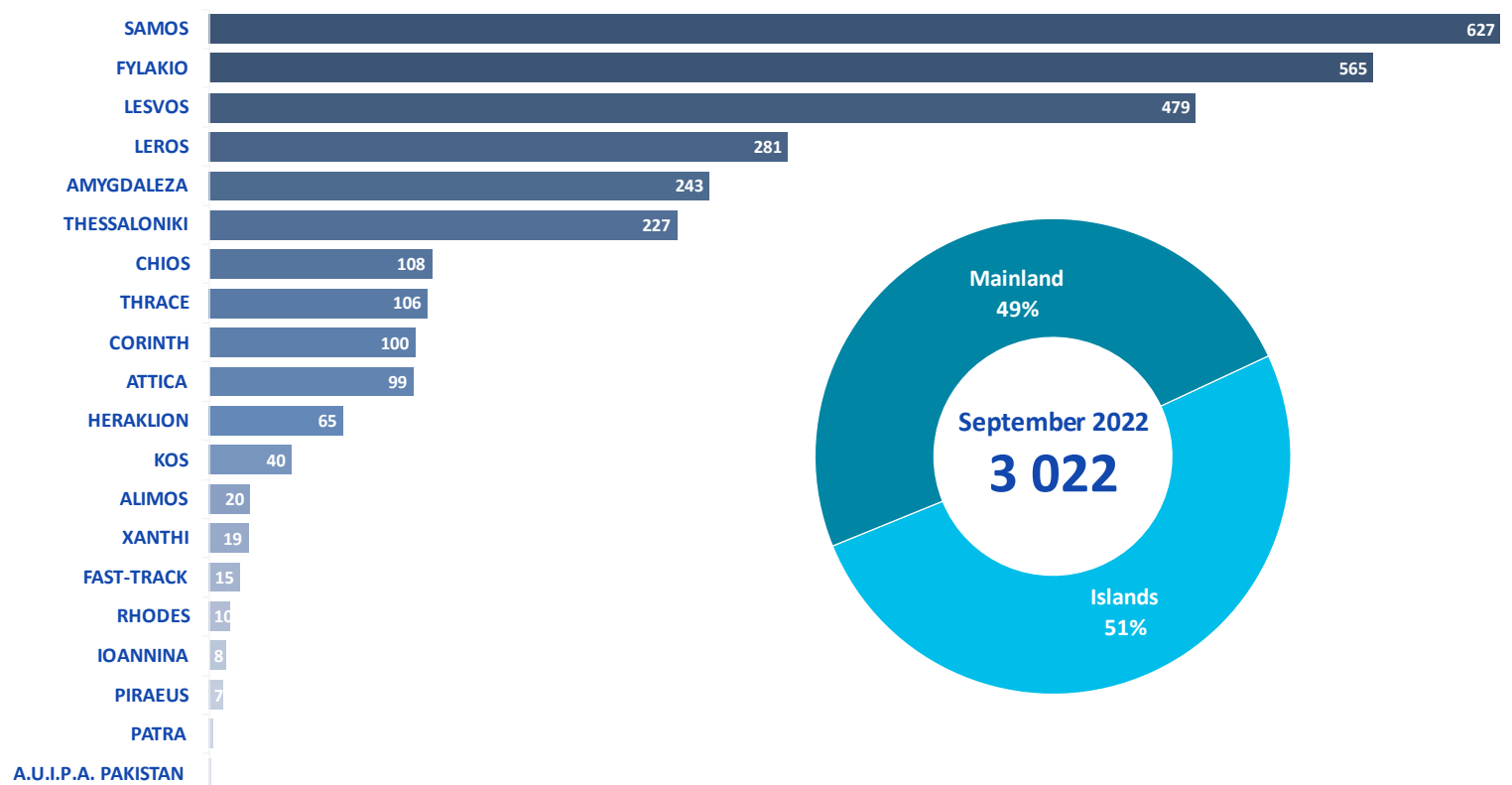


Chart 7. Pre-Registrations of applications per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the reference month (September 2022) – See Appendix Table 7b

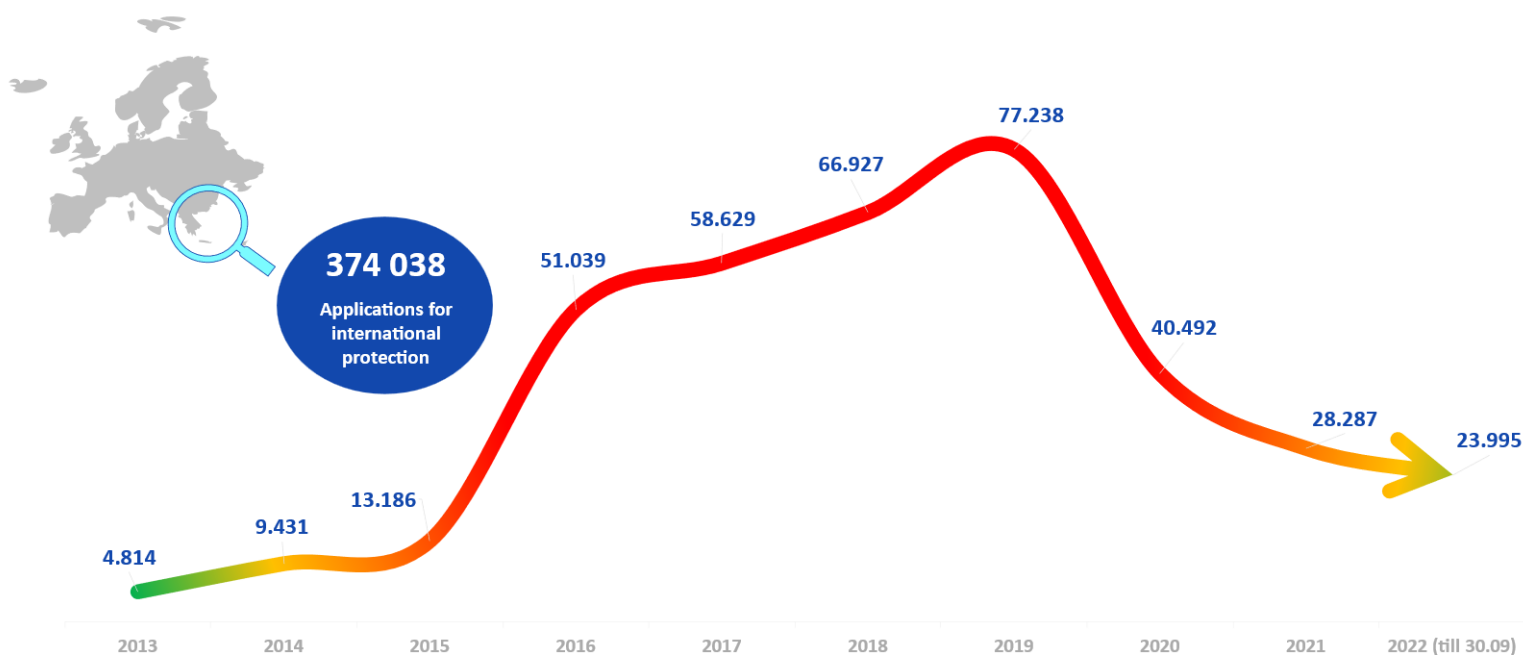


Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2022 applications are calculated till the month of reference (September) - See Appendix Table 8a

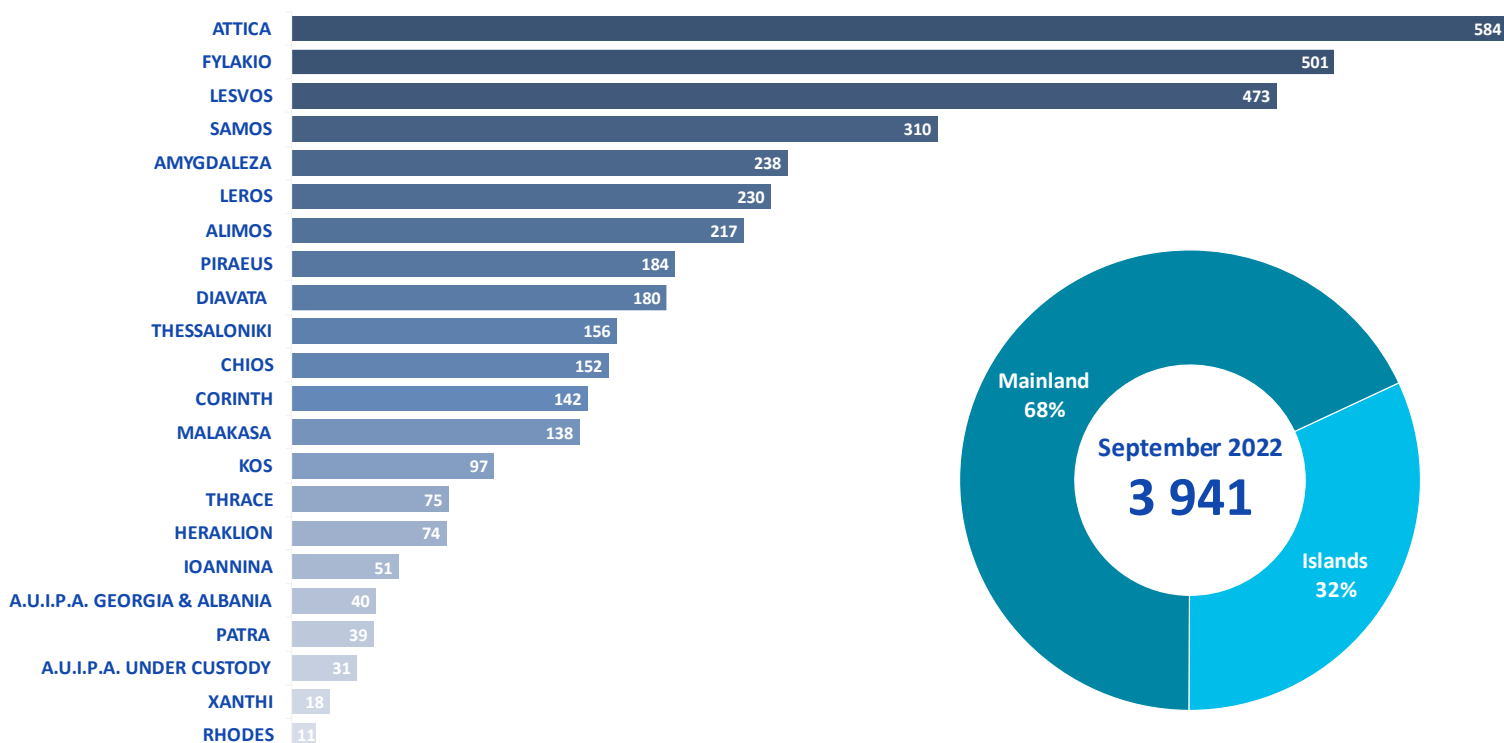
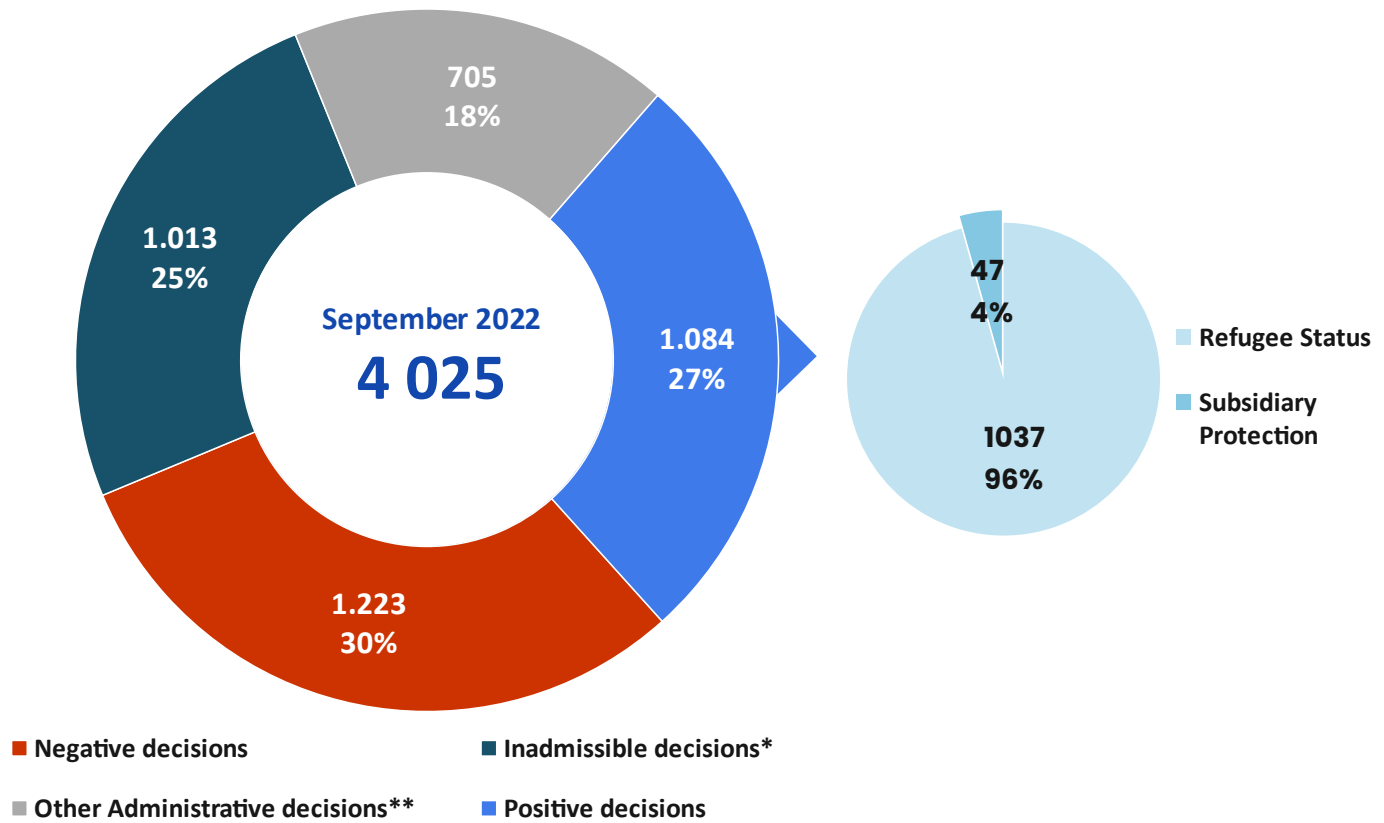


Chart 9. Applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region for the month of reference (September 2022) - See Appendix Table 8b

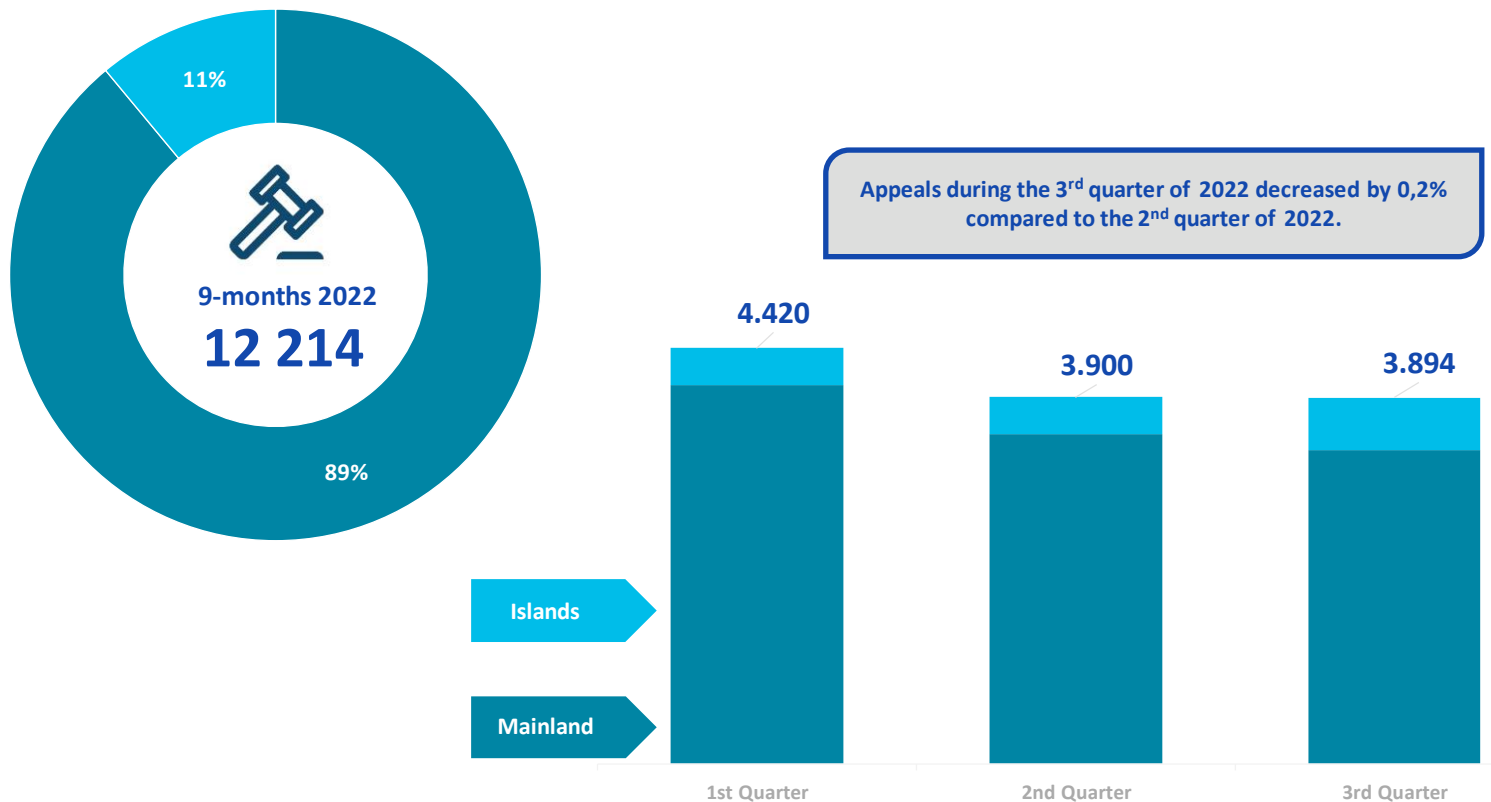


Chart 11. Appeals that have been lodged the 9-months of 2022 per location and quarter – See Appendix Table 10

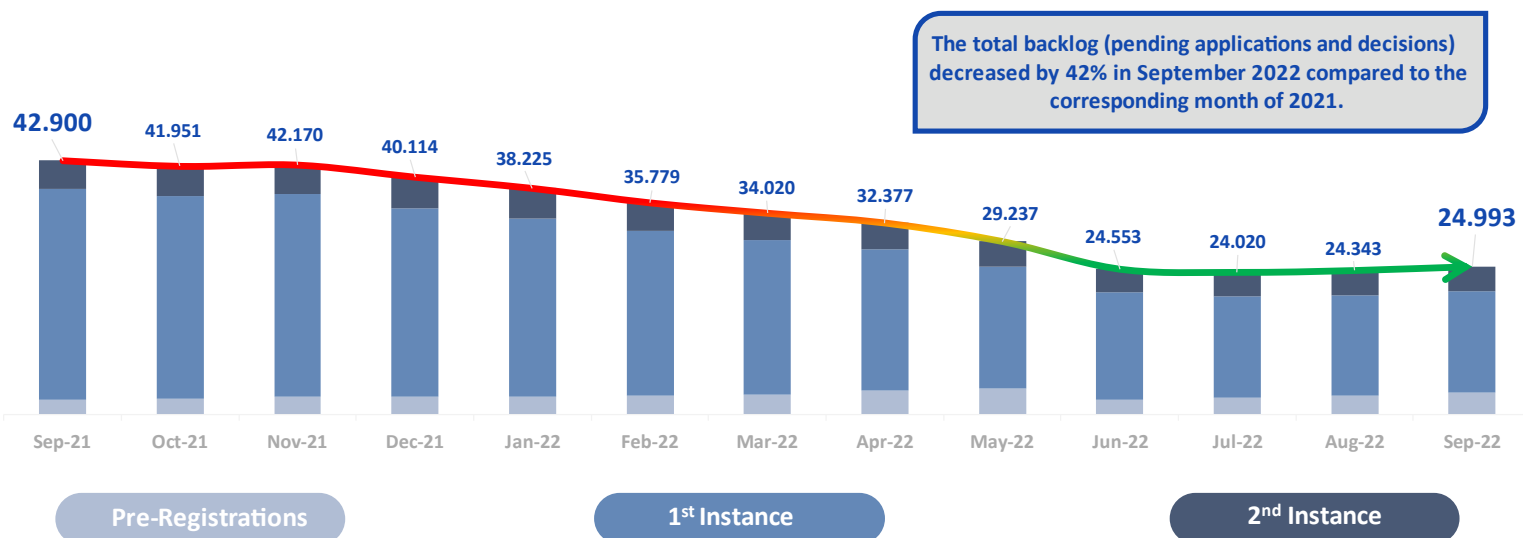

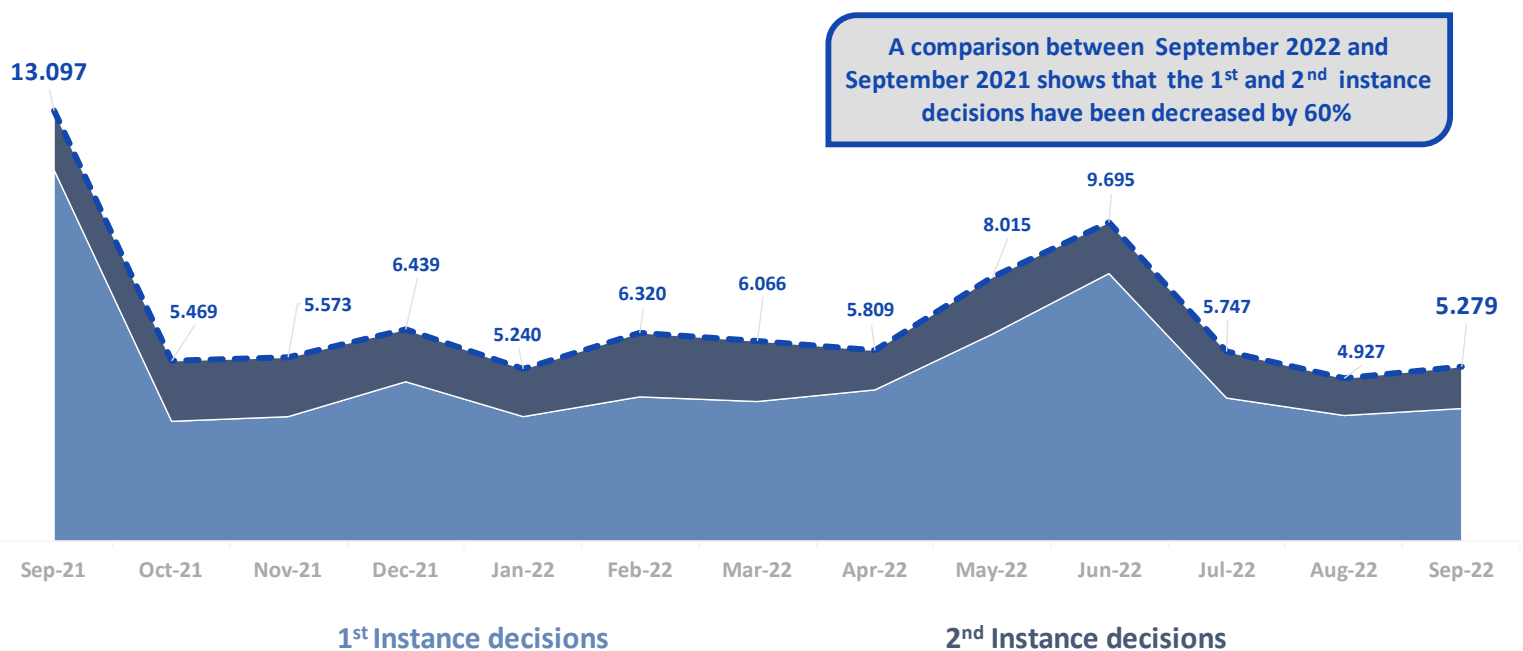


Chart 13. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance per month - See Appendix Table 11a

- The average time for a 2nd Instance decision to be issued is 90 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 52 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The number of appellants who applied and benefited from free legal aid is 6,680 (2,395 in the 1st Quarter, 2,022 in the 2nd Quarter and 2,263 in the 3rd Quarter).
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (4,116 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed in 2021 and 2022 or are scheduled to be discussed in 2023. Out of the total of 15,996 appeals that have been discussed in 2021, only 4 are pending while the remaining 4,112 pending appeals consists of cases that were discussed in the 1st 9-months of 2022 (2,634 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed till January 2023 (1,478 pending).

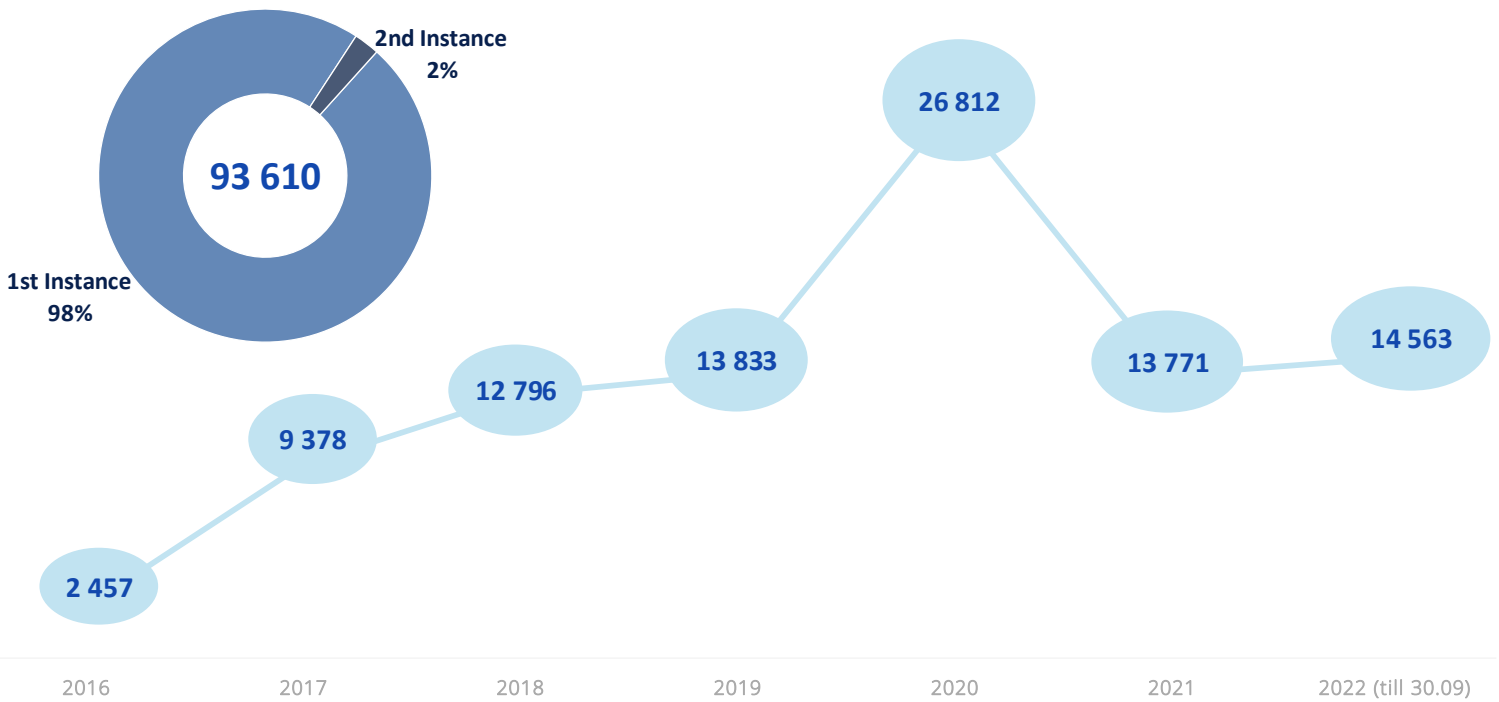

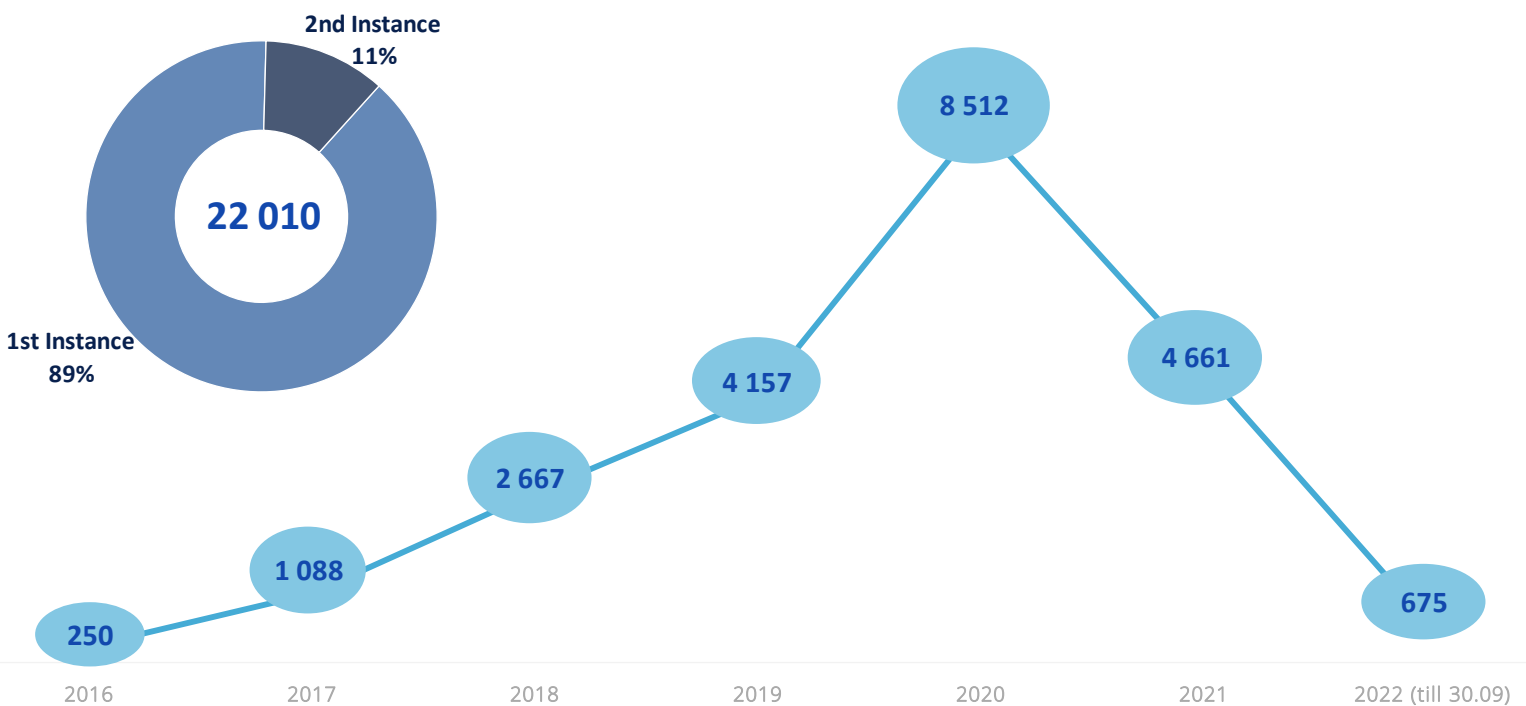

10c. Recognition Rate in 1st & 2nd Instance

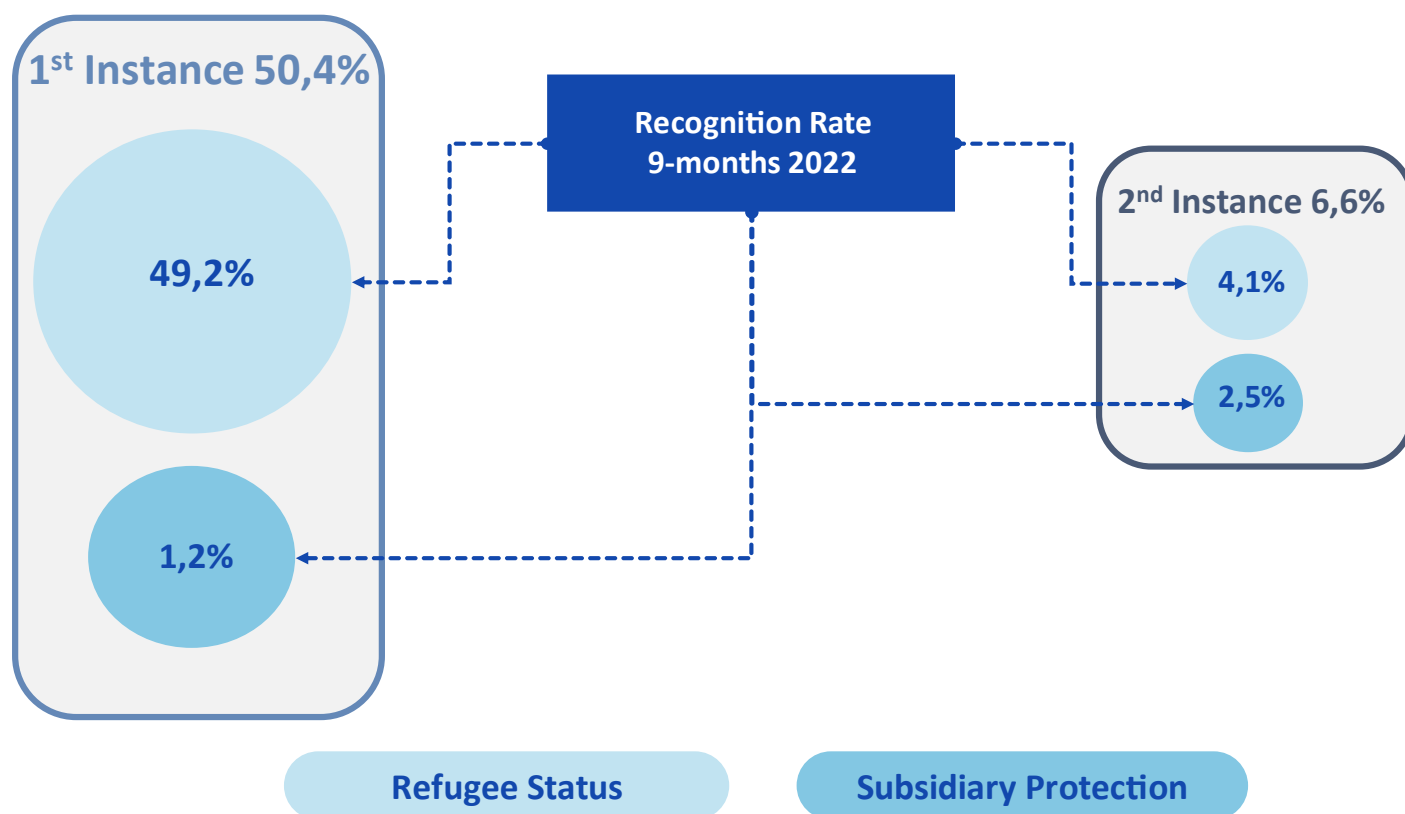


Chart 16. Recognition Rate in 1st & 2nd Instance. See Appendix Table 12c

11. Applications for annulment of 2nd Instance Decisions before the Administrative Court

The 42,2% of the total applications for annulment per year of lodging (5.103) are pending while for the rest of them (57,8%), a decision has been issued. 2,71% of the decisions had a positive outcome and 97,29% were rejected.

From the total of 2.949 decisions regarding applications for annulment (per year of decision) 32% have been issued in 2022.

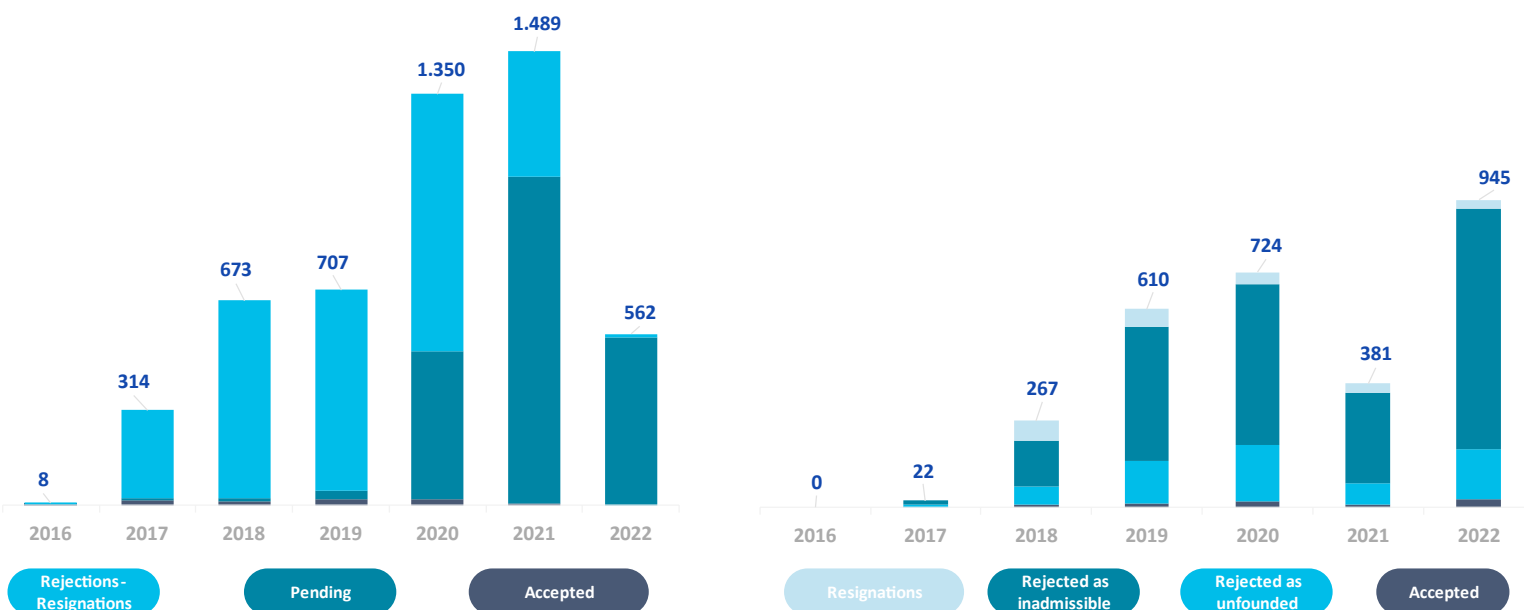

12. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/7/2019 until 30/9/2022 39.794 people have registered in the program, while 18.170 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house. It is worth noting that in September, 286 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 1/9/2022 till 30/9/2022). At the same time 8.147 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 9.132 people are attending job counseling sessions.

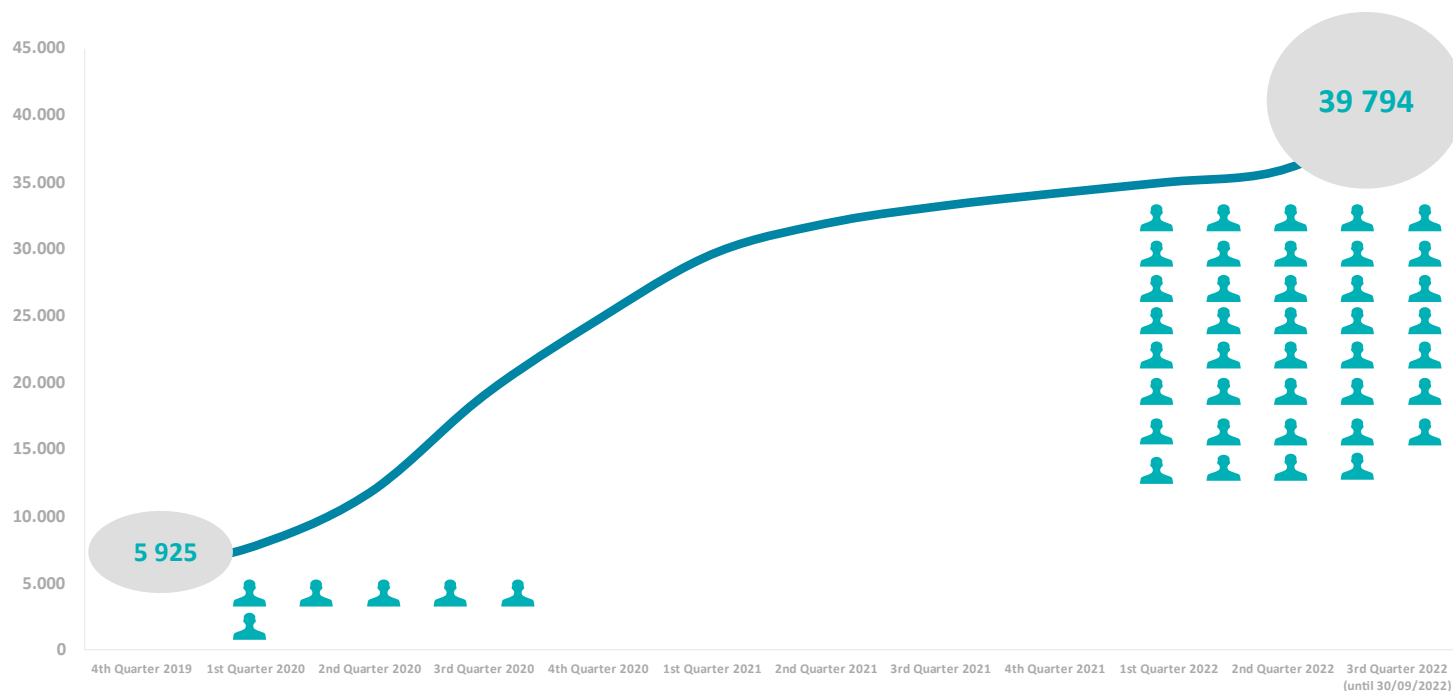


Chart 18. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 14

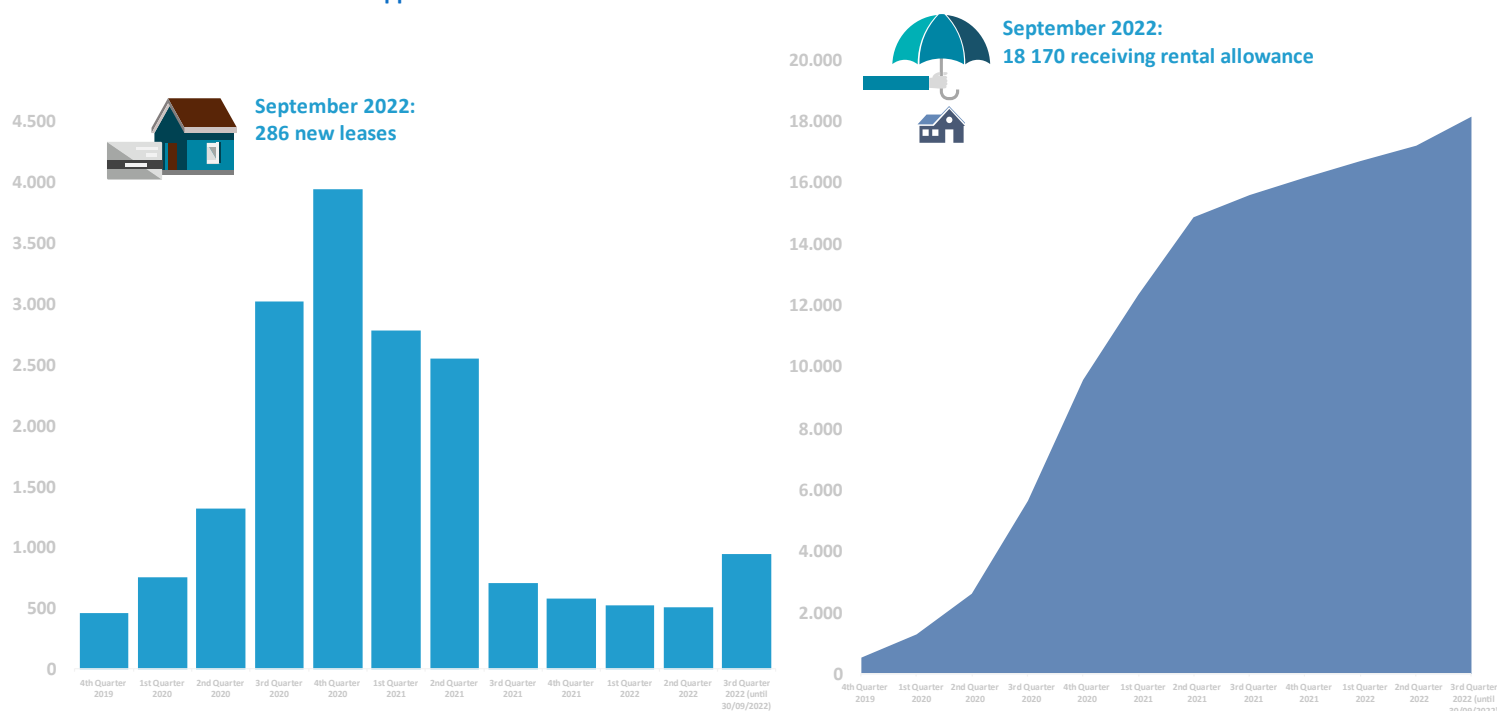


Chart 19. New leases (left), Receiving rental allowance (Right) - See Appendix Table 15 and 16

13. Returns - Departures

In September 2022 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 235 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 291 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 114 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 109 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 11 minors left with the relocation program of unaccompanied minors.
- 27 people seeking International Protection were transferred to Italy in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- Returns under the EU - Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures, from 01/06 the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 787 people left the country in September, while 2.150 arrived.

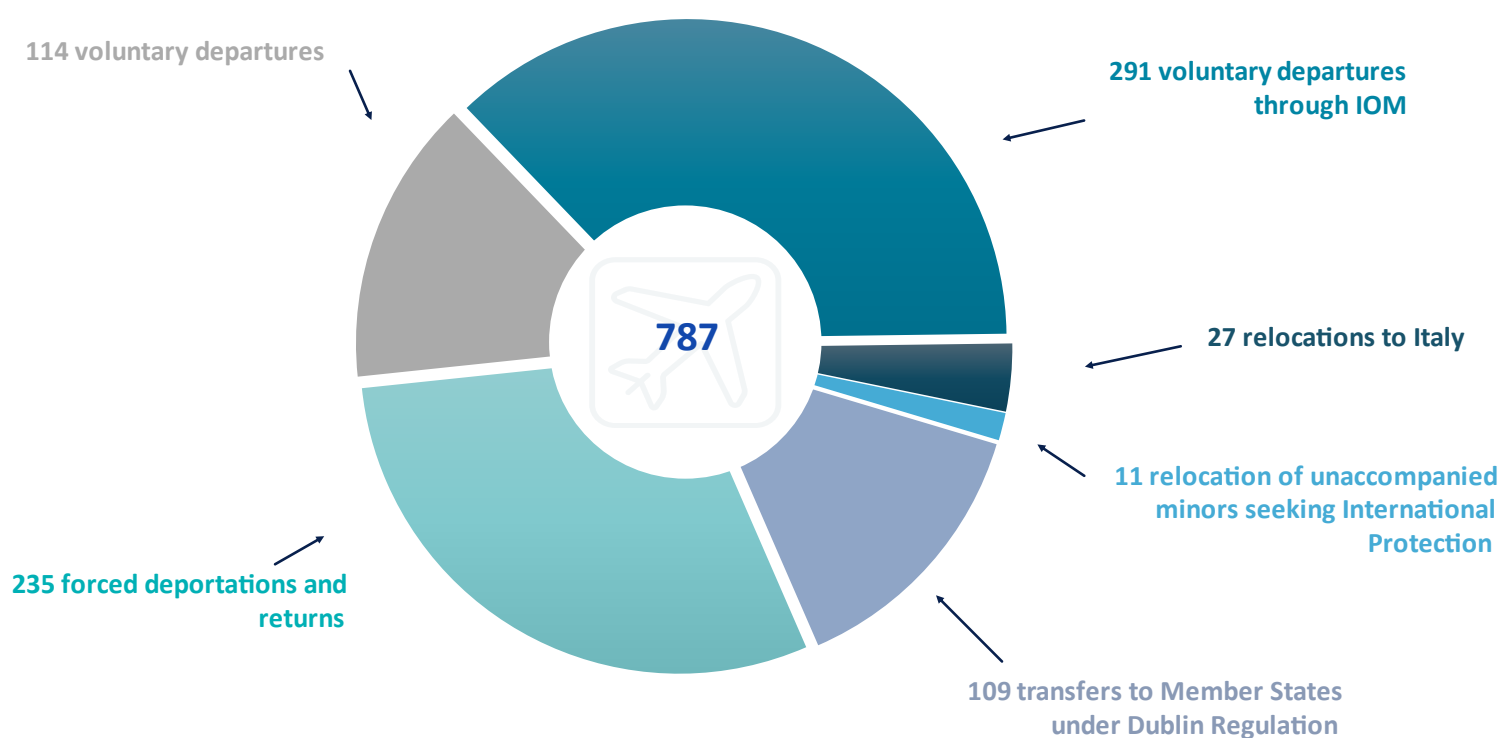


Chart 20. Returns-Departures – See Appendix Table 17

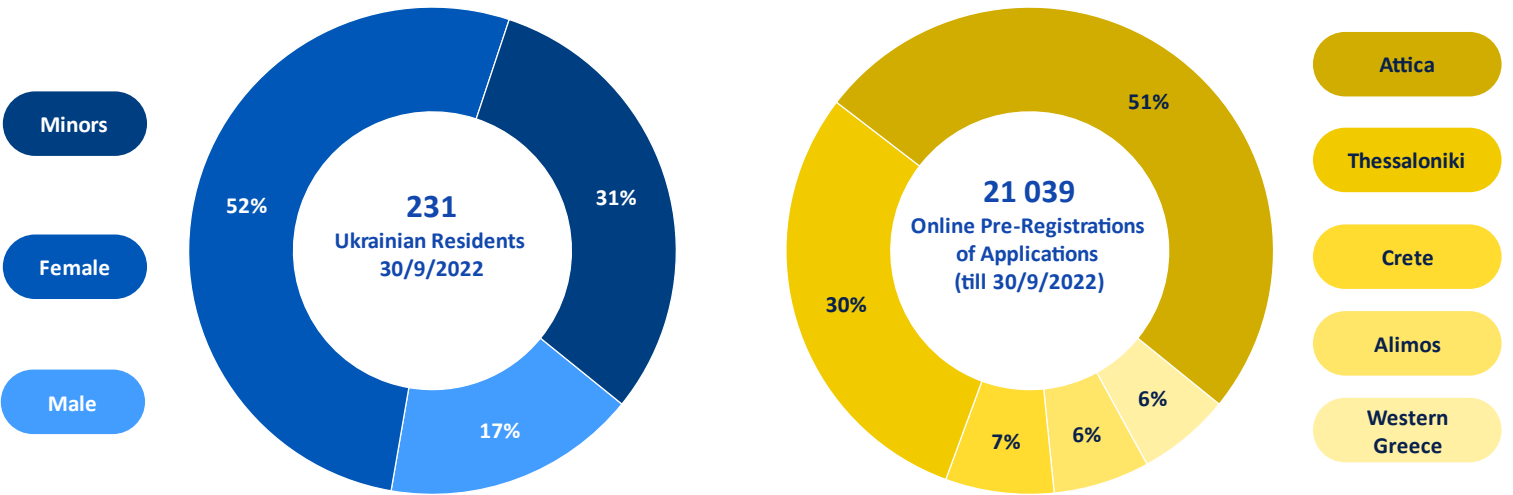


Chart 21. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (September 2022) - See Appendix Table 18 & 19

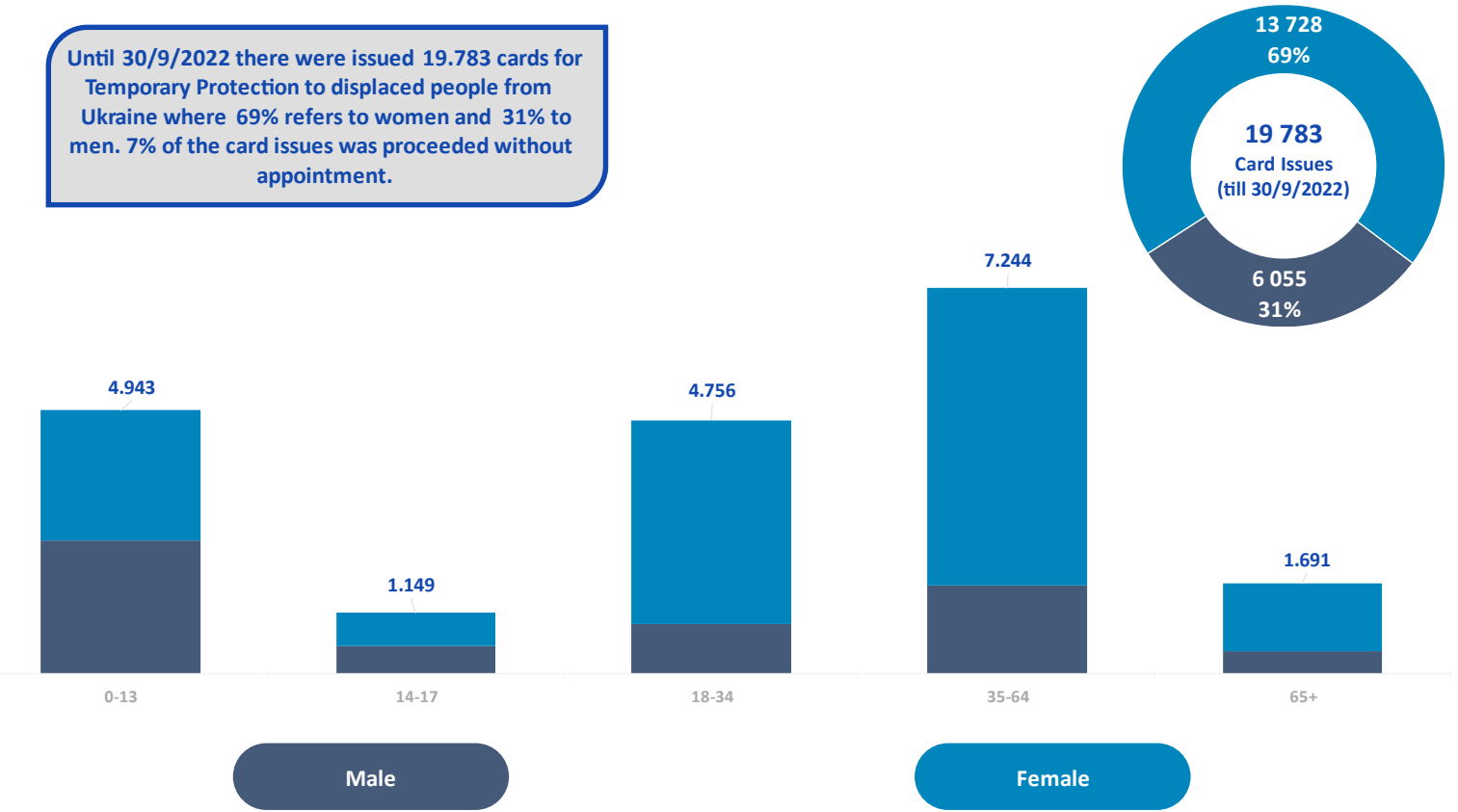


Chart 22. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (September 2022) - See Appendix Table 20
