







Chart 2. Transfers of asylum seekers from the islands to the mainland July 2023 – July 2024 - See Appendix Table 2






#### 5c. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent




Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent (July 2023 - July 2024) - See Appendix Table 7c




Chart 9. Applications for International Protection 7-months 2024 per Nationality (Top 10 Nationalities and distribution per continent) - See Appendix Table 7d




Chart 10. Applications for International Protection 7-months 2024 per gender and age group - See Appendix Table 7e







Chart 13. 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance Decisions per month and type for 2024 and for the month of reference (July 2024). - See Appendix Table 8b




Chart 14. Appeals that have been lodged the 7-months of 2024 per location and quarter – See Appendix Table 9a








Chart 17. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance per month - See Appendix Table 10a

- The average time for a 2nd Instance decision to be issued is 89 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 51 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (3.160 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed till July 2024 (1.435 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed till December 2024 (1.725 pending).






















#### **11. HELIOS Integration Program**


The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/7/2019 until 31/7/2024 47.526 people have registered in the program, while 24.260 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house. It is worth noting that in July 2024, 124 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 1/7/2024 till 31/7/2024). At the same time 10.617 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 12.660 people are attending job counseling sessions.







July 2024 Report

In July 2024 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 199 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 249 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 54 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 47 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 155 people seeking International Protection were transferred to France in the context of voluntarily relocation program.

• Returns under the EU - Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March 2020 due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.

A total of 704 people left the country in July, while 4.696 arrived.






Chart 31. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (July 2024) - See Appendix Table 17 & 18




Chart 32. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (July 2024) - See Appendix Table 19




Chart 33. Migration flows in central mediterranean route (1/1/2024-31/7/2024) - See Appendix Table 20
