# 1. Migration flows in islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros




Chart 1. Migration flows (islands of Eastern Aegean sea and Evros February 2024 – February 2025 – See Appendix Table 1

Transfers in February 2025 decreased by 50% compared to the corresponding month of 2024.




Chart 2. Transfers of asylum seekers from the islands to the mainland February 2024 – February 2025 - See Appendix Table 2

The total number of residents decreased by 12% in February 2025 compared to the corresponding month of 2024.




Chart 4. Progress of Residents through time – See Appendix Table 6




Chart 5. Distribution of Asylum Seekers per Region and Accommodation scheme – See Appendix Table 4 & 5




Chart 6. Applications for International Protection per year. For 2025 applications are calculated till the month of reference (February) - See Appendix Table 7a






Chart 8. Applications for International Protection per month with distinction between first time and subsequent (February 2024 - February 2025) - See Appendix Table 7c






Chart 9. Applications for International Protection 2-months 2025 per Nationality (Top 10 Nationalities and distribution per continent) - See Appendix Table 7d




Chart 10. Applications for International Protection 2-months 2025 per gender and age group - See Appendix Table 7e









Chart 13. 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance Decisions per month and type for 2025 and for the month of reference (February 2025). - See Appendix Table 8b




Chart 14. Appeals that have been lodged the 2-months of 2025 per location and quarter – See Appendix Table 9a




Chart 15. Appeals that have been lodged the 2-months of 2025 per Nationality (Top 10 Nationalities and distribution per continent) – See Appendix Table




Chart 17. Aggregate Decisions issued in 1st and 2nd Instance per month - See Appendix Table 10a

- The average time for a 2nd Instance decision to be issued is 89 days since the date of appeal lodging, while it is 51 days from the date of appeal discussion.
- The total of pending decisions of Appeals Authority (1.787 pending) consists of cases that have been discussed till February 2025 (955 pending) or are scheduled to be discussed till April 2025 (832 pending).
















Chart 25. Recognition Rate in 1st & 2nd Instance. See Appendix Table 11g

# 10. Applications for annulment of 2<sup>nd</sup> Instance Decisions before the Administrative Court

The 24,2% of the total applications for annulment per year of lodging (6.423) are pending while for the rest of them (75,8%), a decision has been issued. 4,6% of the decisions had a positive outcome and 95,4% were rejected.

From the total of 4.871 decisions regarding applications for annulment (per year of decision) 59% have been issued in 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025.



#### 11. HELIOS Integration Program

The "Helios" program is funded by the European Union. Its purpose is to promote integration support for beneficiaries of International Protection and is implemented with:

- accommodation support
- through integration courses (learning the Greek language, enhancing social skills)
- Job counselling sessions
- raising awareness of the host Community and promoting social cohesion.

The Ministry of Immigration and Asylum monitors the implementation of the program, which is implemented by the International Organization for Migration. From 16/7/2019 until 30/11/2024 47.753 people have registered in the program (\*data regarding the enrollments are up to 31/8/2024), while 24.509 recognized refugees receive financial assistance for renting a house (\*data regarding house renting are up to 31/10/2024). It is worth noting that in October 2024, 3 new leases were added to the accommodation support of the "Helios" program (regarding the period from 1/10/2024 till 31/10/2024). At the same time 10.659 beneficiaries of International Protection have been enrolled in the integration courses and 12.693 people are attending job counseling sessions.




Chart 28. Helios Enrollments – See Appendix Table 13




Chart 29. New leases (left), Receiving rental allowance (Right) - See Appendix Table 14 and 15

### 12. Returns - Departures

In February 2025 the departures from Greece to third countries outside the EU, as well as to member states of the European Union are the following:

- 193 forced deportations and returns of third country nationals, based on agreements of the European Union, but also bilateral agreements of our country.
- 115 voluntary departures through IOM.
- 91 voluntary departures of immigrants from our country to their countries of origin.
- 78 transfers to Member States of the European Union under the Dublin Regulation.
- 78 people seeking International Protection were transferred to France in the context of voluntarily relocation program.
- Returns under the EU Turkey Joint Declaration have not been made since March 2020 due to Covid-19. It should be noted that despite the lifting of the Covid-19 measures the requests of missions-returns of the Greek authorities have not been answered.
- A total of 555 people left the country in February, while 1.833 arrived.




Chart 30. Returns-Departures – See Appendix Table 16.




Chart 31. Total Ukrainian Residents & Online pre-registrations of applications (February 2025) - See Appendix Table 17 & 18




Chart 32. Total card issues to Ukrainians for Temporary Protection per age group and gender (February 2025) - See Appendix Table 19




Chart 33. Migration flows in central mediterranean route (1/1/2025-28/2/2025) - See Appendix Table 20
