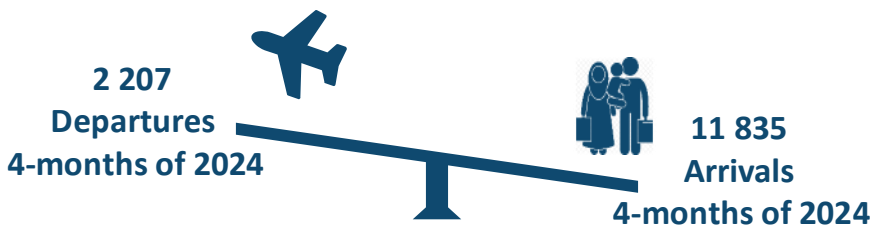
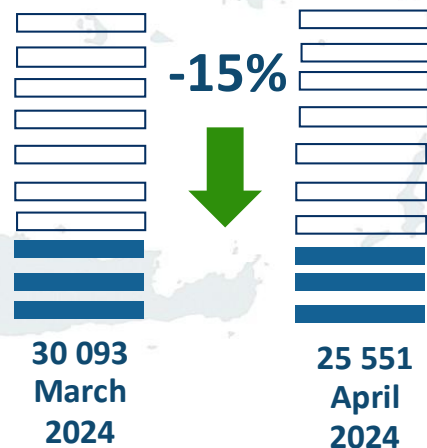
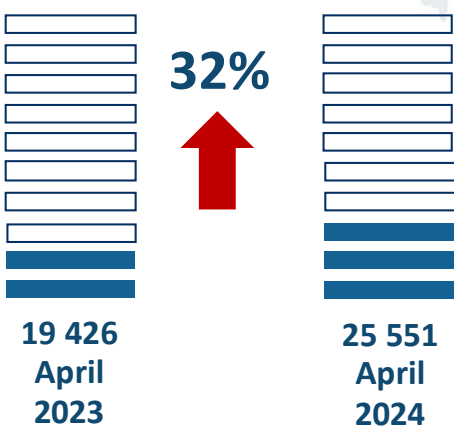

1. Migration flows in islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros

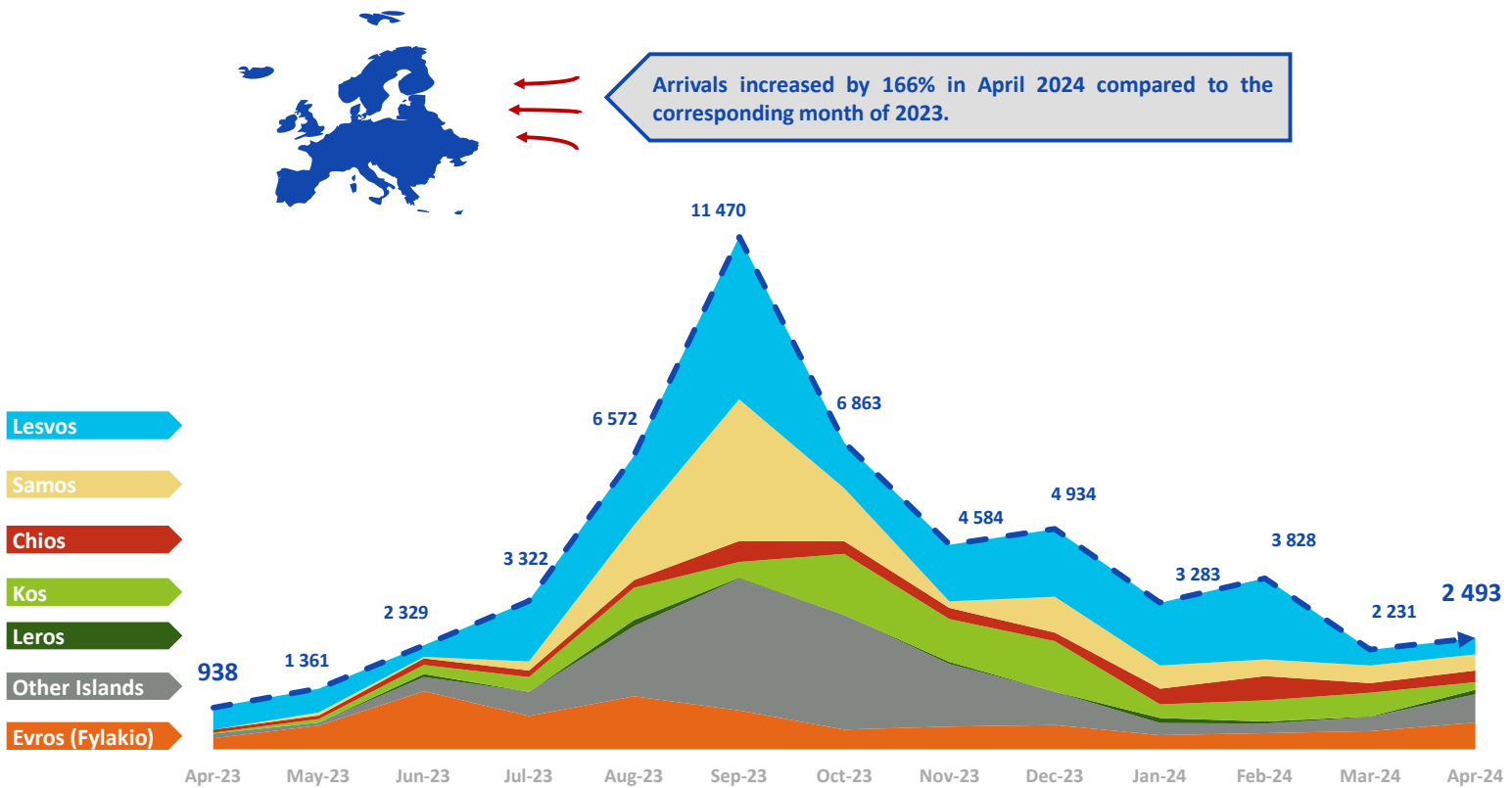


Chart 1. Migration flows (islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros) April 2023 – April 2024 – See Appendix Table 1

2. Transfers of asylum seekers from the islands to the mainland

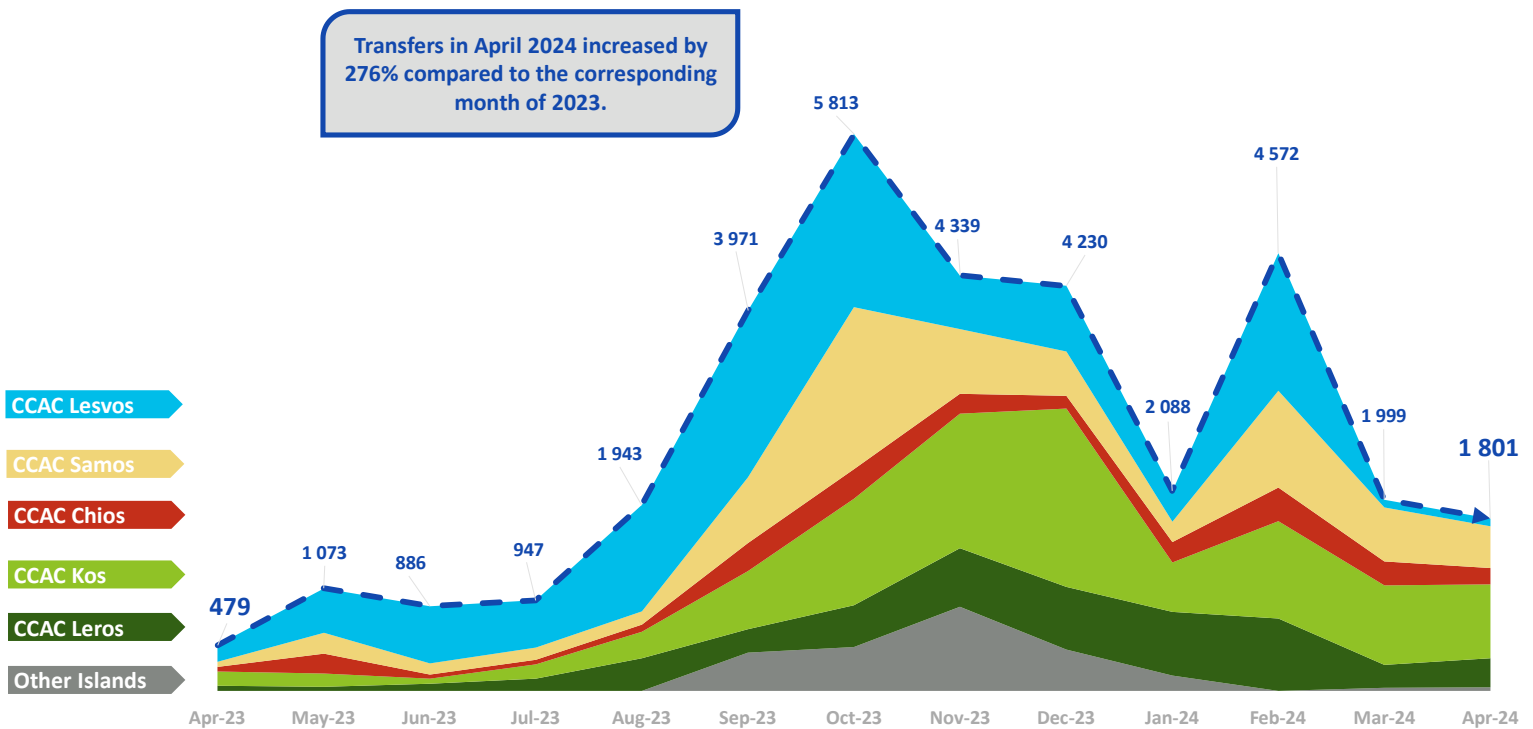


Chart 2. Transfers of asylum seekers from the islands to the mainland April 2023 – April 2024 - See Appendix Table 2

The residents in the islands increased by 95% in April 2024 compared to the corresponding month of 2023.

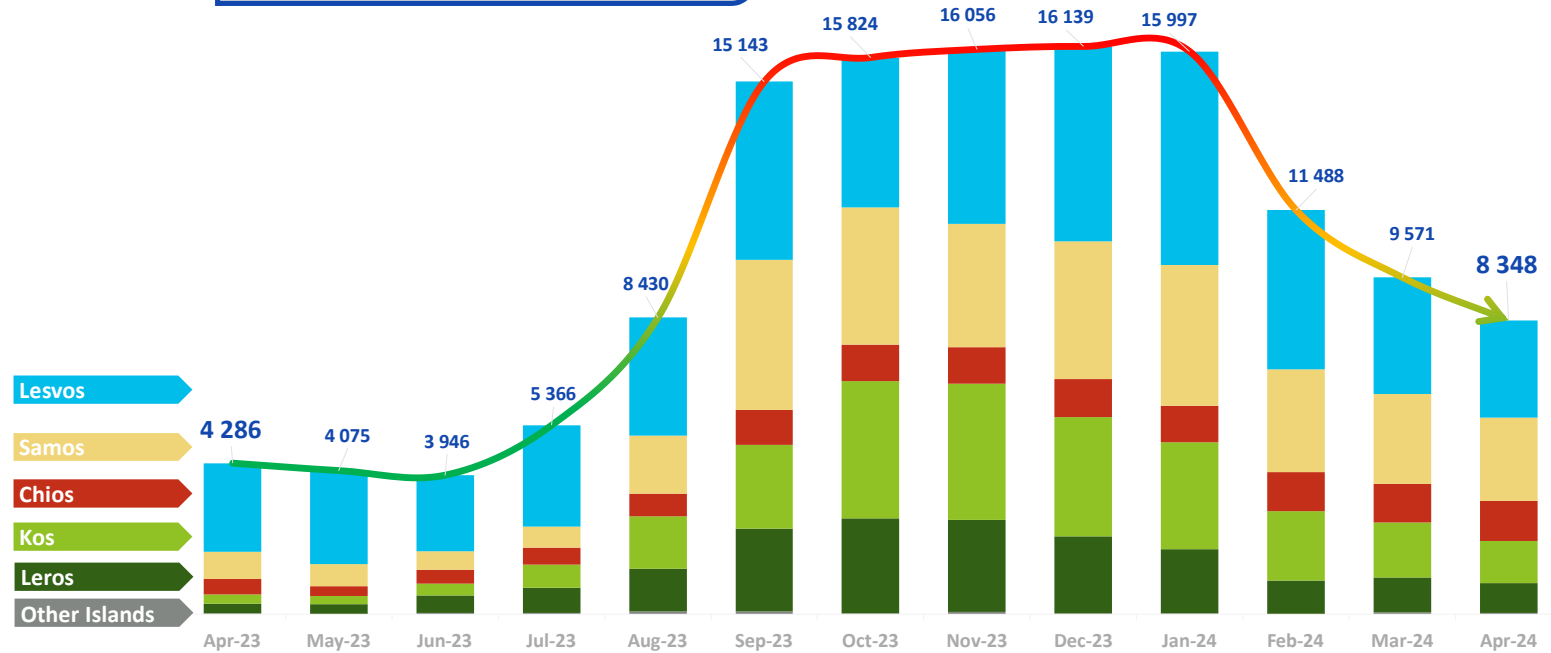


Chart 3. Island Residents in total April 2023 - April 2024 - See Appendix Table 3

The total number of residents increased by 70% in April 2024 compared to the corresponding month of 2023.

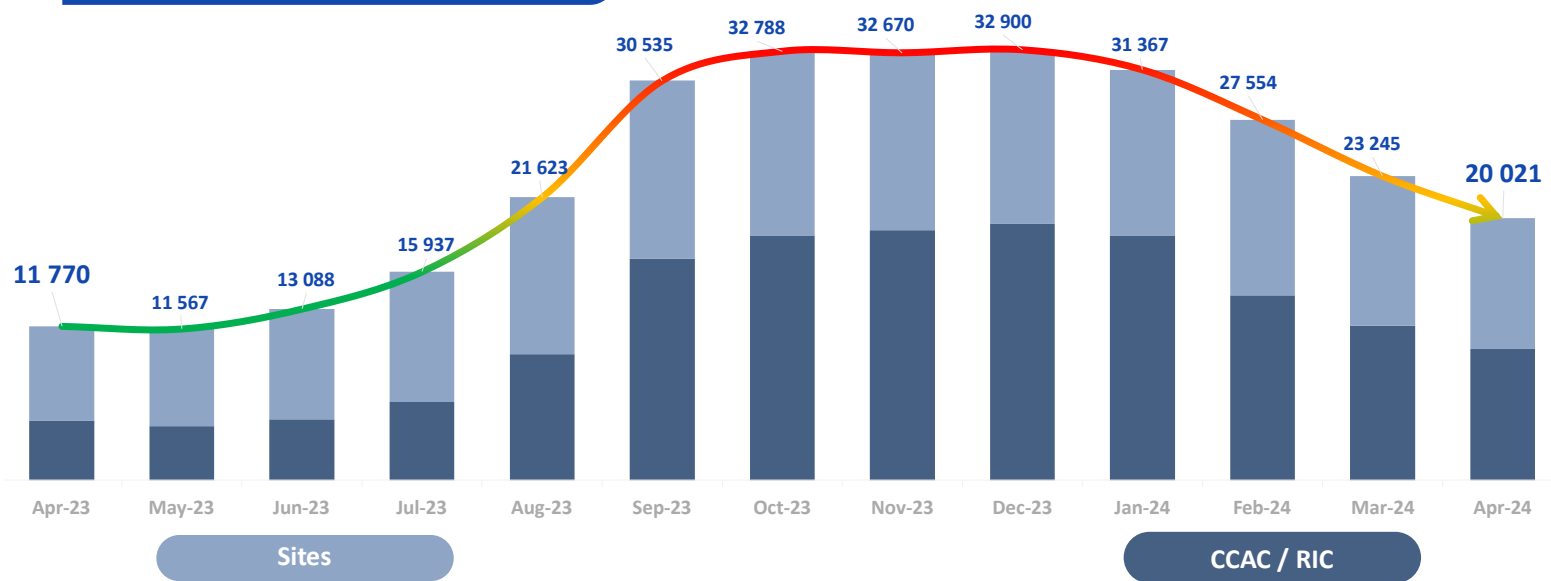
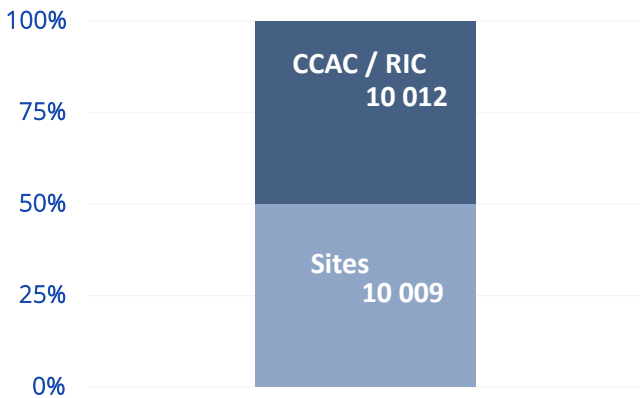
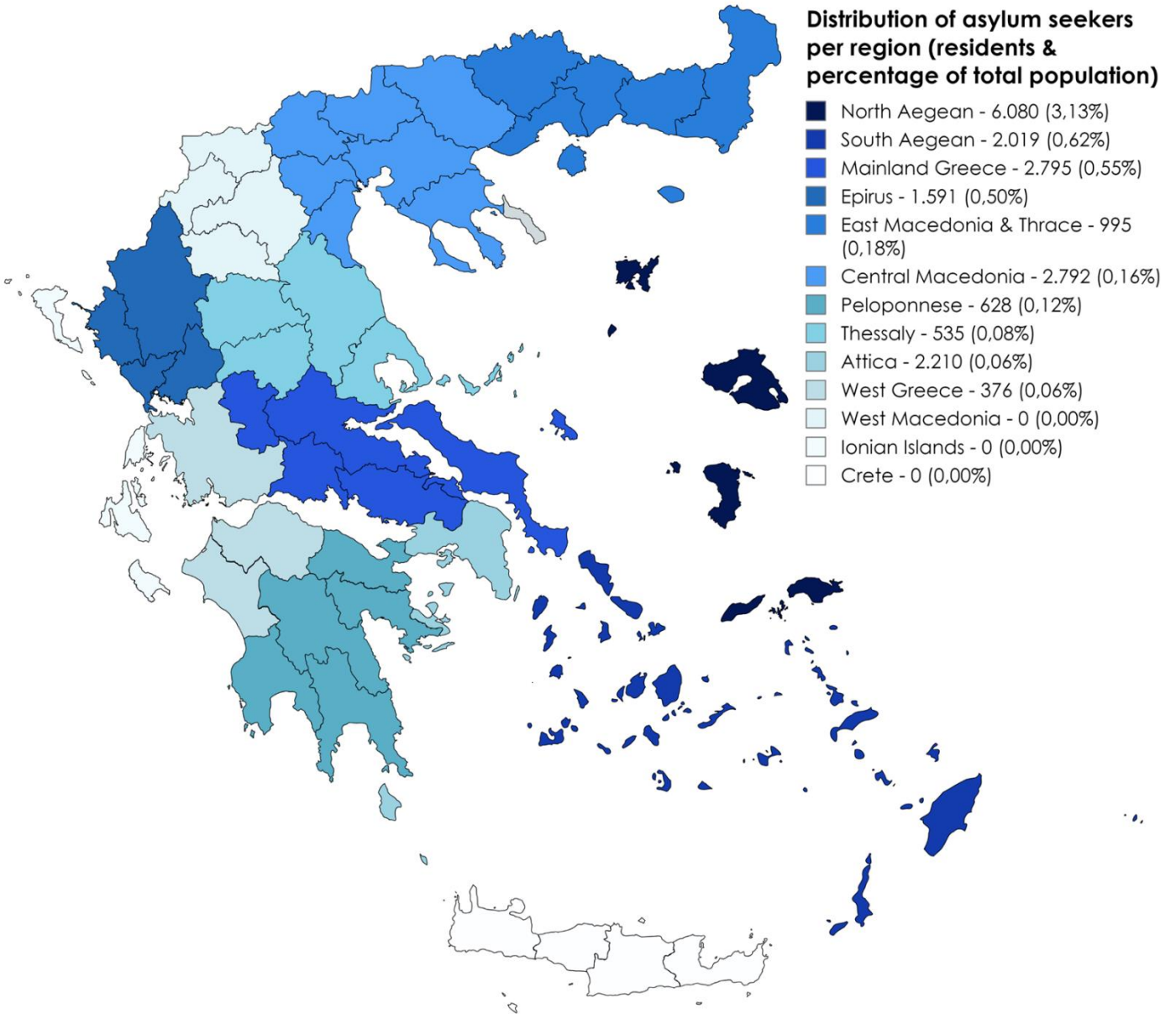


Chart 4. Progress of Residents through time – See Appendix Table 6

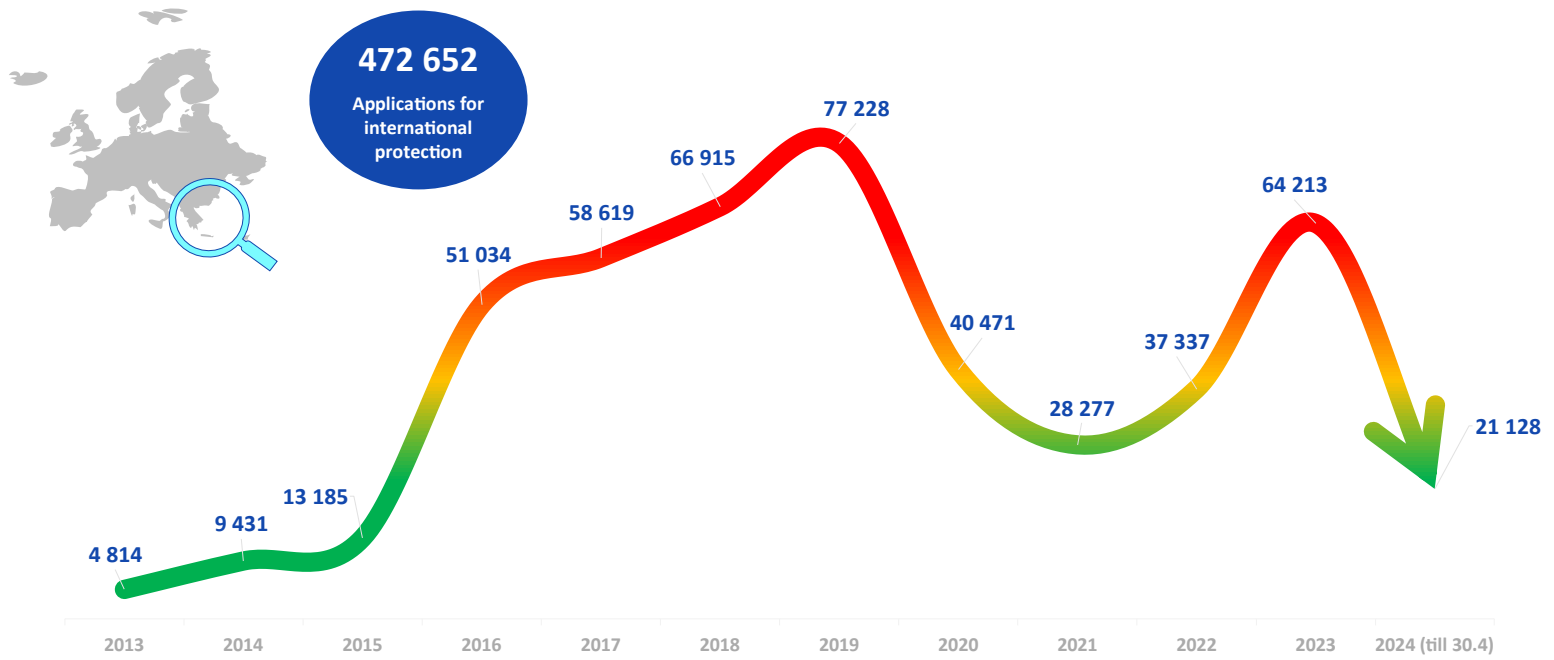


Chart 6. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2024 applications are calculated till the month of reference (April) - See Appendix Table 7a

5b. Applications for International Protection per Regional Office or Asylum Unit and per Region

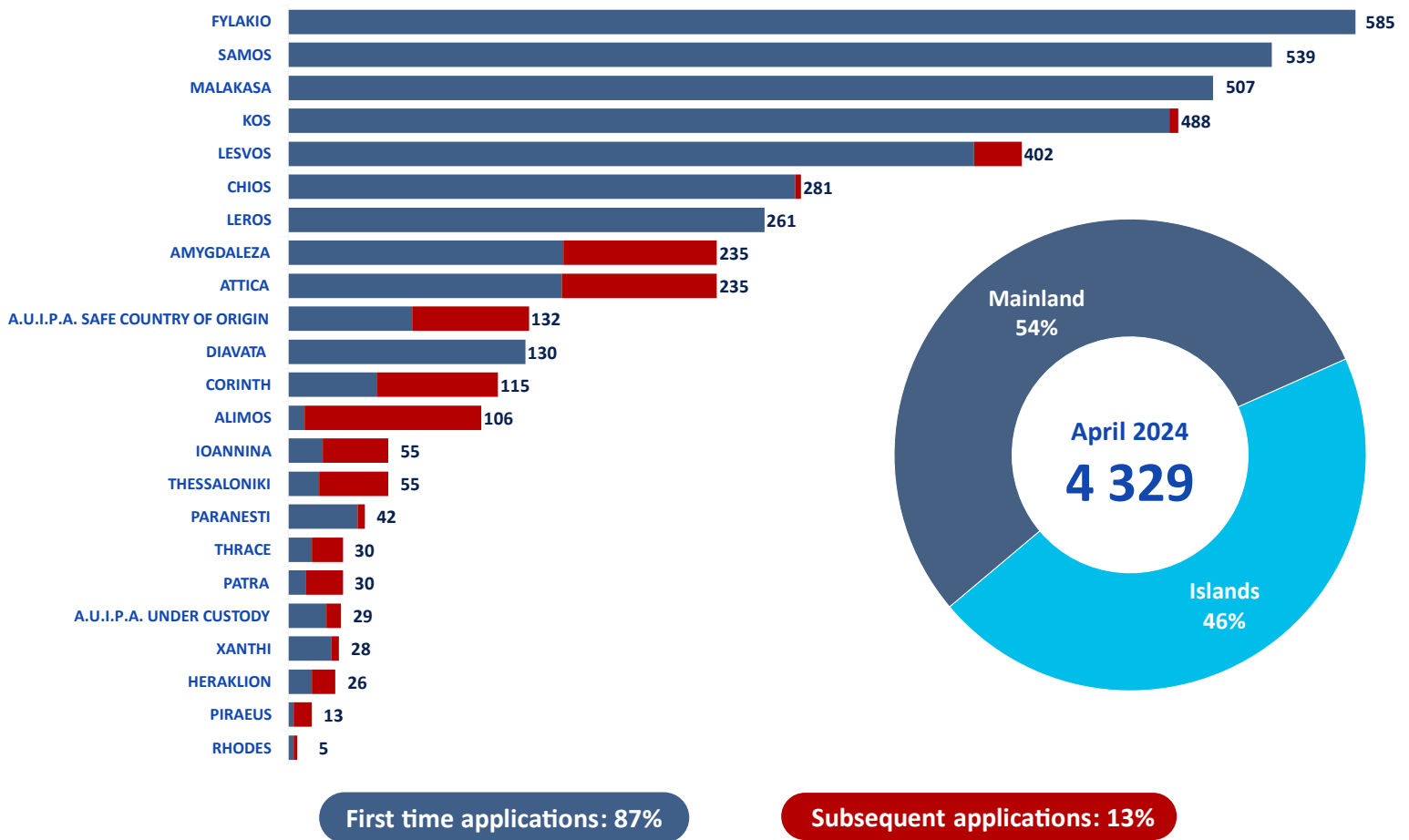

5c. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent

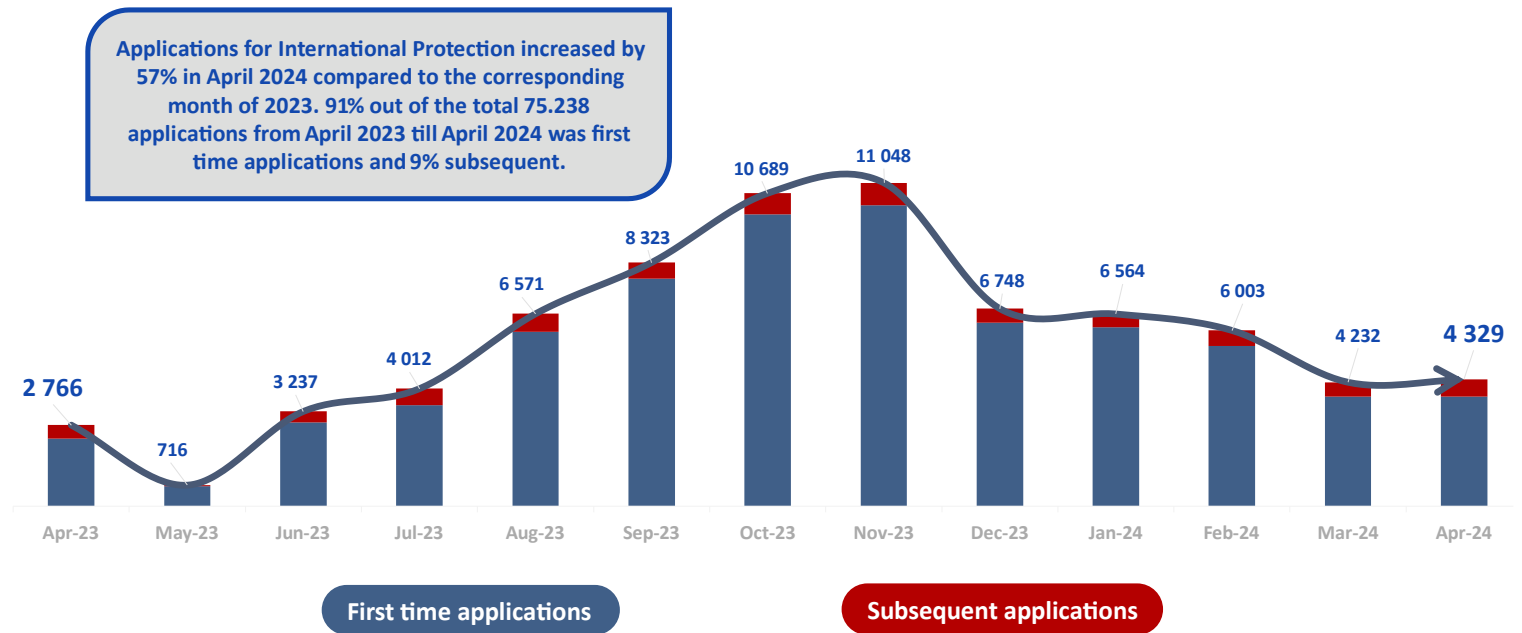


Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent (April 2023 - April 2024) - See Appendix Table 7c

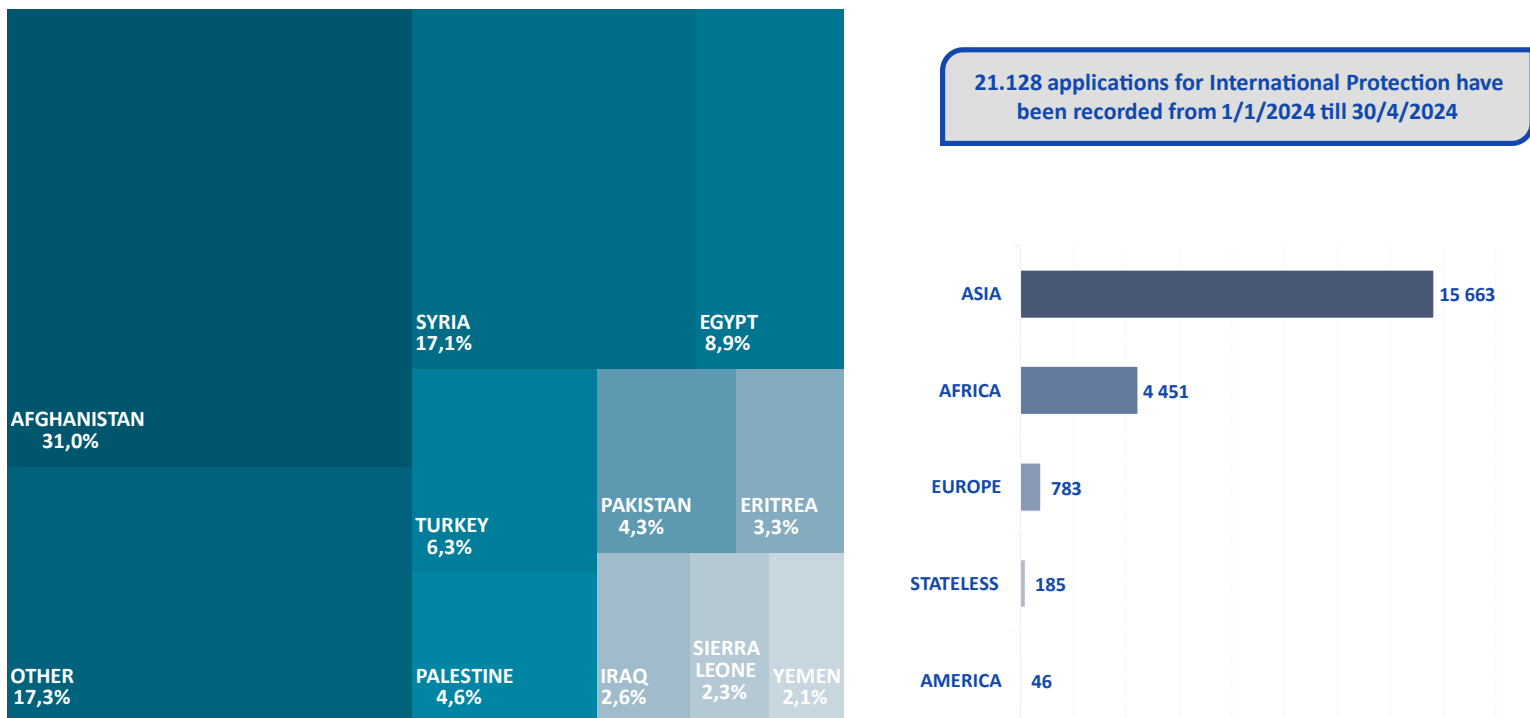


Chart 9. Applications for International Protection 4-months 2024 per Nationality (Top 10 Nationalities and distribution per continent) - See Appendix Table 7d

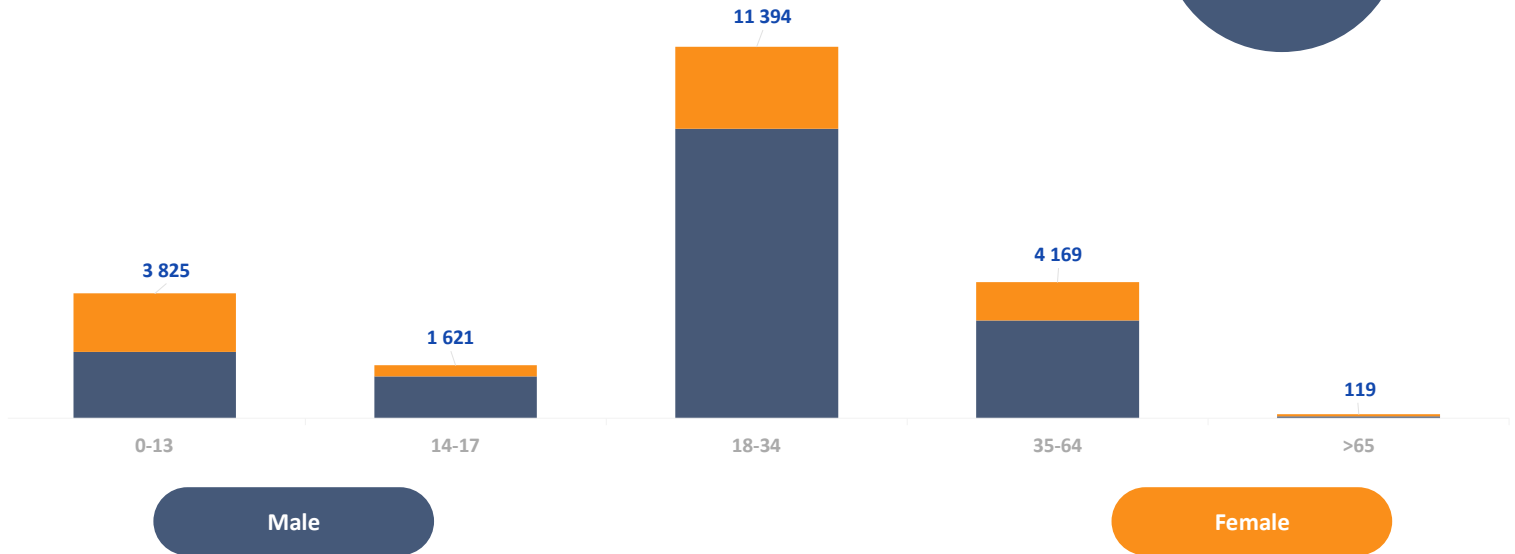
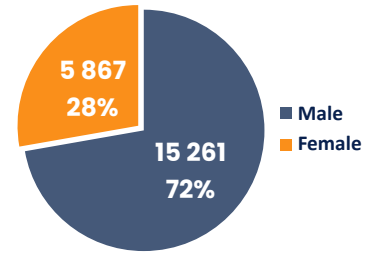


Chart 10. Applications for International Protection 4-months 2024 per gender and age group - See Appendix Table 7e

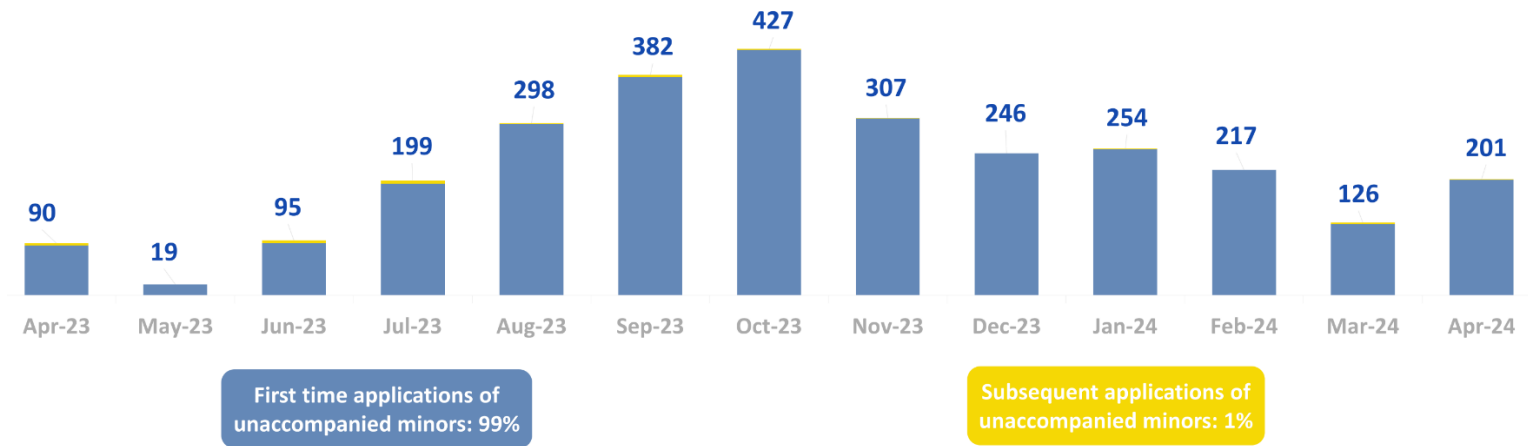
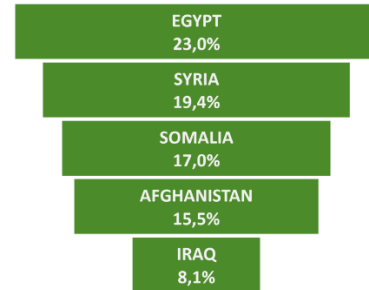
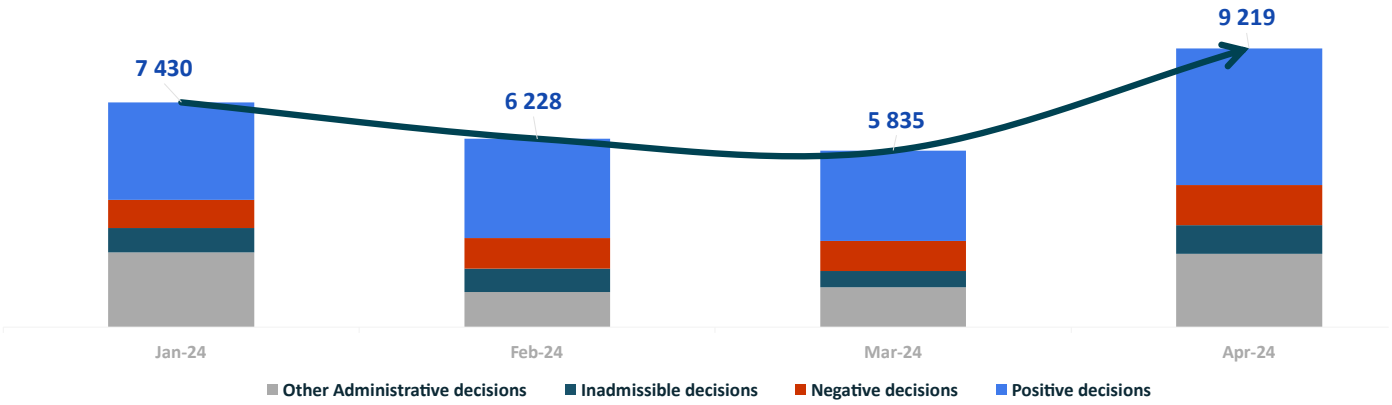
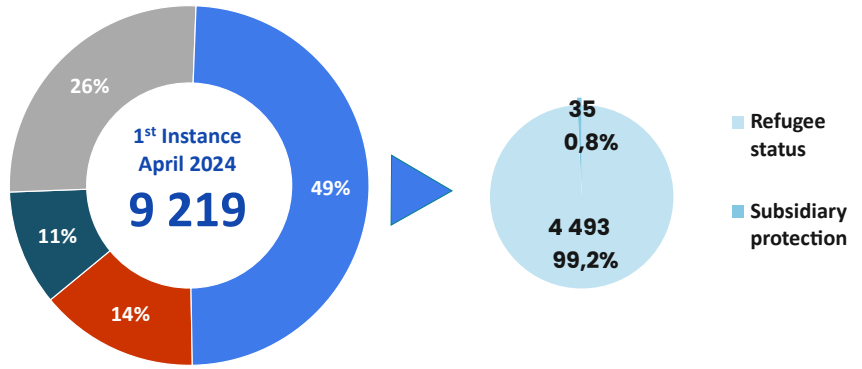

6a. Type of Decisions – 1st Instance

28.712 decisions have been issued in the 1st Instance from 1/1/2024 till 30/4/2024. 48,9% of them are positive, 25,5% negative and 25,6% refer to other administrative decisions.

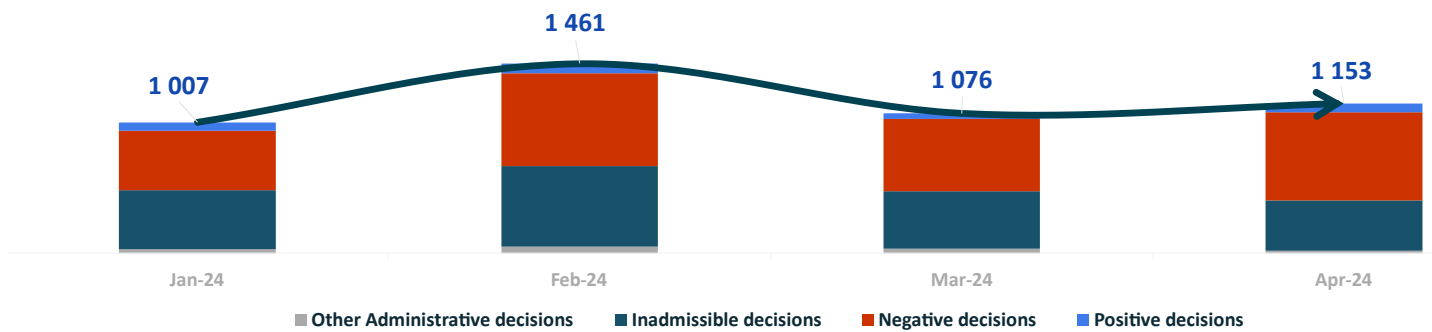
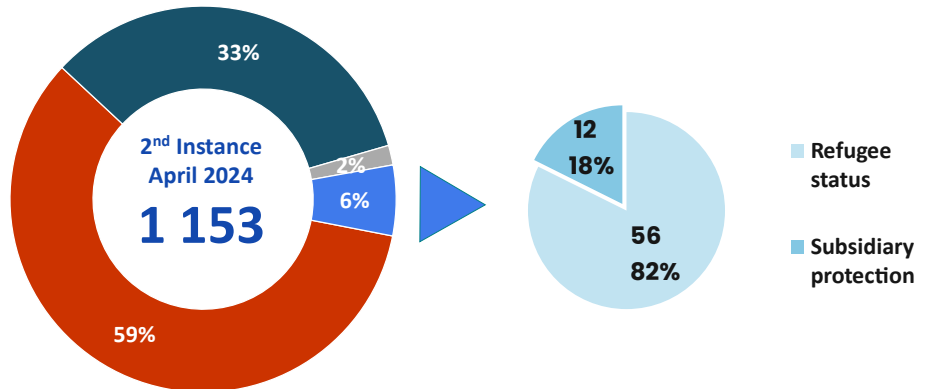


Chart 13. 2nd Instance Decisions per month and type for 2024 and for the month of reference (April 2024). - See Appendix Table 8b

Appeals in the 4-months of 2024 increased by 3% compared to the 4-months of 2023.

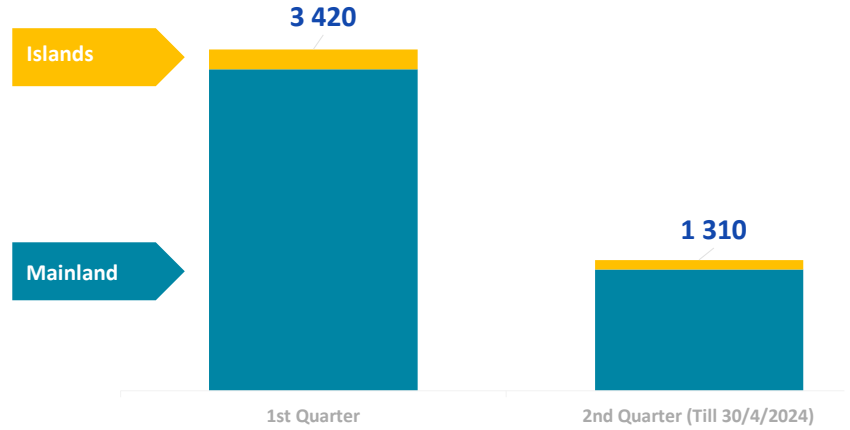
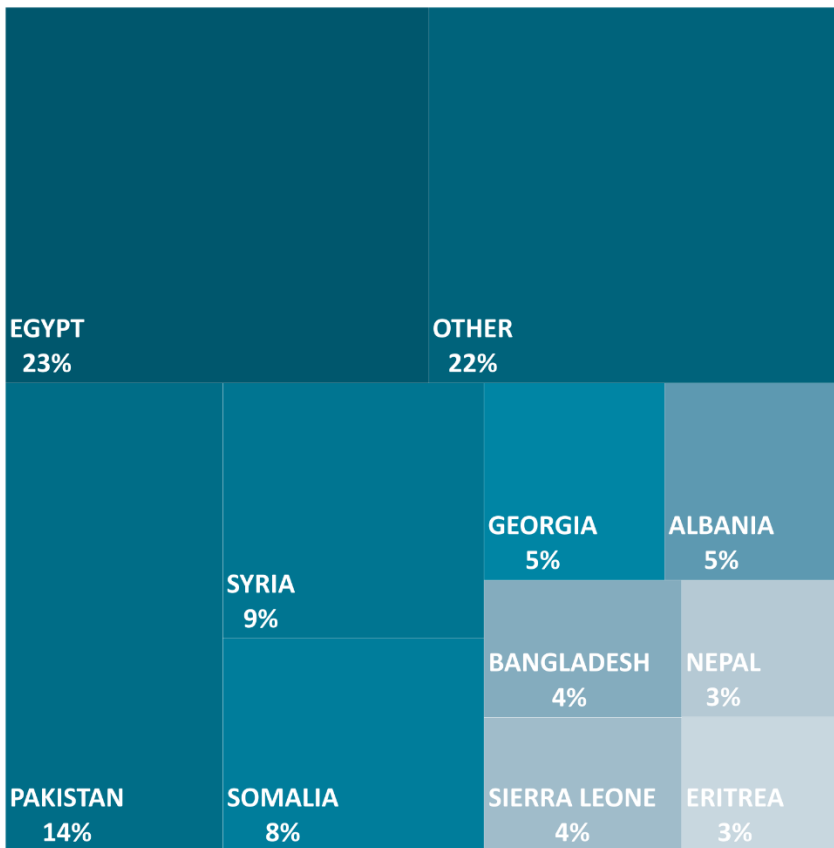


Chart 14. Appeals that have been lodged the 4-months of 2024 per location and quarter – See Appendix Table 9a

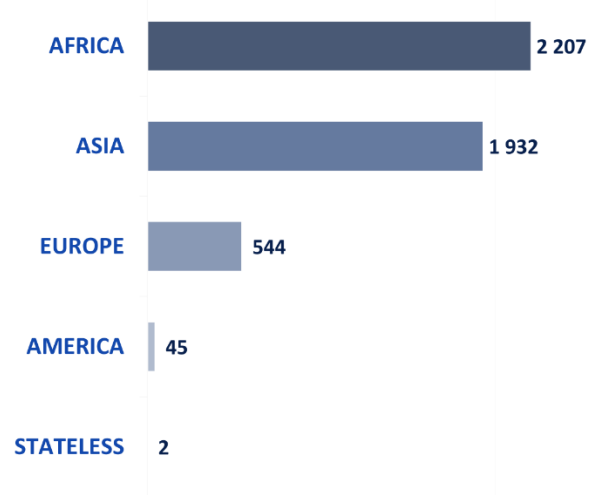

8a. Pending Pre-Registrations of applications for International Protection – Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance

The total backlog (pending applications and decisions) increased by 32% in April 2024 compared to the corresponding month of 2023.

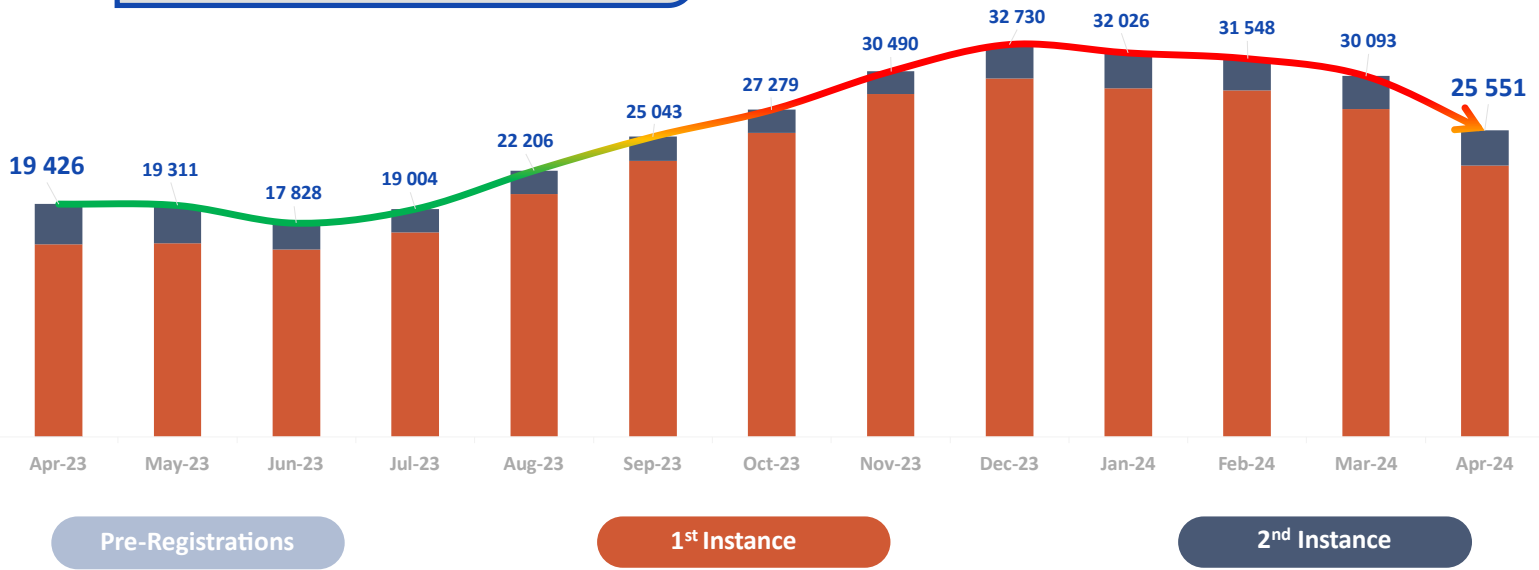

A comparison between April 2024 and April 2023 shows that the 1st and 2nd instance decisions have been increased by 171%

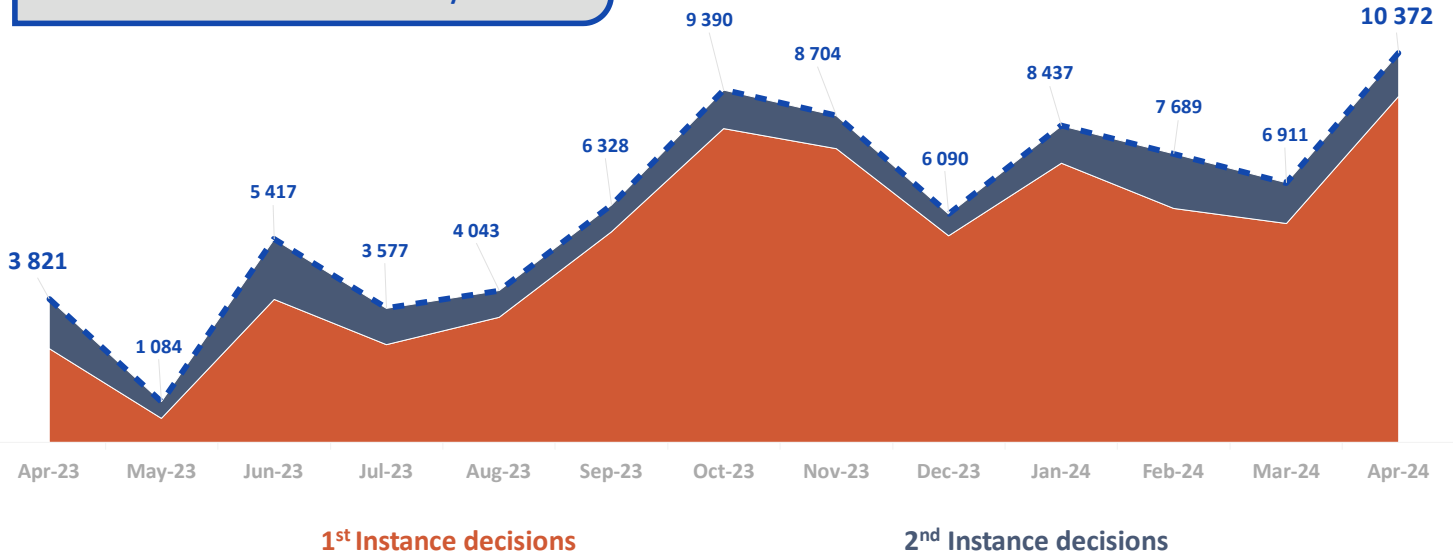


Chart 17. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance per month - See Appendix Table 10a

- The average time for a 2nd Instance decision to be issued is 90 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 51 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (2,906 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed till April 2024 (1,651 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed till August 2024 (1,255 pending).

A comparison between April 2024 and April 2023 shows that the pending decisions in 1st and 2nd instance regarding notification status have been decreased by 12%

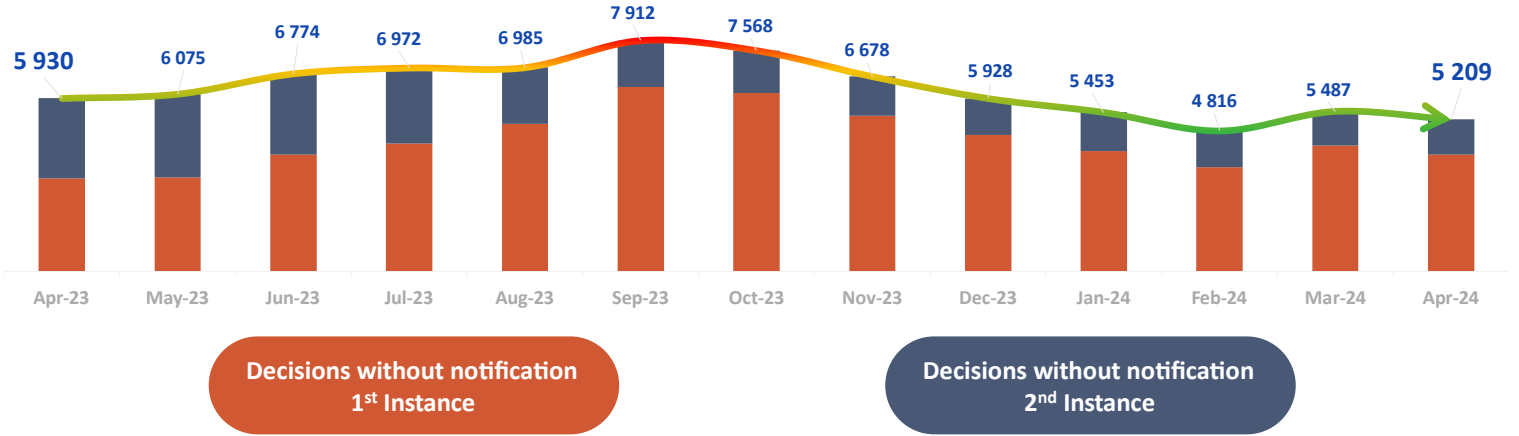


Chart 18. Aggregate pending decisions in 1st and 2nd instance regarding notification status per month - See Appendix Table 10c

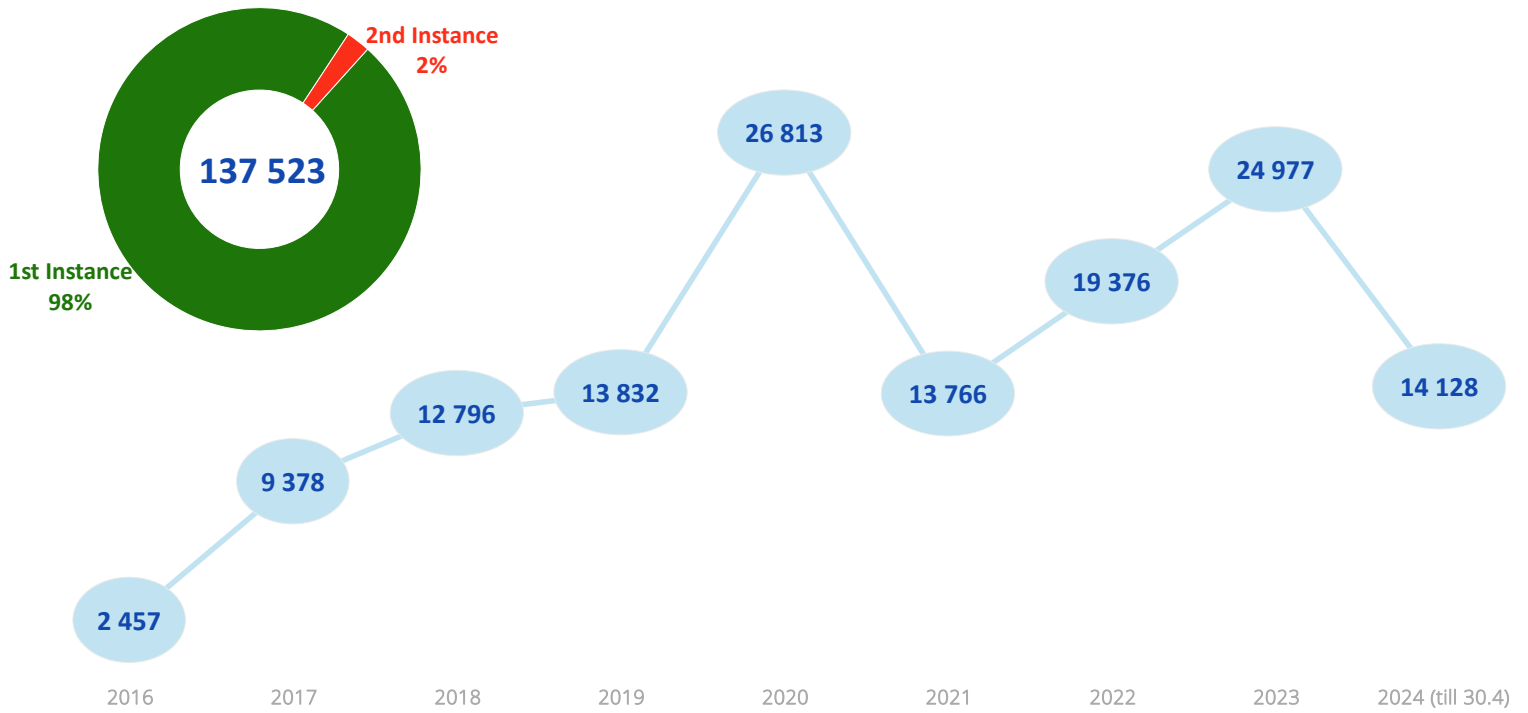

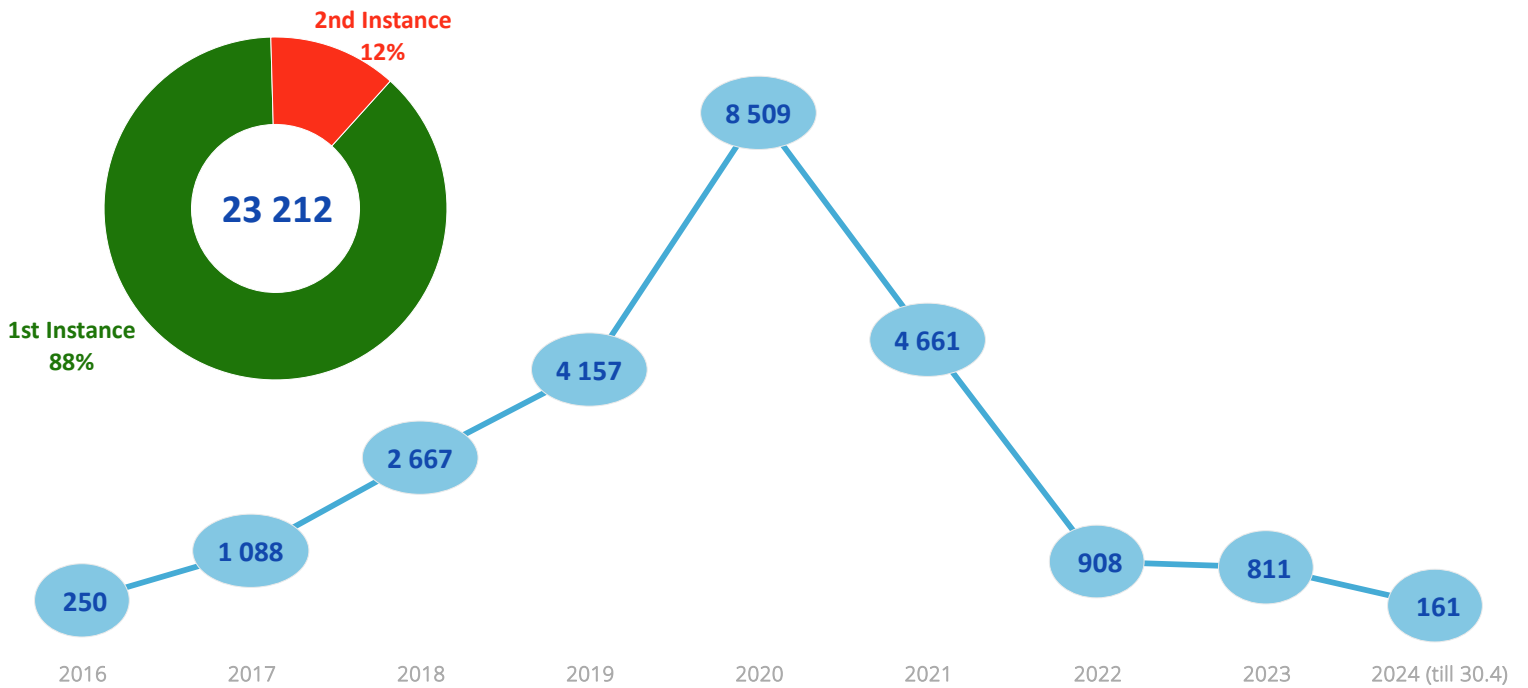
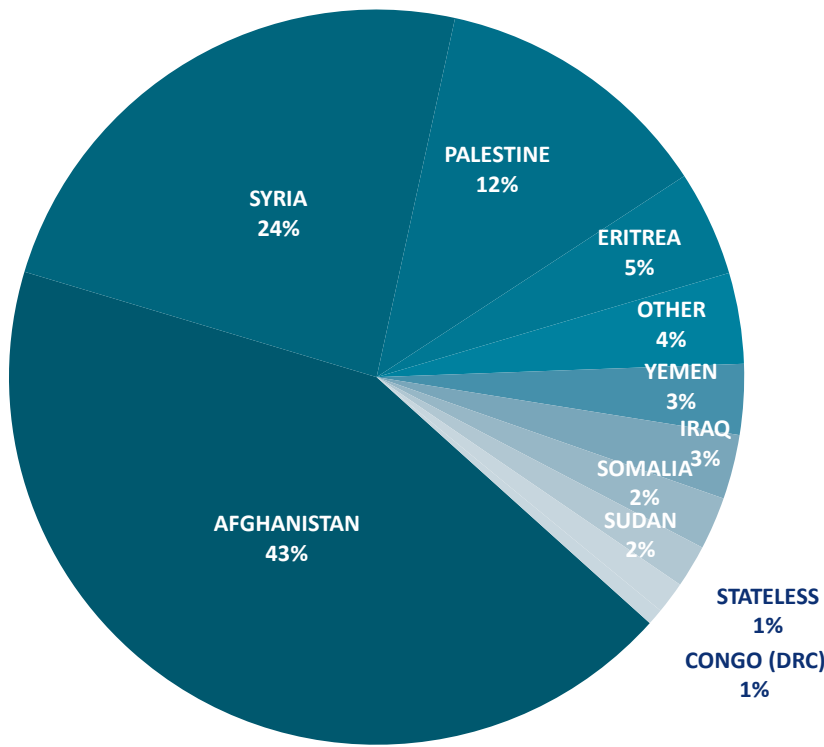

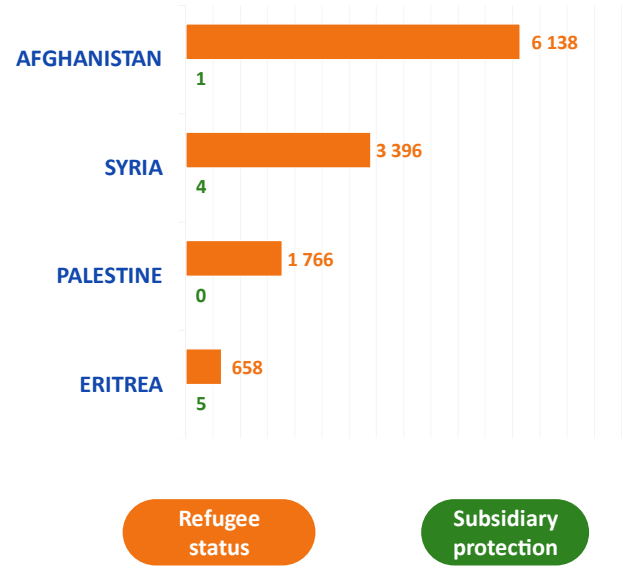

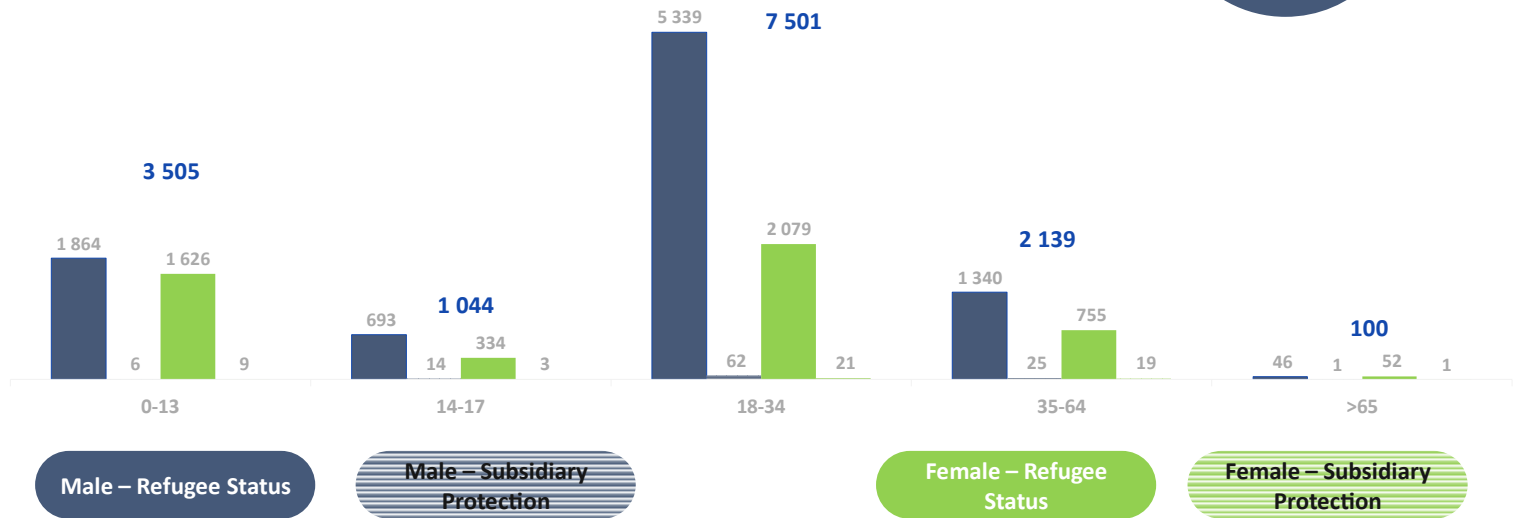
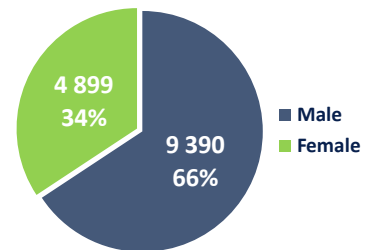

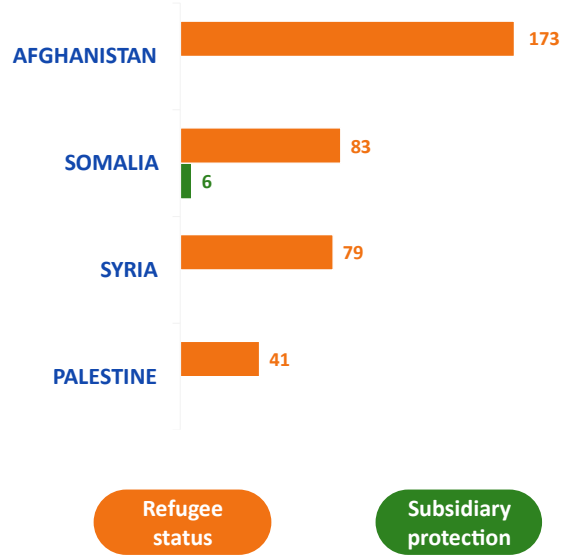
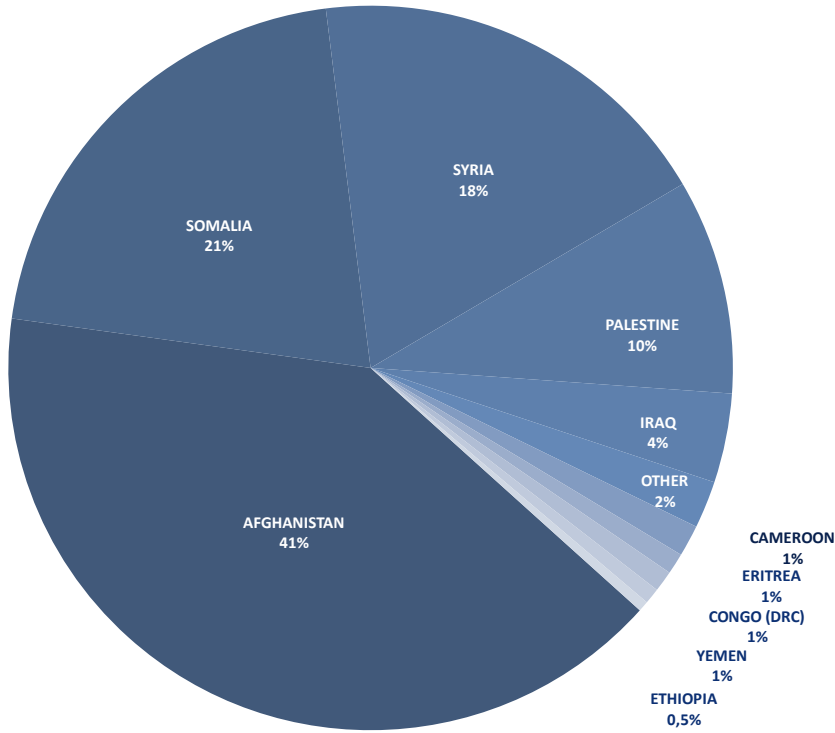

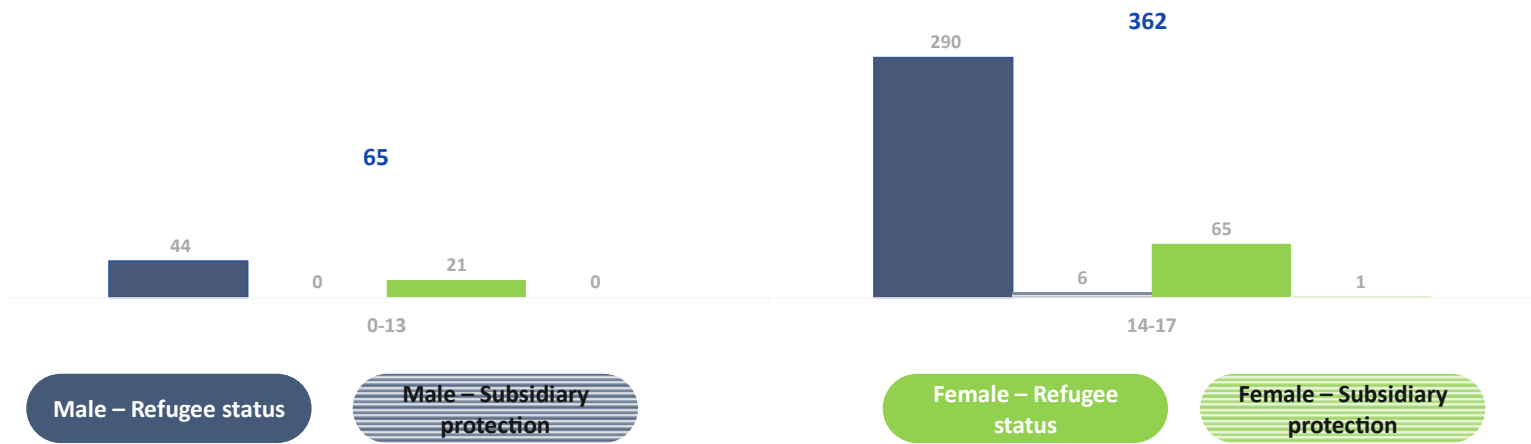
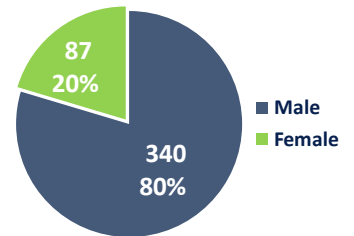

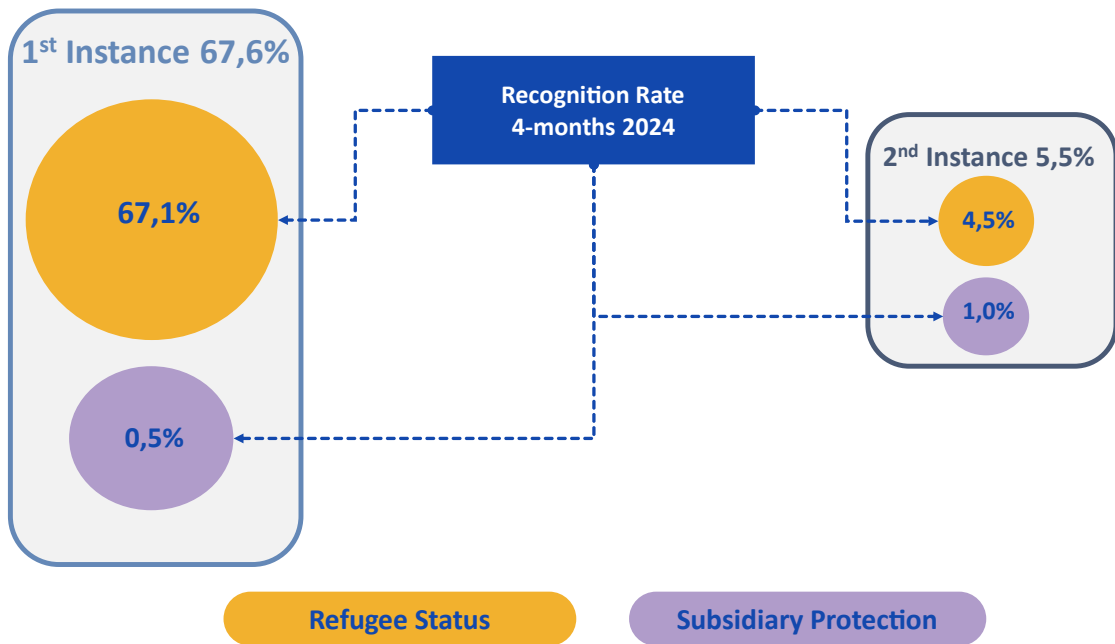


Chart 25. Recognition Rate in 1st & 2nd Instance. See Appendix Table 11g

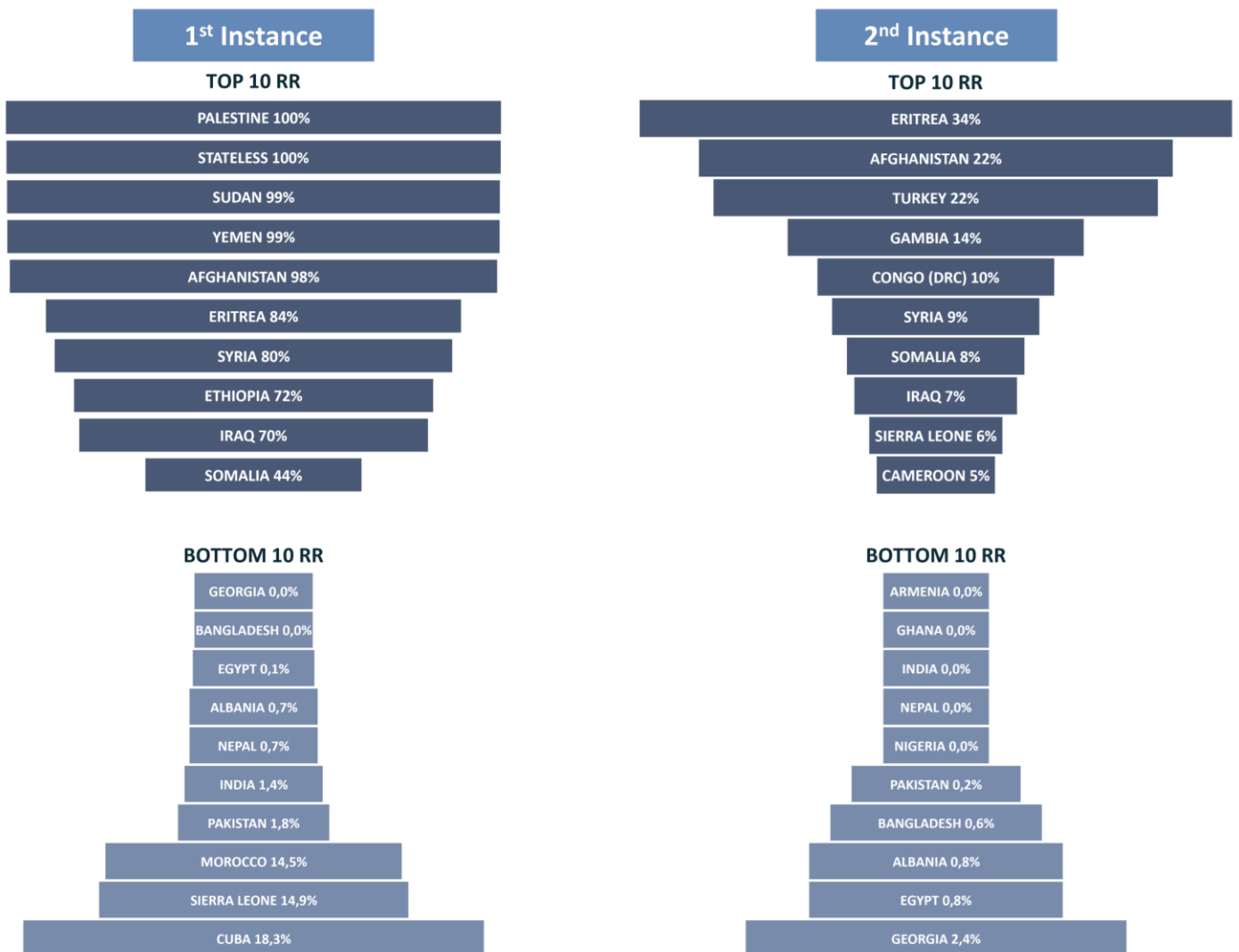

10. Applications for annulment of 2nd Instance Decisions before the Administrative Court

The 25,8% of the total applications for annulment per year of lodging (6.042) are pending while for the rest of them (74,2%), a decision has been issued. 4,4% of the decisions had a positive outcome and 95,6% were rejected.

From the total of 4.482 decisions regarding applications for annulment (per year of decision) 56% have been issued in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

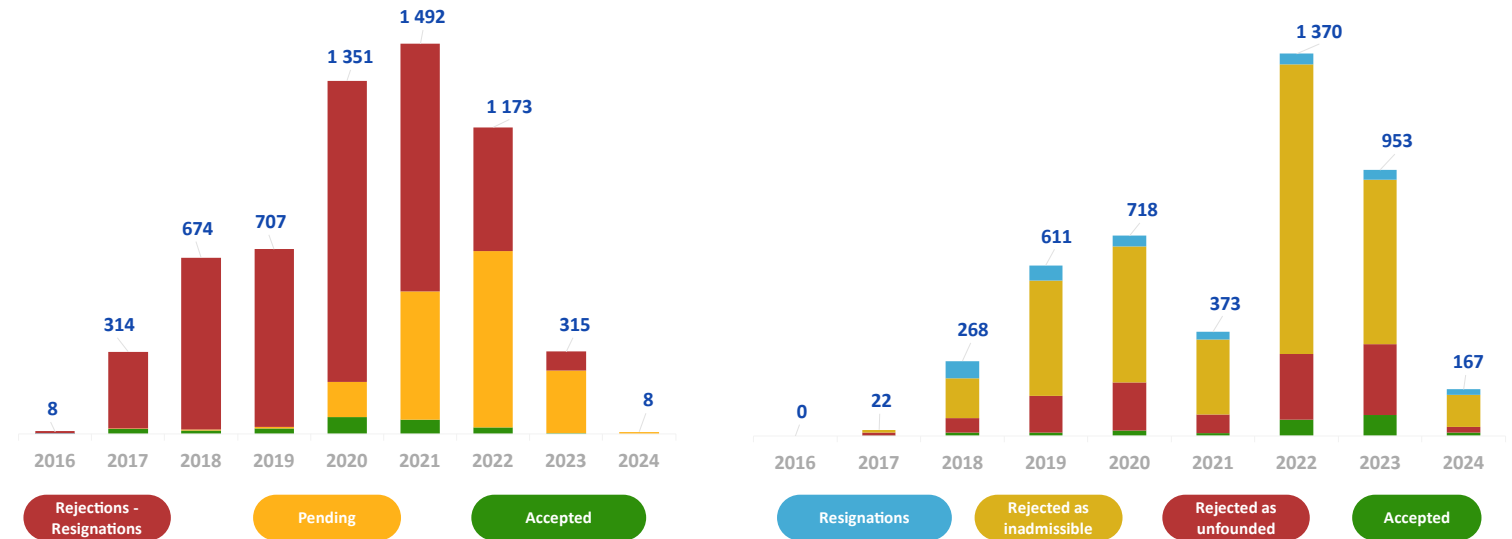

11. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/7/2019 until 30/4/2024 46.652 people have registered in the program, while 23.832 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house. It is worth noting that in April 2024, 232 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 1/4/2024 till 30/4/2024). At the same time 10.387 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 12.049 people are attending job counseling sessions.

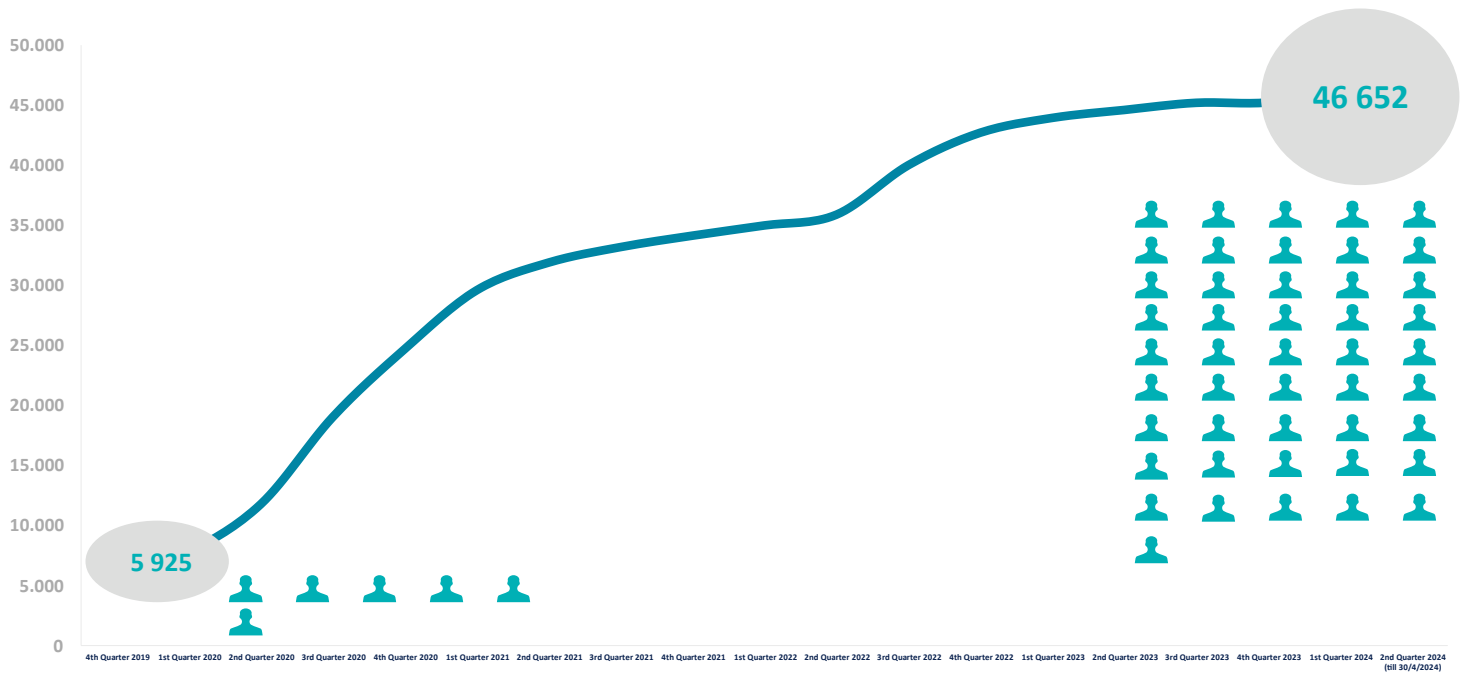


Chart 28. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 13

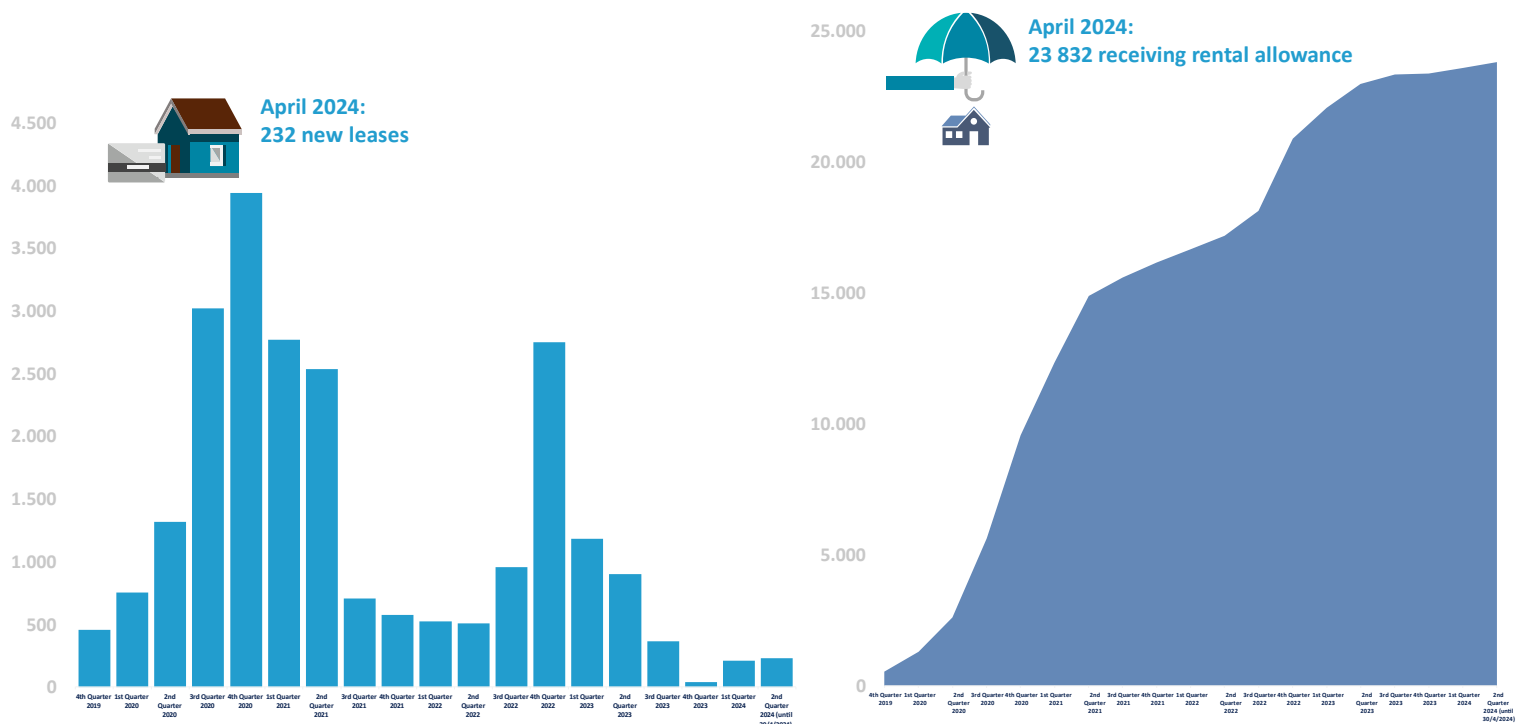


Chart 29. New leases (left), Receiving rental allowance (Right) - See Appendix Table 14 and 15

12. Returns - Departures

In April 2024 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 298 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 150 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 61 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 152 people seeking International Protection were transferred to France (138), Romania (9) and Iceland (5) in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- Returns under the EU - Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since April 2020 due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 661 people left the country in April, while 2.493 arrived.

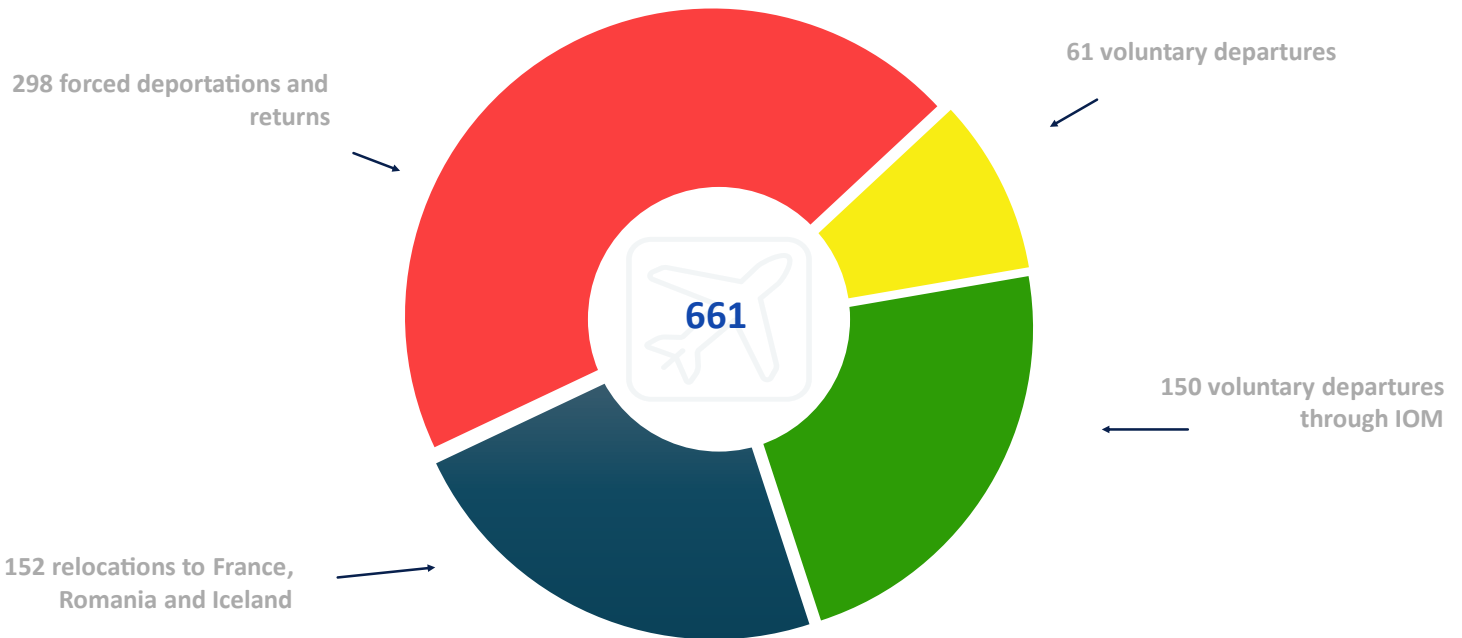

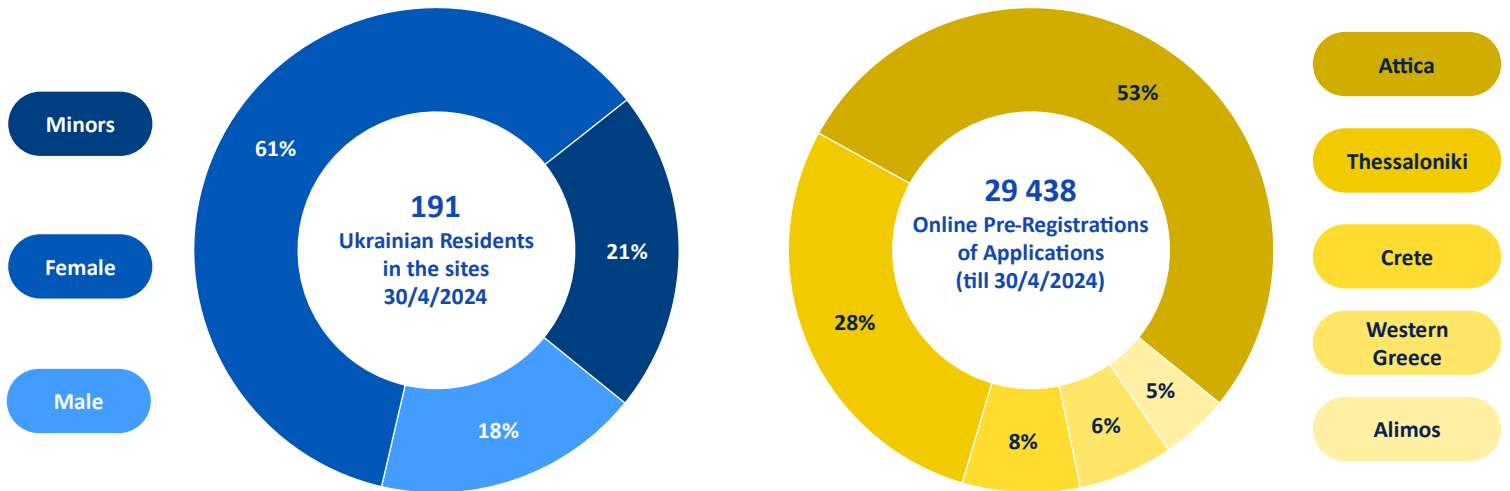


Chart 31. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (April 2024) - See Appendix Table 17 & 18

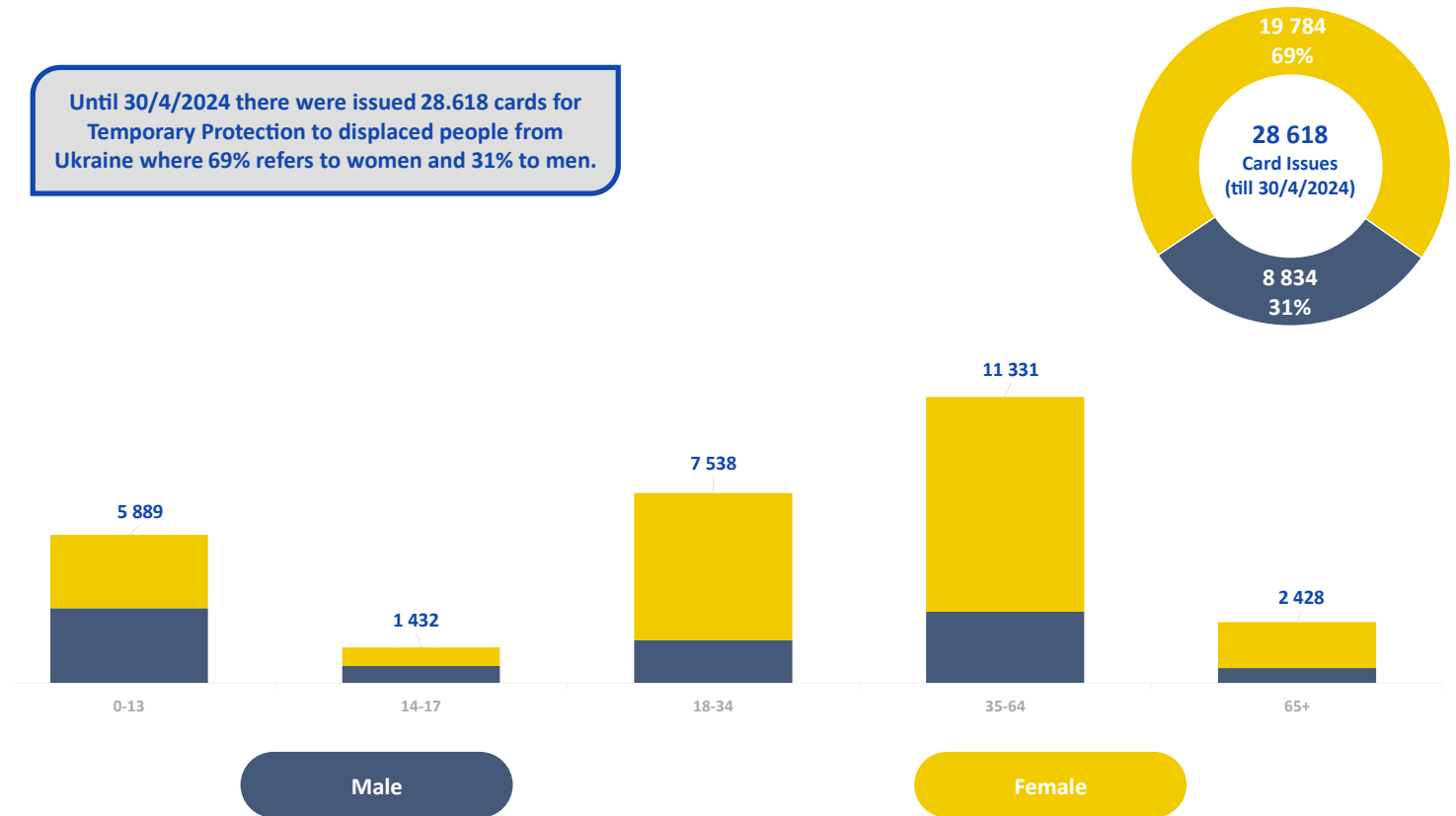


Chart 32. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (April 2024) - See Appendix Table 19

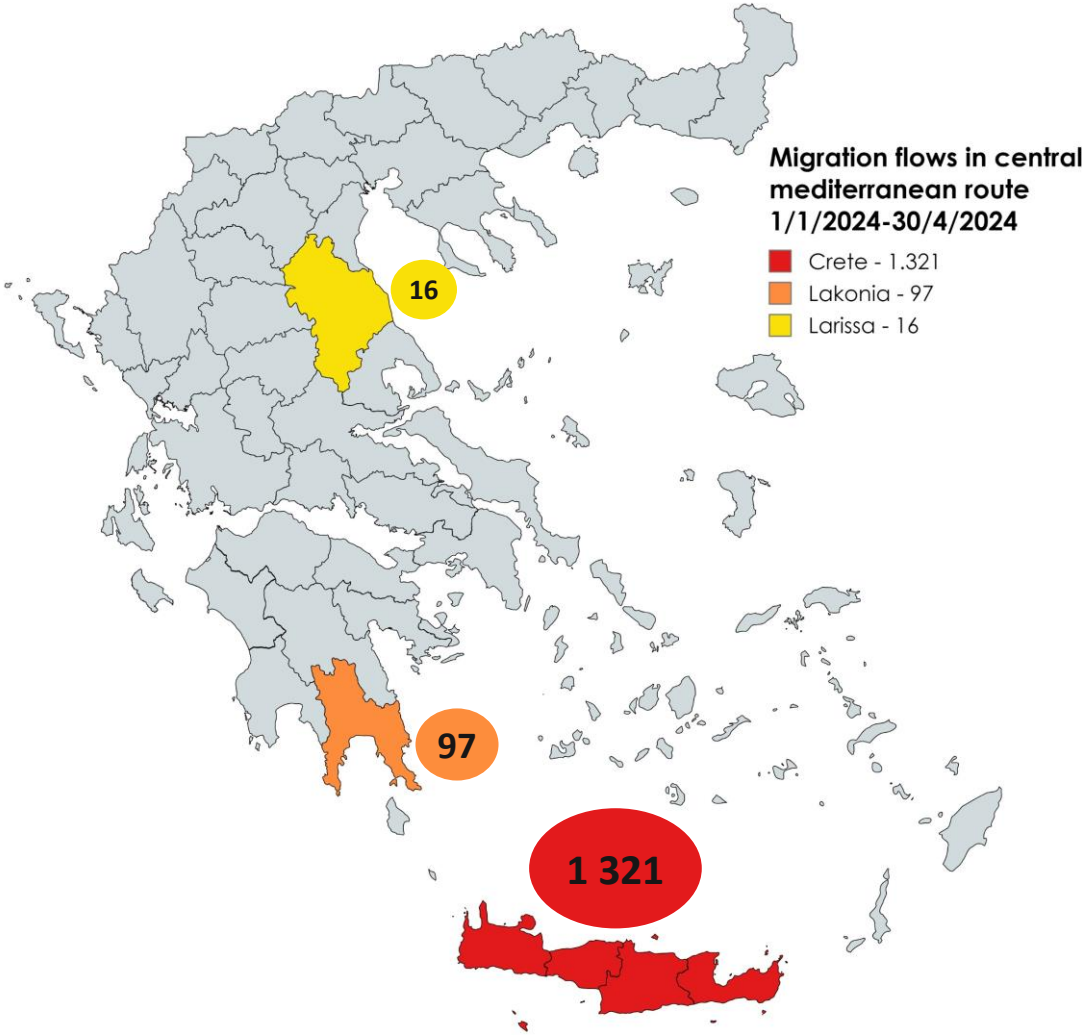


Chart 33. Migration flows in central mediterranean route (1/1/2024-30/4/2024) - See Appendix Table 20
