

1. Migration flows in islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros




Chart 1. Migration flows (islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros December 2023 – December 2024 – See Appendix Table 1

Transfers in December 2024 decreased by 30% compared to the corresponding month of 2023.




Chart 2. Transfers of asylum seekers from the islands to the mainland December 2023 – December 2024 - See Appendix Table 2





Chart 3. Island Residents in total December 2023 – December 2024 - See Appendix Table 3





Chart 6. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2024 applications are calculated till the month of reference (December) - See Appendix Table 7a

5c. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent




Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent (December 2023 - December 2024) - See Appendix Table 7c




Chart 9. Applications for International Protection 12-months 2024 per Nationality (Top 10 Nationalities and distribution per continent) - See Appendix Table 7d




Chart 10. Applications for International Protection 12- months 2024 per gender and age group - See Appendix Table 7e







Chart 13. 2nd Instance Decisions per month and type for 2024 and for the month of reference (December 2024). - See Appendix Table 8b




Chart 14. Appeals that have been lodged the 12- months of 2024 per location and quarter – See Appendix Table 9a



8a. Pending Pre-Registrations of applications for International Protection – Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance

The total backlog (pending applications and decisions) decreased by 14% in December 2024 compared to the corresponding month of 2023.




Chart 17. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance per month - See Appendix Table 10a

- The average time for a 2nd Instance decision to be issued is 89 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 51 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The number of appellants who applied and benefited from free legal aid is 2.577 in the 1st Quarter, 2.259 in the 2nd Quarter 2.556 in the 3rd Quarter and 688 in the 4th Quarter of 2024
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (1.641 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed till December 2024 (833 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed after December 2024 (808 pending).



Chart 18. Aggregate pending decisions in 1st and 2nd instance regarding notification status per month - See Appendix Table 10c


















11. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/7/2019 until 30/11/2024 47.753 people have registered in the program (*data regarding the enrollments are up to 31/8/2024), while 24.509 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house (*data regarding house renting are up to 31/10/2024). It is worth noting that in October 2024, 3 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 1/10/2024 till 31/10/2024). At the same time 10.659 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 12.693 people are attending job counseling sessions.





Chart 28. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 13



December 2024 Report

In December 2024 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 162 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 149 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 132 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 44 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 70 people seeking International Protection were transferred to France (67) and Romania (3) in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- Returns under the EU Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March 2020 due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 557 people left the country in December, while 4.446 arrived.




Chart 30. Returns-Departures – See Appendix Table 16.




Chart 31. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (December 2024) - See Appendix Table 17 & 18




Chart 32. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (December 2024) - See Appendix Table 19




Chart 33. Migration flows in central mediterranean route (1/1/2024-30/12/2024) - See Appendix Table 20




Chart 35: Arrivals per year and location for years 2020-2024






Chart 36: Residents per year and location for years 2020-2024





Chart 37: Arrivals and Applications for International protection per year for years 2020-2024




Chart 38: Applications for International protection, 1st Instance decisions and pending decisions per year for years 2020-2024






Chart 39: Appeals, 2nd Instance decisions and pending decisions per year for years 2020-2024
